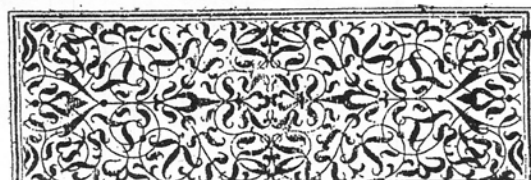

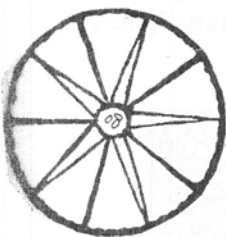

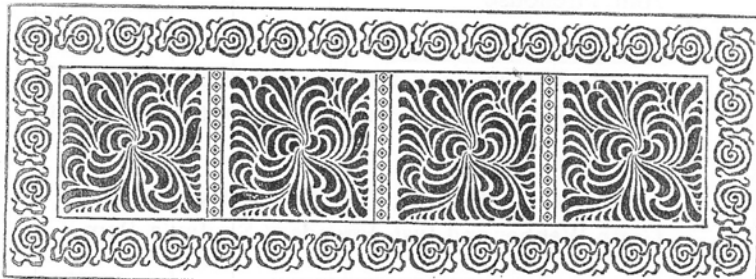

KNOW YOUR BO

In 1849, Charles Lauff borrowed a horse at Mission San Rafael and crossed the mountain to Bolinas. He observed logs hauled by oxcart to Dogtown where sawmills cut 20,000 feet per day and had the lumber hauled to schooners at the head of the lagoon. By 1852, the lagoon had so silted in through indiscriminate logging that lumber had to be lightered to wharves in deeper water. These wharf sites are State Historical Landmark No. 221.

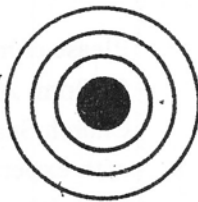

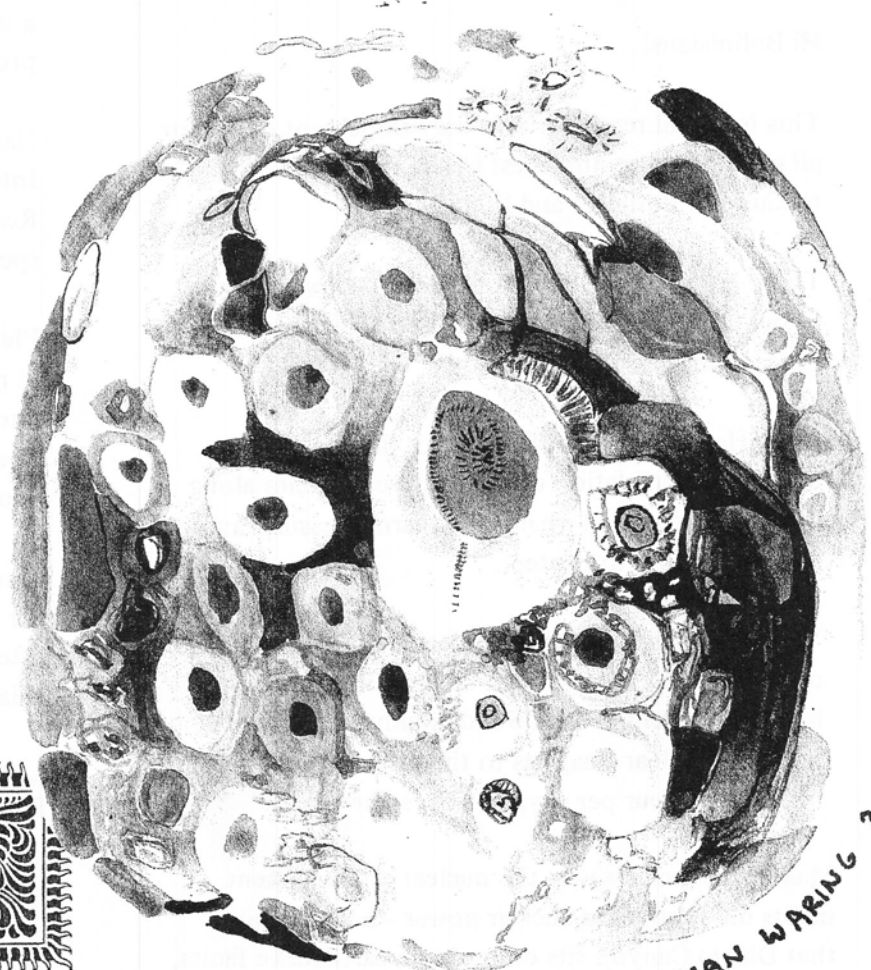

Hi Bolinians!

This is a final reminder of a very important event for all of us living on the West Coast sponsored by Cultural Potholes and EON.

There are multiple little-known radioactive threats to our children, the water, air, food and future generations.

From Hanford, WA to San Diego, there's ongoing accumulation of radioactive particles along the West Coast and we need to learn, measure, avoid and take action to protect.

Yesterday was the 69th. anniversary of the bombing of Hiroshima. Though that devastation was truly horrible, currently the US is designing new, more 'useable,' nuclear weapons to the tune of spending \$2 million per hour per day, 365 days per year.

Making weapons is why the nuclear establishment insists on continuing nuclear power - never mind that Diablo Canyon sits on multiple earthquake faults, San Onofre's 1,600 tons of waste is 13 ft above high

tide, 47,500 drums of nuclear waste were dumped near the Farallones, and ongoing billions of Bequerels per day of radioactivity is emitted from Fukushima that eventually circles the planet.

Yet a dramatic rise in solar and wind installations are making all this preposterous situation even more obviously unnecessary.

Reyes Dance Palace Church Space to hear the latest and to discuss with experts and each other the solutions and mitigations we need to make. There will be great guest speakers and a sneak preview of our Shutdown: The California Fukushima Connection video as well as a video report from the August 6 Hiroshima Day protest at Livermore.

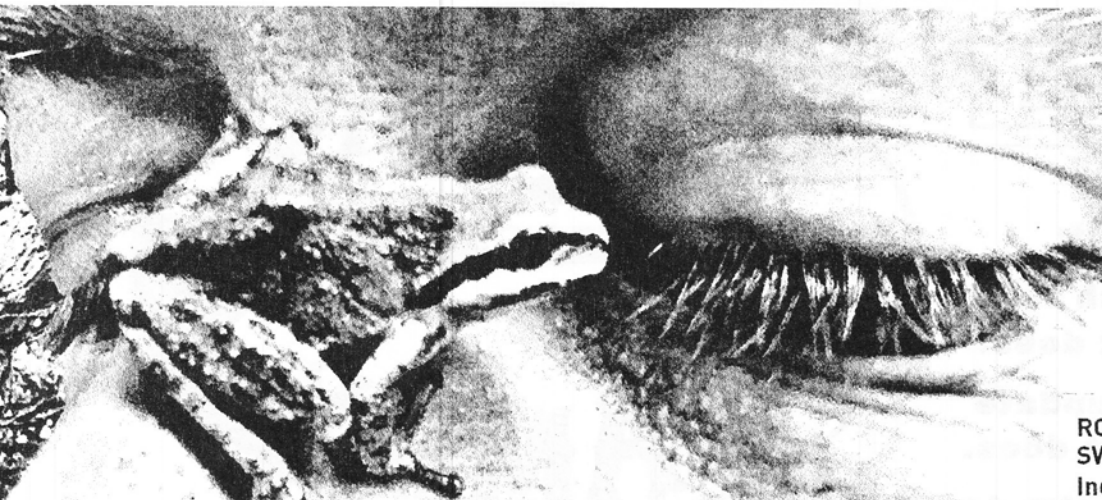

ROBIN WALL KIMMERER, BRAIDING SWEETGRASS

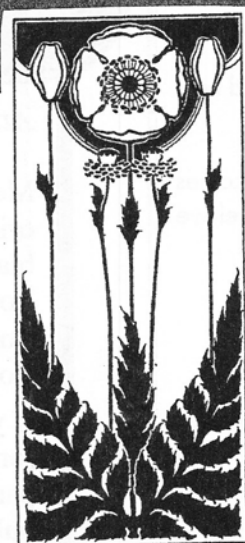

Her first book, *Gathering Moss*, was awarded the John Burroughs Medal for outstanding nature writing. She lives in Fabius, New York, where she is a SUNY Distinguished Teaching Professor of Environmental Biology, and the founder and director of the Center for Native Peoples and the Environment. As a botanist, Kimmerer has been trained to ask questions of nature with the tools of science. As a member of the Citizen Potawatomi Nation, she embraces indigenous teachings that consider plants and animals to be the oldest teachers. The award-winning writer brings these two lenses of knowledge together in *Braiding Sweetgrass*.
