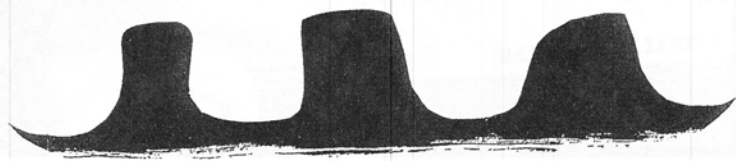

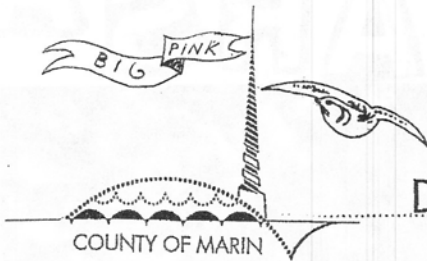

RE: Wharf Road, Bolinas
Retaining Wall Repair Project

Dear Bolinas Resident or Visitor:

The County of Marin has contracted Hillside Drilling Inc. to repair an existing retaining wall on Wharf Road in Bolinas. The project will consist of the installation of a sheet pile wall that is tensioned with steel tie rods and cast-in-drilled-hole piles. The work will also include grinding, resurfacing, paving fabric, carpentry, welding, excavation, and traffic control. Please see the attached vicinity map for reference.

The project is anticipated to start on **September 22th and be completed by November 30th**. Due to environmental permit requirements, work is anticipated to occur on all days of the week (including weekends) for the initial phase of work that goes through October 31st because the construction hours for the wall to be installed in the lagoon are limited to low tide events; as such, hours of operation for the initial phase of work may begin as early as 7am. and end as late as 7pm. After October 31st, construction hours will be limited to normal working hours between 8am-5pm, Monday through Friday until the project is complete.

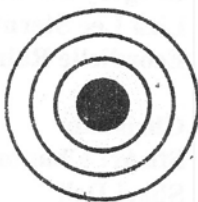
Traffic delays on Wharf Road should be expected, but shall not exceed 5 minutes. Vehicular access on Wharf Road south of the retaining wall repair during construction operations will be limited to residents only. Prior to the start of work, "No Parking" signs will be posted for parking restricted times. The existing sidewalk will remain open for pedestrian access during construction hours. For your convenience, it is recommended to avoid and park away from the construction zone and use the sidewalk for accessibility. Although a certain amount of noise, debris, is unavoidable, with your cooperation, we believe these inconveniences can be minimized.

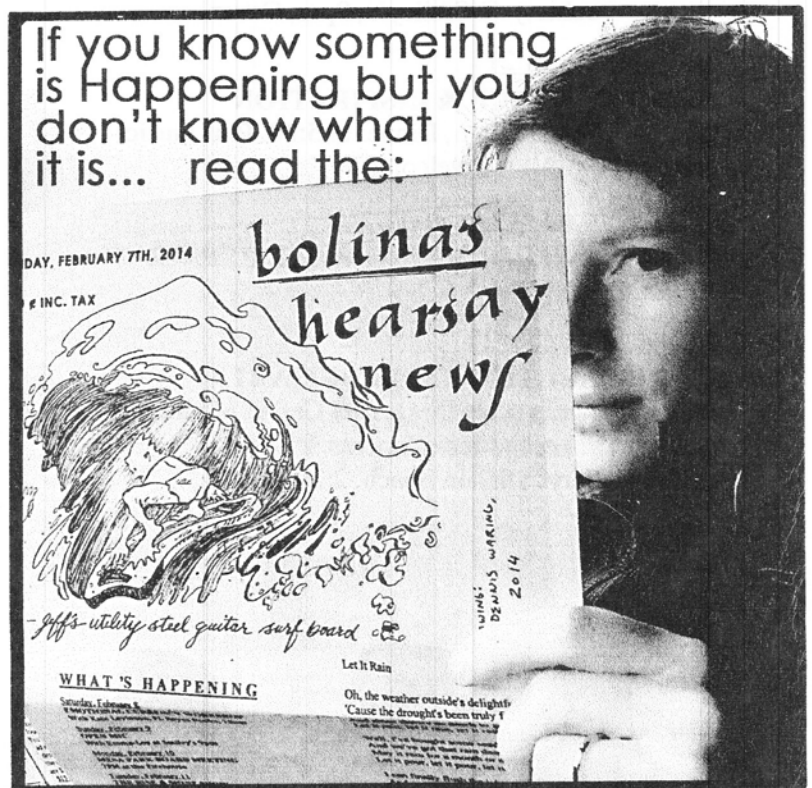

A shuttle is offered from Mesa Park to Downtown during the event and believe it or not, this event is once again free to attend!

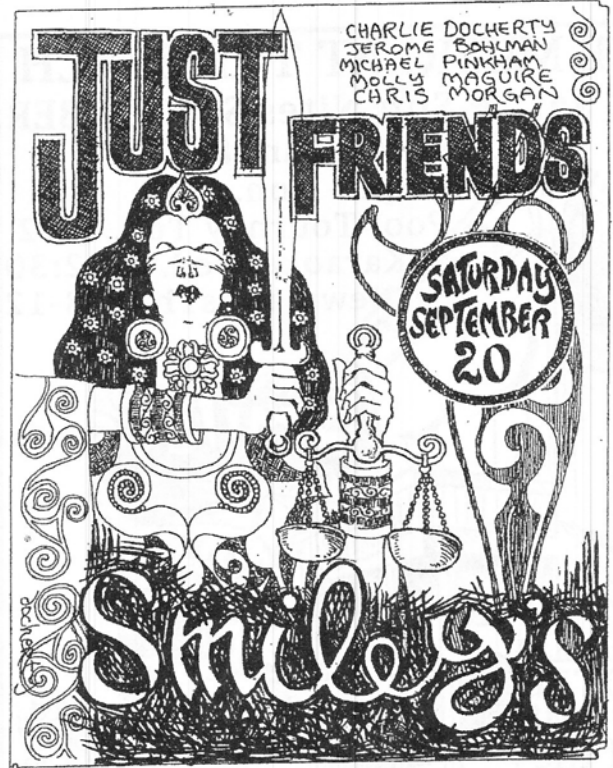

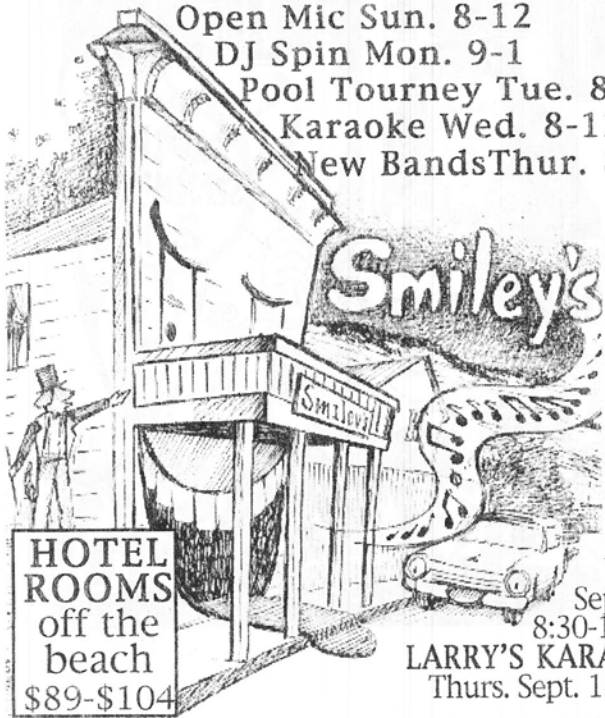

What a joy to see the beach returned to its natural state since the
seawalls have been cleansed of the harsh, garish graffiti, that was such
an intrusive distraction!

Most of the imagery was jagged, aggressive, block letters, reminiscent
of street gangs--certainly out of keeping with the soft, subtle, colors and
organic forms of the sand, seashells, driftwood and native plants that
belong to the landscape.

However, in this debate, it isn't necessary to argue about what is "art",
or about what is or is not beautiful, because there are other issues that
definitively make the case against allowing graffiti on the seawalls.

The toxic fumes and the polluting spray paint and cans are already
reasons enough for this so-called "tradition" to stop! No other
arguments even need to be mentioned.

But there is one over-arching consideration in all of this that I'd like to
point out: namely, that Bolinas Beach is essentially a wilderness area--
fully reclaimed by the sea twice each day. Because this powerful ocean
wilderness is so easily accessible to us, it's easy to forget that we are
only temporary guests there.

Would the graffiti "artists" feel justified in wielding their spray cans
within a forest preserve? I think that most would not, and those that
would ought to re-think their place in Nature, especially now that there
are so few places left on this Planet that have not been altered by
humans.

It is so rare and special that we have this beautiful natural wonderland
right in our backyard! We should be treating Bolinas Beach as the
sacred place it is by letting it just be! The only "art" that Bolinas Beach
needs is for us to pick up the trash that's already there and not to add
any more!



These are untamed/enchanting visitors from dimensions beyond time and space.


We may recognize them as our constant companions who flow in the rivers of our unexplored and often silent being.

MOLÉ TASTING DINNER

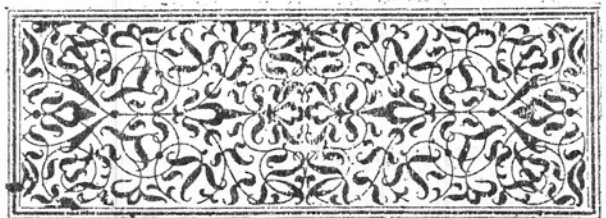

I live a block away from the beach front and walk there just about every day. I marvel at the graffiti output along the walls and find it intriguing and; at times, stunningly beautiful.

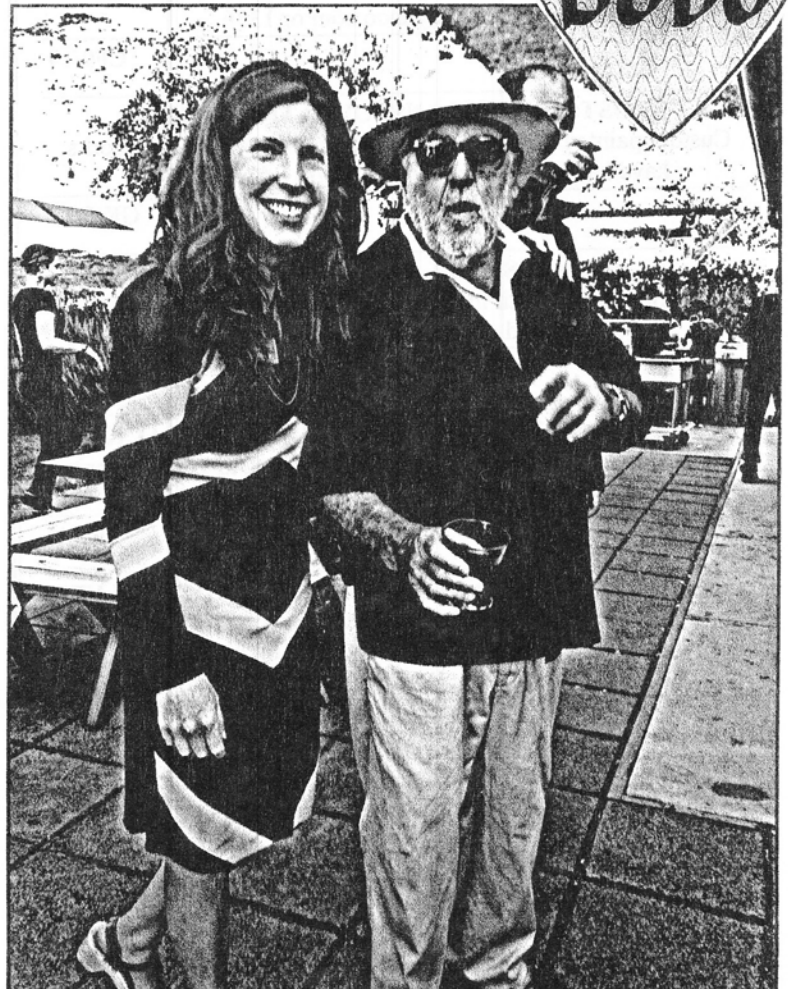
You either like it or you don't.
