

Why is Unaffordable Housing Sacred?

It's a common misconception that only affordable housing is subsidized. Almost all housing is subsidized, unaffordable housing more than most. Mortgage tax deductions for second and third homes are the tip of the iceberg. The network of, roads, emergency response, policing, garbage pickup and government services that support suburban and exurban ranch houses are subsidized by more densely packed housing. Schools, government buildings, roads, water, sewage, gas and electric power lines were paid for in the last century by public indebtedness.

As they fall apart their replacement costs will prove staggering. Tally the stated costs of the Big Dig for Terrace, then add in the carbon footprint and health injuries from thousands of truck trips to provide access for a few. Ditto the repaving of Highway One around the Lagoon.

The most subsidized houses of all are those owned by the 1% because their ginormous wealth is dependent on this socialized infrastructure, while our bloated military protects their foreign investments and the transportation routes that feed the beast.

The lack of discussion on public subsidies for unaffordable housing breeds contempt for poor people who live in officially subsidized housing. To witness the knee jerk response of "homeowners" (only if they continue paying mortgages, taxes, fees) against affordable housing in their neighborhood. come to the Stinson Affordable Housing meeting on Tuesday, Nov. 15 at 7 pm,

This contempt is epitomized by the Marin Housing Authority evicting Royce McLemore of Marin City for taking in her dying mother. I met Royce twenty years ago, a community activist protesting that the Marin City "improvements", wouldn't help the existing residents. They didn't listen to her because the "authority" favored interests of the developers and "market rate" homeowners over poor residents and her fears came to pass. They killed the best Flea Market in the country and the community funding it generated for chain stores, half empty now.

Since the least subsidized housing is tents, she may have to Occupy Marin City. You may not know Royce McLemore, but if you support basic human decency and equal rights for people who live in officially subsidized housing in Marin please call the Marin County supervisors at 499-7331 and tell them this just ain't right. The supervisors are also the board members of the Housing Authority.

"Tough luck, buddy." the guy growled. "Get to the back of the line."

I was pissed off, but there was nothing I could do, and I went to the end of the line.

Five minutes later, a door opened at the head of the line. A Marine Captain walked out, and started pointing to people in line.

"And you," he pointed to the guy in my chair, "Are now in the Marine Gorps." The Marines had been taking a lot of casualties in Vietnam, and they were bolstering their ranks with draftees.

The new recruit broke down in tears.

"This isn't my chair." he sobbed. "It's that guy's at the end of the line." pointing to me.

"Tough luck, buddy." the officer growled and continued picking candidates. By the time he got to the end of the line he had filled his quota.

I marvelled at my luck in having chosen that time to go to the bathroom. Getting drafted into the Army was bad enough, but I had narrowly missed getting drafted into the Marines.

That evening all of us draftees boarded the train to Ft. Benning, Georgia.

My days as a hippie artist were over — or so I thought.
