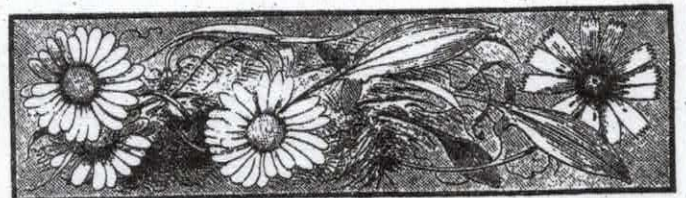

Measure W –Who cooked that one up?

In early 2016 several representatives from all the hamlets in unincorporated West Marin came together to discuss the noticeable housing issues that we were experiencing. We called ourselves the No Name group as we could not come up with a name we could all agree upon but we were clear about one thing: there was a housing crisis and it seemed to be linked to real estate speculation. After much research we realized that coastal communities up and down the west coast were also experiencing similar housing issues and were creating legislation that helped stem the tide of overwhelming growth of short term rentals and loss of long term rentals.

Our group was attracted to a beautiful piece of legislation adopted in Santa Monica requiring that a full-time resident live on site in order to offer a short term rental. And we also talked about increasing the TOT in unincorporated Marin, legislating that the increase fund affordable housing and emergency responders therein. We took our research and met first with Steve Kinsey who was supportive but knew it would take longer to pursue than his current term.

So we waited until Dennis Rodoni was in office and met with him. He was supportive of the increase in TOT. A couple of us no namers attended a few housing meetings at CLAM about a year ago that assembled housing advocates from all over unincorporated Marin. These meetings were inspired. It was there my energy to create the TOT increase legislation really took flight and that is what we are voting on today: Measure W. An idea that started with concerned West Marin residents getting together to see what we could do about an issue that is hollowing out our communities - democracy in action.

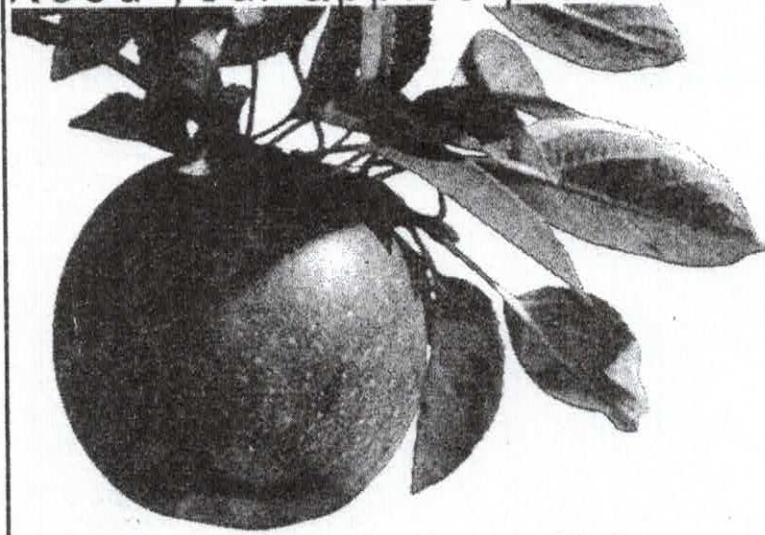

I joined the Board of the BCLT in 2000. We had just purchased the Gibson House. I was inspired by a poster that then Board member Jennie Pfeiffer had put out front of the Gibson House. It said something like, "These are our friends and neighbors" that live here. Since I moved to Bolinas in 1971, I've experienced the many benefits of living together with other people. It is economical, friendly and supports a spirit of community. By community, I mean working and living together for the benefit of everyone.

Initially, during the 1970's, I worked in Bolinas and West Marin as a nurse midwife with the doctors at the West Marin Medical Center in Pt. Reyes. This was a time when women and families were returning to a more natural way of birthing, raising families and building community. We bought property and built a house here in Bolinas. I was glad that my kids could roam freely and safely; learning about life and nature. We all watched out for each other.

In the 1980's, I bought Dr. Lance's medical practice downtown with savings from my Dad. Soon Dr. Michael Whitt joined our office. In the 1990's we successfully fund raised in the community and joined the Coastal Health Alliance. I worked as a Family Nurse Practitioner here until I retired in 2012 - 30 years. It has been such an honor to serve and work with the community in this way.

Now, my grandchildren run freely, especially on the beach, their favorite place; finally putting down their cell phones and forgetting about them.

But our sense of community is in danger. I think we need to integrate those who own second homes into the community; and we really need to provide affordable homes for families, working people and teachers. So, I am committed to helping find solutions. I really appreciate the vision of Arianne Dar, our Executive Director; and the inspiration and "can do!" spirit of Evie Wilhelm, our Managing Director. We have an amazing Board. At our last Town meeting in July, I was impressed and grateful for the support of our larger community. I can see that it is actually possible for us to realize our dreams of a vibrant, diverse community.

Pres. Kimball called the regular meeting of the Bolinas Fire Protection District to order at 7:00PM. Vice Pres. Chiera, Dir. Gade, Dir. Martinelli and Dir. Shaw were present. Also present: Chief Brown, Administrative Assistant Cadance Lynam, Captain Krakauer and Assistant Chief Marcotte.

Chief Brown was unable to attend the August 22nd meeting due to a lack of staffing coverage. Chief Brown will be sharing the minutes from the meeting when they are available but it seems there were no pressing issues discussed.

Training

Recent training has focused on Violent Incident Response. In light of mass shootings that have taken place around the Country, policies have been discussed Countywide dictating how law enforcement and EMS responds to active shooter incidents. Through a large grant, all fire departments in the County now carry Ballistic Personnel Protective Equipment for medical personnel should they be called to respond to an active shooter incident. Bolinas has four sets. The training has focused on our interactions with law enforcement and what we might expect should we be asked to respond. We would never be asked to respond into a "hot" zone,

meaning we would not respond into an area where there is the potential for active shooting. We may be expected

to respond into a "warm" zone, meaning a shooting has taken place, the shooter has been isolated, there are injured people and we need to treat and remove those injured ASAP. We would always be escorted in and out by a team of law enforcement officers. Asst. Chief Marcotte and two firefighters attended a recent training offered by the Marin County Sheriff's Office. We will continue to participate in order to stay informed on this evolving issue.

Disaster Council

Chief Brown attended the MCSO National Night Out on August 7th in Pt. Reyes. Chief Brown spoke to quite a few residents about disaster preparedness and handed out our Living with Fire in Bolinas as well as our Disaster Preparedness Worksheet. Both were very well received. We will be holding our first evacuation drill on Saturday, September 22nd from 0930 – 1030. All residents of the Gridded Mesa are invited to participate. We are asking everyone to evacuate when they receive a message from Alert Marin or when they hear us in their neighborhood announcing the evacuation drill. Everyone is asked to come to the fire station where we will have information on disaster preparedness including CERT and Alert Marin. The Hearsay will be announcing the drill every Friday until the 22nd. The information will also be on NextDoor, on flyers downtown and we are researching a bulk mailing to all postal patrons. Asst. Chief Marcotte, Capt. Krakauer and Chief Brown met for several hours on July 27th to finalize the need of our Departmental Operations Center. We will be meeting one more time before we ask non-trained people to practice deploying it.

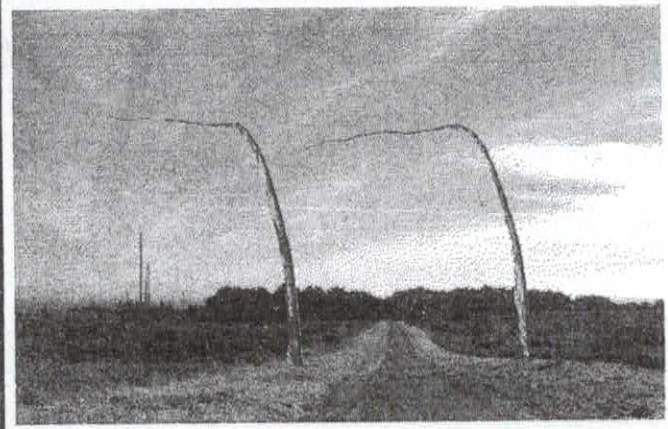
As updated last month, Chief Brown has been working on determining what size vapor meter our emergency generator would need in order to determine the generators fuel consumption. Chief Brown was able to meet with our generator maintenance person the morning of August 23rd. With his guidance, we were able to run the generator under full load. It was determined that the power needs of our facilities are far under the capacity of the generator. The generator has a 50 KW capacity; our facilities never required more than 10 during the test. This information tells us two important pieces of information, if we choose to move forward with the vapor meter, we can install the smaller one at a cost of approximately \$1,500. It also tells us our 500 gallon propane tank will last long beyond the 36 hours originally noted, especially if we start shedding electrical equipment during an event. Chief Brown was unable to attend the West Marin Disaster Council meeting but Asst. Chief Marcotte was able to attend and gave a small update. He mentioned that it was good to see West Marin Disaster Coordinator Ann Sands bringing everyone together to share plans and needs.

Operations/Administration

Sup. Rodoni's measure to increase the Transient Occupancy Tax in West Marin will be on the November ballot as Measure W. Chief Brown expressed again how important this potential revenue could be for the District.

The fieldwork for this year's audit has been scheduled for September 19th. Preparation for the audit is coming along very nicely. The one outstanding item still is the completion of the Employee Policy Manual. Chief Brown and Administrative Assistant Cadance Lynam have gotten it almost to the point of completion. Chief Brown is working on the final updates that have been forwarded from Lexipol. The next step will be for the Personnel Committee to decide how to present the large document to the Board for approval. Once that is completed, the policies will be forwarded out to all employees and volunteers in sections. The manual will likely not be completed in time for this year's final audit approval.

President Kimball, Capt. Krakauer and Chief Brown were able to meet with AT&T representatives this morning regarding their request to modify their communications tower. We are still awaiting more information before this item will be brought before the Board for action.
