On the Death of Robin Williams

This death touched us all.
 For we all reveled in
 His crazy antics--he
 Was our court jester,
 Jibing us again and again
 With our silliness, our pompousness, our vain
 Pretensions. Quick and agile, he could be
 A Russian emigre one second, and the next
 An Indian guru, wheeling on a dime
 To lob his shots right through
 The hoop of laughter.

This death touched us all.
 For how could he--so loved,
 So universally admired--
 Not be content with that?
 When we heard he had snipped the cord
 Of his own life,
 Each of us looked within
 And saw the presence there
 Of a grey and dismal spectre that,
 In moments of the frozen heart,
 Steps from behind some curtain of the soul
 Intoning, "What's the use?"

In face of all the whips and snares,
 The stinging swarm of petty cares
 Pursuing us--the same-old, same-old
 Drudgery of repetitious chores--
 The same-old, same-old rounds
 Of aching lost relationships
 and frantic entertainments--
 The tenaciousness of our mean little habits,
 Our youthful dreams abandoned, unfulfilled--
 The same-old, same-old
 unrelenting barbarism of the news--
 Each day this poison lifted to our lips--
 In moments of the frozen heart,
 This spectre will intone: "It would
 Be so much easier...to just give up."

The day after Robin Williams death,
 I stepped out for my morning walk--
 As often happens, just emerging from
 A dullness, hopelessness
 That, oddly enough, tends to afflict me
 At the start of day.
 And walking corridors of green
 To the cliff's edge that looks out
 Upon the great Pacific,
 I wakened once again
 To the vast embrace of sky and sea,
 The myriad multiplicity of living creatures
 That push up from the ground,
 that soar through the air,
 That run across the meadows...God,
 What a gift it is to be alive!
 When none of this need have been,
 What a bounty we are born into.

When you brush away the webs of entanglement
 That your assumed identity creates,
 The simple fact of being here
 Upon this wondrous earth
 Is quite enough.

I cannot judge the angst
 Of incapacitating sickness, looming debt
 And failed relationships that may have led
 Our dear and wonderful comedian
 To this laughless choice.
 But I cannot help but feel
 That had he stepped away
 From the very city-centered life he led--
 The sticky, binding contracts
 Of our social definition--
 He might--in the simple, commonplace
 Awareness of our being here--
 Have found the courage to endure.

Enough of preaching, though.
 We are greedy for more of him,
 But still--what a legacy he left.

We miss you, Robin.
 And though perhaps you didn't treasure it enough
 Your life--your brief and flaming life--
 Forever now in re-runs--
 Will always be among the gifts
 That treasure life
 For us.
