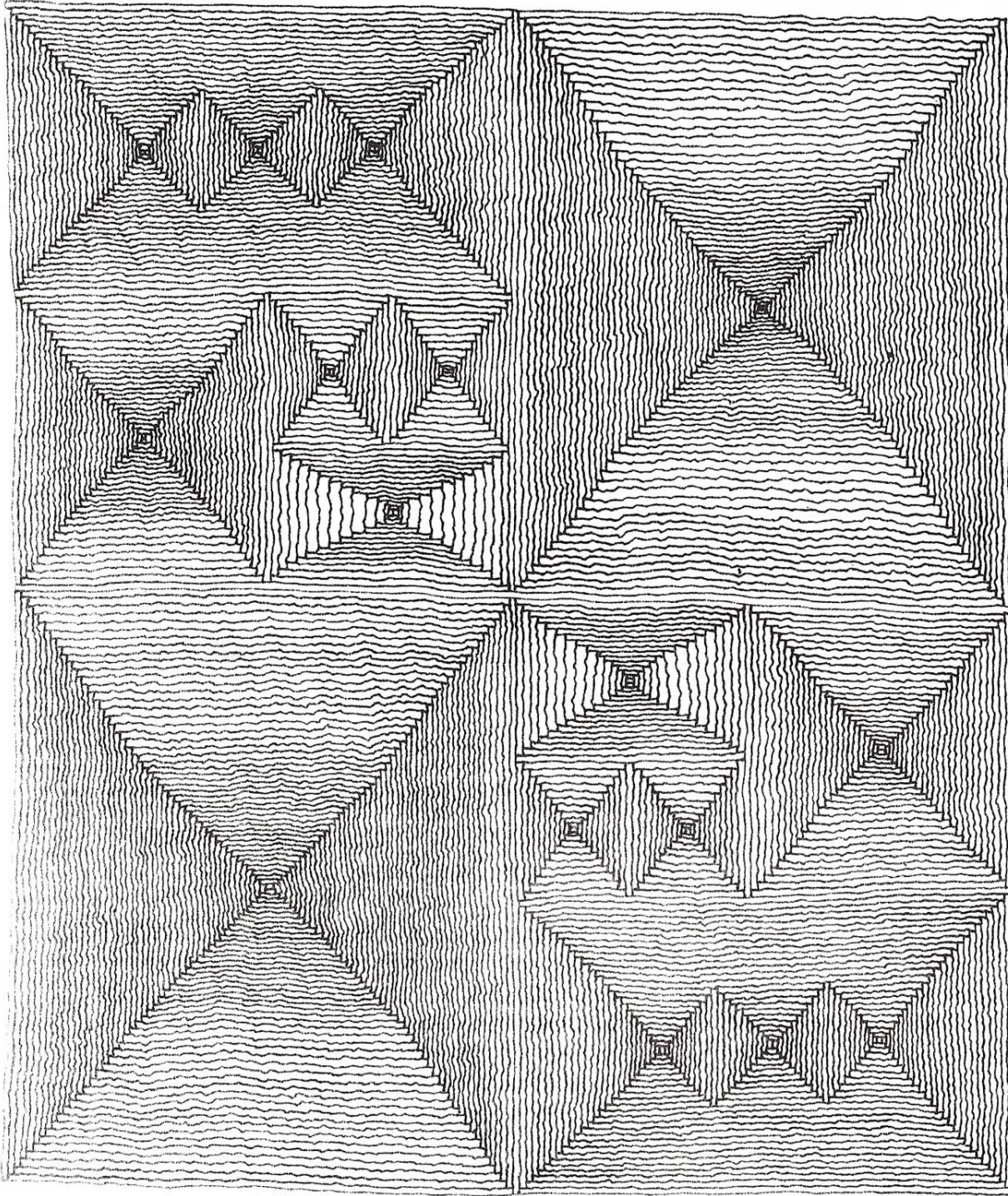

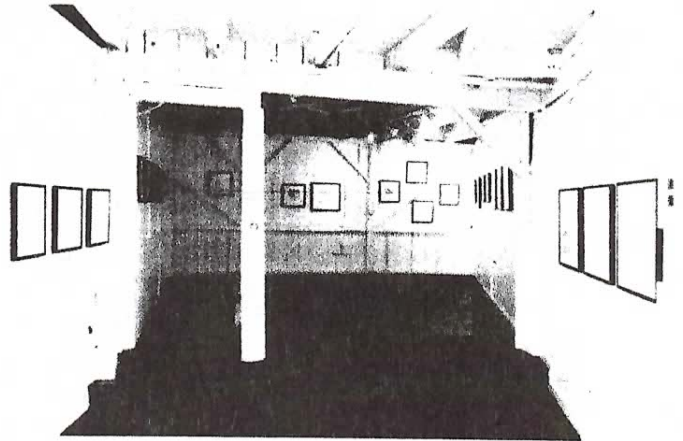

## Artist Reception this Saturday, 1 to 5 Chris Whitefield at the Bolinas Gallery

Dominating the central hall of San Francisco's de Young Museum hangs the gigantic "Strontium" by Gerhard Richter, invoking on a grand scale cosmic vibration as well as minute energy patterns in nature. Even in their small format Chris Whitefield's drawings accomplish this and even more. The Bolinas artist's exhibition of a selection of unique and powerful works on paper here at the Bolinas Gallery is very well worth a visit.

A myriad of fine lines, drawn free-hand with an ink pen, cover sheets of paper in intricate patterns. First impressions are of Whitefield's certainty of line, the unflinching hand of a craftsman, the amount of patience required. Yet these drawings are so much more. Above all they combine larger patterns with smaller ones, generating a powerful sense of vibration, of fields of energy, inviting a distinctly meditative sense. In essence, it's easy to stand in front of the one that speaks most to you and get utterly mesmerized. Lines begin to move; patterns start to shift.

Best of all, for the viewer, soon the lines fade from focus and instead the white space between them grows in importance. Lines become outlines, and empty paper becomes a radiating whiteness. On these sheets Chris Whitefield has somehow managed to perform an act of alchemy.

Some twenty beautifully displayed works transform the Bolinas Gallery from art venue to meditation space. No individual titles compete for attention. Each piece is part of the whole; yet each piece is complete in itself. Find your favorite and spend a few moments in front of it.

"Line Drawings" by Chris Whitefield at the Bolinas Gallery next door to the Bolinas Museum is open on Saturdays and Sundays (1-5 pm) during the month of September, with an artist reception this Saturday, 9/14, from 1 to 5 pm.

I saw where my car had come to rest.

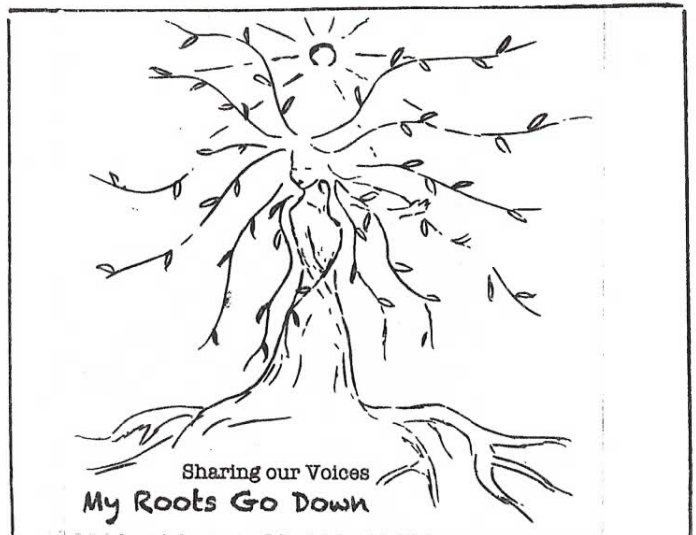
Past several tree trunks it had darted,

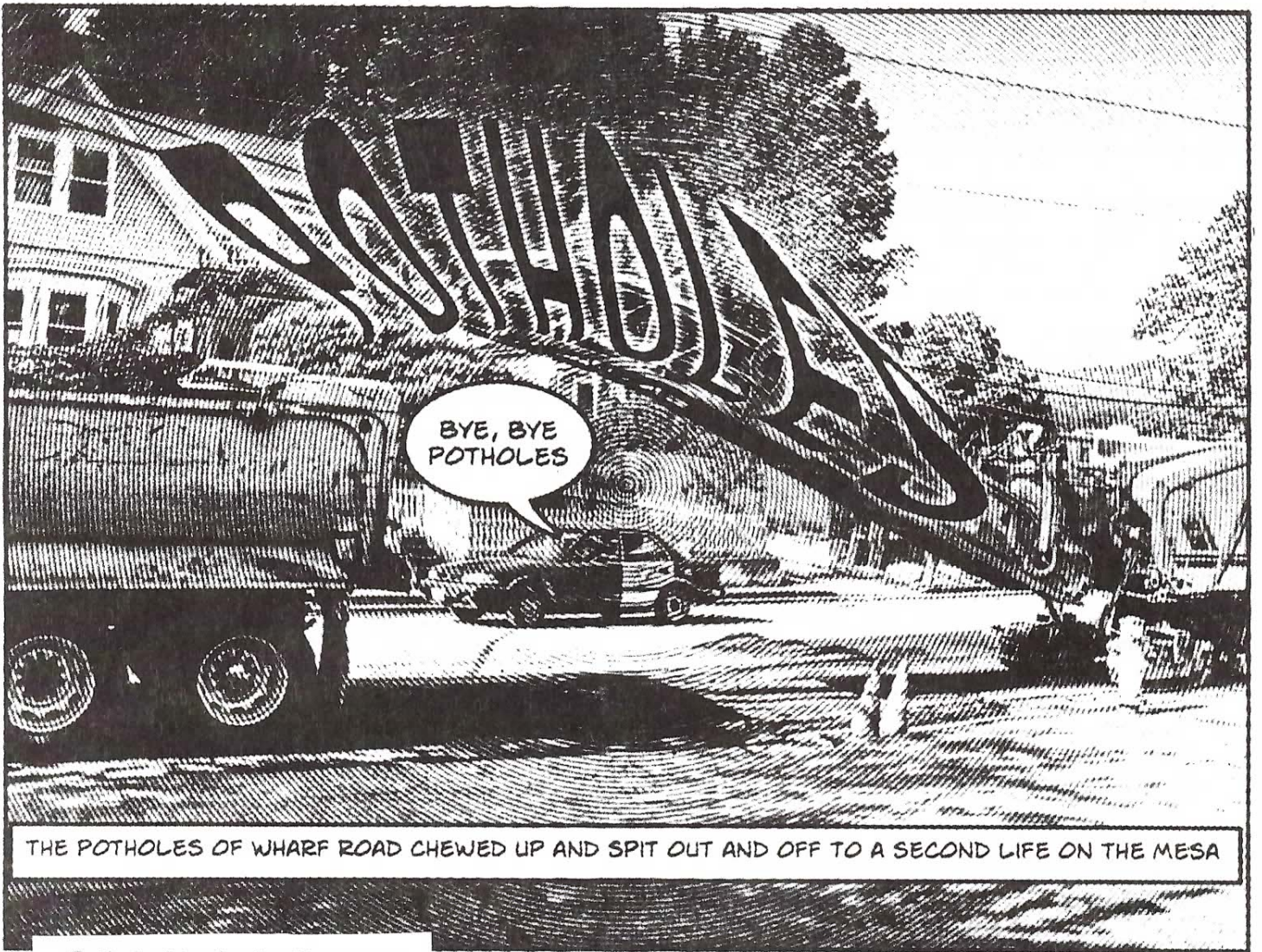

The residents of Bolinas and Stinson Beach will soon be getting an invitation to attend an information meeting on the state of the Bolinas Lagoon. If you have ever wondered about the health of the Bolinas Lagoon or what has been done or will be done to preserve the Lagoon, this is the meeting to attend. It will be a chance to talk to the management and partner agencies that govern the waters that are in our back yard.

I have been on the Bolinas Lagoon Technical Advisory Committee for many years and have been part of a number of attempts to preserve and improve environmental conditions within the lagoon. Last year the County changed our function from a technical committee to an advisory council, They want to make better contact to our communities.

I urge any folks that use the lagoon for any reason, to attend this meeting. Ask questions, talk to Supervisor Steve Kinsey, Marin Parks and Open Space director, Linda Dahl, GGNRA & PRNS representatives and Maria Brown, Gulf of the Farallones Marine Sanctuary Superintendent. Find out about current projects and future projects.. Tell them your thoughts.

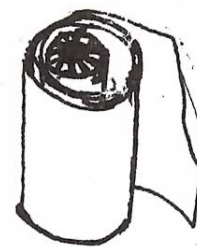



## Coastal Currents <sup>5</sup>

**Lagoon Restoration:** I am very pleased with the results of the salt water irrigation that volunteers have been drenching on the plant life that has so long anchored Kent Island. It is meditative work to say the least, for there is nothing but you, nature and the rather heavy fire hose you are using to irrigate. While you can take in the vast views of the Lagoon and ridge, you must focus on the plants you are irrigating. Not all plants are slated for removal, there are some that are native and meant to remain such as red fescue, pink sand verbena, owl's clover, and beach wildrye. The last organized workday for this season is Saturday the 21<sup>st</sup>, although some of the project partners are hoping for a few additional days in the fall so stay tuned. As part of Coastal Cleanup day on the 21<sup>st</sup> we will also be removing garbage from the island so bring your trash bags. Meet at the Wharf Road dock for a short boat ride across the ever enlarging and deepening Bolinas Channel. A little Bolinas Community interaction is nice and the ranks of local volunteers have grown each workday. I would like to give a big shout out to Duncan Hopkins of Birch Road who has surpassed anyone in time spent irrigating, Charles Higgins of Stinson/Seadrift and Danny Maloney of Mill Valley have joined the irrigation ranks. When I compare the areas irrigated in May and June with those we are now getting to, you see a big difference. Treated ice-plant areas are brittle and browning out, making it much easier to pull. On a recent workday children from the Bolinas-Stinson Summer Camp lent a hand pulling up ice-plant. They now hold the unofficial World Record for the longest continuous root runner of 21 feet. With an adaptive advantage like that it is no wonder the plant is taking over the island. It snakes its way through the tall grasses and puts down shallow roots everywhere and does not take much nutrient to get it started. Looking out at the island one can see mounds of pulled ice-plant 5 feet high, piled up by volunteers. Each organized workday there is an introduction to tasks, tools and gloves are supplied, snacks and a fine lunch served at noon. It is a terrific way to be a part of a much heralded ecological restoration effort.

**State of the Lagoon:** On September 19 the County of Marin and the Gulf of the Farallones Sanctuary are holding an informational evening at Stinson Beach Community Center from 6-8pm. Beginning with a film on the Lagoon, followed by informative talks and open time, folks can stroll around the center and visit the tables that hold their particular interest. The County will address pending projects gleaned from the 2008 Locally Preferred Plan. There will be several tables displaying topics such as: Invasive Spartina and proposed mitigation methods, Oil spill and boat grounding response plans, Monitoring at Duxbury reef, Kent Island project, current and future mapping of lagoon habitat, and many more.

**Marine Debris:** The last outing to South Beach in the PRNS again delivered up no exceptional marine debris. I know one day we will hit a mother-load, as large debris fields are being reported just off the California and Oregon coasts. Our search is continuing with new funding from NOAA to support tracking of Tsunami marine debris. Now we are finding large tangled masses of kelp! It is interesting that much of the large debris seen in the Winter months has been covered with sand and we are starting to see things that look familiar reemerging.

**Duxbury Reef:** Each year Cal Academy of Sciences graduates another class of Rocky Shore Naturalists, this most recent class had two individuals who live in Bolinas and are eager to help the monitor reef activities during high visitation periods. The Environmental Action Committee is spearheading a Citizen Science program to better protect some of the most visited West Marin beaches and reefs. Citizen Scientists will monitor Drakes Beach, Limantour Beach & Estero and our own Duxbury Reef. Partnering with EAC are the Point Reyes National Seashore, Cal Academy and Gulf of the Farallones National Marine Sanctuary. This is to bring about more protection and oversight to Marine Protected Areas, or MPA's, which protect stocks of fish and crustaceans from over-fishing and allow populations rebound. Note: A friend and fellow Rocky Shore Naturalist, Josie Iselin is opening a show of her photos taken of Seaweeds of Duxbury Reef at the Bolinas Museum Oct. 5<sup>th</sup>.
