Recently, 25 interns from John Jeavons's Bountiful Gardens came to Larner Seeds in Bolinas for a tour. It was vivifying to spend some time with this diverse & enthusiastic, international group. Since Jeavons's project focuses on bio-intensive food production, the group looked at our restoration garden from a distinctly human-use horticultural perspective which helped me to further understand the multi-species oriented work we do here.

The group took great interest in our collection of California native food plants such as Plantain (Plantago subnuda), Yampa (Perideridia kellogii) &, of course, California Chia (Salvia columbaria). I felt a buzz run through as the crowd realized that some marginalized native species could be grown for food, thus benefiting both the local human & indigenous plant communities. One student inquired about using native, nitrogen-fixing annuals, such as lupines as cover crop in his vegetable garden, an interesting blend of these two worlds. Indeed, agricultural questions about yields & growing season length abounded: questions which needed translation to the slower, more circuitous realm of the restoration garden, whose goals are more layered than those of a food producing garden.

While I was pointing out coyote bush, a young woman from Bangalore asked about its uses. I described the plant's function as a nurse plant for the coastal sage scrub community, helping other plants get established. I pointed out its value as habitat for quail & the myriad beneficial pollinators that it attracts. "Yes," she replied, "but what are its USES?" For some, it seems, a plant is only useful if you can consume it or enjoy its pretty flowers.

As global human population approaches 8 billion, there is no doubt that the work of John Jeavons & others in growing food sustainably is essential. However, to be real stewards of this planet, we must take a perspective that nurtures biodiversity beyond human use, extending our efforts toward a wider web of life on this planet.



THE BIRTH OF IDEAS

There is a potential flaw in Atul Gawande's BetterBirth Project, which seeks to spread safer childbirth practices through neonatal intervention ("Slow Ideas," July 29th). In another initiative, in the nineteen-eighties, a group of Western midwives worked in remote villages in Nepal to teach local birth attendants how to prevent neonatal tetanus, which was killing large numbers of infants.


With immunization clinics, the group was able to achieve measurable improvements in neonatal survival. But the death rate of children under five years remained stubbornly high. Many of those who might have died as newborns were doomed to die as toddlers. The innovations cannot stop with improved neonatal mortality statistics.





Taos-based painter Charles Strong passed away on Sunday July 28th. He lived in Bolinas in the mid-sixties during which time he created his Wharf Road series of large, abstract expressionist canvases. What follows are some reminiscences of his time here, lifted from the catalog of his 1990 Bolinas Museum Show. - Submitted by Linda Samuels.

Looking Back

On our return to the United States, after ten months in England in 1964, we began a search to find a house and studio in West Marin. After looking at several farm houses near Point Reyes Station, my first wife, artist Deanna Forbes, and I contacted our friend and former Humanities Professor, poet Ken Lash. Ken was living in Bolinas in a cottage owned by long-term resident Heidi Ryan, located behind Pepper's General Store, and was shortly moving to a farm house on the Lagoon. For fitty dollars a month we took over his shingled four room cottage and continued a search for a studio. I rented a double car garage on the Mesa in which several paintings were completed in rather tough conditions of no natural light or heat in December 1964.

At that point a gutted apartment above Scowley's restaurant in the present Bolinas Museum Building became available which I rented. It was a fine, warm studio with windows facing Wharf Road for the grand price of fifteen dollars per month.

The West Marin artists that we were aware of in the early 1960's included Dean Fleming, living in a old dairy farm in Muir Beach (which he passed on to other California School of Fine Arts artists) and Craig Hanson in Bolinas. Another farm above Stinson Beach housed Mel and Carla Moss, followed by Robert Hudson, Cornelia Schultz and Richard and Martha Shaw. Robert and Cornelia had also lived on a farm right before the mail boxes on the Lagoon Road for a while. Sculptor Paul Harris, painter Arthur Okamura, and furniture maker Art Carpenter were well established Bolinas residents at the time.

We lived a quiet, productive, enjoyable life in Bolinas which was shattered by our interest in Rock and Roll music and the tragedy of the Vietnam War. We moved to San Francisco in 1966.

For two years Bolinas was a gentle paradise to live and make art




