ART and ASTRONOMY at BOLINAS MUSEUM Opening Reception for 3 Exhibitions SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 22

Bolinas Museum invites you to the opening of three remarkable exhibitions. Two explore astronomy through history, contemporary art and historic treasures from the Lick Observatory. Then, filmmaker Joel Coen brings us into intimate observations.

For the exhibition *Cosmic Wonders: The Moon, The Stars, and the Space Between,* Jennifer Gately brought together nationally-known and local artists, who like humans since prehistory, seek to document and interpret our ever changing understanding of the cosmos. Mediums vary from a ballpoint pen and a historic heliogravure to sophisticated and experimental photography and re-mastered historic NASA images. Participants are Russell Crotty, Linda Connor, Michael Light, Amelia Konow, Charles Lindsay, as well as Bolinas-Stinson science teacher Don Jolley and Point Reyes Station photographer Marty Knapp who will speak at the opening.

The photography gallery exhibition *Treasures from the Archive: Photographs and Logbooks from Lick Observatory*, curated by Tony Misch, Lick Observatory's Director of Collections, presents glass plate photos, historic scientific instruments and treasures from the archives of the observatory on Mount Hamilton. Opened in 1888, this was the first continually occupied mountain-top observatory in the world! Tony Misch will be among the luminaries for the Great Minds panel discussion on November 10th, one of several exciting events related to the exhibitions that also includes, "A Walk to Pluto" with Don Jolley on October 6th.

The third exhibition is *Joel Coen: Peek: Optical Haiku* curated by Bolinas artist Wayne Campbell. Filmmaker Joel Coen invites us into his private world of creativity, to experience the Zen-like elegance of his handcrafted, three-dimensional optical viewers (similar to 19th century stereopticons) that can only be looked into by one person at a time. Coen creates these objects during breaks from his larger projects that demand interaction with multitudes. Here, he invites an intimate communion between an audience of one and the artist.

Also be sure to see the magnificent Welch painting of the east side of Bolinas Lagoon in the Permanent Collection Gallery, and the fascinating history exhibit *The Parkin Family in Bolinas at the Turn of the 20th Century.*

Preview talks by Coen, Jolley and Knapp at 2PM.



What the Heck is YES ON W?

W is Measure W and would raise the overnight lodging tax (TOT) in West Marin from the current 10% - all of which goes into the County's General Fund - to 14%, with that extra 4% staying in West Marin to be spent on emergency

services and community/affordable housing. The measure is called "Measure W" and is designed to allow overnight visitors to West Marin help address the two biggest and related problems caused by the large influx of visitors to our towns: stretched-thin volunteer fire departments and a lack of rental and affordable housing.

To be clear, the 4% increase is paid only by overnight visitors to West Marin (\$8 on an average \$200/night room) and doesn't affect West Marin residents at all, except for the benefits the increase will bring to West Marin. Our fire departments in West Marin strongly support the measure, as their staffing budgets have not been able to keep up with the demands that the ever-increasing number of visitor calls in West Marin has placed on them.


PLEASE SUPPORT THIS MEASURE - there may not be another chance to create funding for West Marin's emergency services and affordable housing again for a long time. PLEASE TELL YOUR NEIGHBORS TO SUPPORT THIS MEASURE the measure needs to be passed by a 66.6% vote never easy - and there are several B&B owners in Point Reyes pumping out a lot of misinformation in opposition to the measure. (Which, I'll add, mystifies me, as one would think they too would want sufficient firefighters, as well as housing for their staff).

IF YOU ARE WILLING TO PUT UP A YARD SIGN, please let me know - we have a lot of them and we need to cover West Marin with them. I'll get one to you.

The Transformation of Mesa Skatepark


A Short Story that will have a long History!!



EVACUATION DRILL

On Saturday, September 22nd from 9:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. the Bolinas Fire Department and Bolinas Disaster Council will be conducting a VOLUNTARY FIRE EVACUATION drill for the Gridded Mesa.

We will be using AlertMarin to place a call to all landline home numbers with a prerecorded message at approximately 9:30 a.m. Saturday September 22nd. Alert Marin will also send text messages to all registered cell phones. We encourage everyone to participate as the evacuation from the Mesa will likely be the same during a real event.

If you choose to participate, please proceed <u>in your vehicle</u> to the Bolinas Fire Station on Mesa Rd. At the fire station you will find information on emergency preparedness from the Fire Department, Disaster Council, and West Marin CERT. We will also be providing light snacks.

To receive "Alert Marin" texts and find out more about Alert Marin, go to www.AlertMarin.org

While this exercise is focused on the Big Mesa, all citizens of Bolinas are encouraged to stop by the fire station to pick up information about Emergency Preparedness.

During the exercise you will see emergency vehicles moving throughout your neighborhood to simulate an actual response. This is not only great practice for us but it also allows us to familiarize ourselves with your neighborhood and identify potential hazards.
