Vintage Bolinas

It was a weekend of Vintage Bolinas as we celebrated the 60th Anniversary of the Community Center.

The building was constructed in 1951 to house the town's new home-built fire truck

The Community Center has been at the heart of Bolinas for the past 60 years. Times have changed. New styles are old fashioned.

The Community Center is only a building, yet there is a spirit of Community building that unites all generations. As Maitreya puts it so succinctly, it's CommUnity.

Last weekend we celebrated 60 years of CommUnity with a slideshow extravaganza. Bolinas photographers Ilka Hartmann and Barbara Kayfetz showed their photographs of Bolinas in the "good old days" when we were neither good nor old.

The faces in the slides were young and idealistic. There were pictures of the Sun Festival when it was fantastic and elaborate. When the cultural style of Bolinas could be described as an artistic melange of Bali and Bobo.

There were pictures from the early days of Paradise Valley. There were photos from the 70's. I saw myself with dark hair and moustache standing next to Amy Urdang...

It was vintage Bolinas, projected on the back wall of the Community Center. using a vintage Carousel slide projector with a vintage bulb. ("Pray for the bulb to last." Barbara told me before the show.)

Names were called out when people were recognized. There were lots of pictures of kids who are now grown ups, and grown ups who are now passed. I saw that the past, which seems so recent, is history. The past is gone. Still I felt nostalgia for the past when it seemed so innocent and pure and optimistic.

Nostalgia has a sweet sadness, and I found myself sad and reflective after the slideshow. But Sunday was Founding Families Day, and I got to go way back — to the 40's and 50's in Bolinas,

Some of the Bolinas oldtimers gathered in the Community Center to share stories of the past. A microphone was passed around and everyone had a chance to talk about the early days of the Community Center and their lives in Bolinas.

Their stories made history come alive. I had a chance to appreciate the spirit of community and self reliance that was Bolinas before the oil spill. I also got to see a new side of the spirit of Bolinas, that invisible sense of place that binds us all together.

That spirit of Bolinas was hovering above us as we celebrated 60 years of the CommUnity. Thanks to Barbara and Ilka and everyone who helped with the momentous, historical event.

We're all old timers now. Occupy Bolinas.

In reference to the Occupy movement, Vic quipped. "Bolinas has been occupied for 40 years." I knew what he meant. The hippies came to Bolinas for the oil spill and stayed. They brought their radical ideas of peace & love, organic food & sustainability and built CommUnity in Bolinas.

My wish is that CommUnity occupies the planet with peace, love and organic food...

Expatriate Post: Dispatch to Boboland from a Small Town near France - IX

- Previously not published anywhere.

It all started because someone who will remain unnamed, but who happened to be my father, said, "Go ahead, study Spanish, but make sure you can read a French menu and be able to order in French." I could spend the next decade analyzing the subtext of this particular paternal person, but I'd rather not. Suffice it to say that after eating Béarnaise sauce on a tender piece of beef the size of a button and chocolate soufflé Gran Marnier for the very first time at the age of sixteen and then nicking the menu from L'Etoile, that once Grande Dame of Nob Hill where palms sprouted out of elephant's feet and Peter Mintun massaged the piano keys, I was smitten (and will reluctantly admit that the paternal person scored a point).

Eggs poached in Burgundian wine, potatoes smothered in toasted cheese, lofty cakes loaded with drunken prunes, crepes farting rich whipped cream, dry champagne with Lilliputian bubbles! I would do more than just order in French; I would speak that language of love, troubadours, bejeweled pompadours and the odd guillotine whilst pouting my lips and tumbling my r's just so.

With wonky adolescent conviction, I set sail for Lyon, the gastronomic center of the universe, and soon discovered that to be fluent in French one had only to be proficient in discussing food and the weather. This would grant admission into the inner sanctum (well, at least the fuzzy gray area just on the fringe) of French society.

Rule no. 1: While in the middle of a meal, always discuss the next meal. 'We're having pig's feet with potatoes in lardy jackets and rhubarb tart for dinner tonight,' is always a sure winner if discussed while eating lunch.

Rule no. 2: Always use a cunning, idiomatic, weatherrelated expression to raise eyebrows and receive a cluck of admiration. "Il fait un froid de canard" (It's duck cold [outside]). Duck is used here because ducks are hunted in winter.

Food is underlined even when one is ill: 'Je ne suis pas dans mon assiette (I am not in my plate),' or, in other words, 'I am under the weather.' To not eat is clearly a shame, if not a downright tragedy. I will attest to this firsthand as I have not been in my plate lately (nor my bowl or wineglass). This state of under the weather-ness began with my return to France from that small town near Greece.

As all my house guests sit around eating spicy roasted eggplant and lamb shanks charged with garlic, I tote my griping belly down to the village doctor. I find him hiding behind his car in the parking lot smoking a cigarette. As I accost him with my complaint, he stares at me - this peculiar American with healthy gums and all of her teeth - and he uncorks his very unique laugh: a hiss through elongated lips that always has the chilling effect of reminding me of Hannibal Lecter and fava beans served up with some body part and chilled Chablis.

The good doctor prods and pokes my physique and listens with a stethoscope and admits that there is a riot taking place in my gut. 'Are they speaking Greek?' I ask. He instructs the lab to examine my bodily fluids under a microscope. 'There is nothing here,' he says while reading the cryptic report.

At the risk of sounding like a hypochondriac, I pooh pooh Dr. Lecter's diagnosis and head for the pharmacy. Now, pharmacies in France are fascinating, over-gorged, remedy palaces. Here, the enfeebled will always find a compassionate ear and will invariably leave clutching a bag brimming with panaceas to be introduced to every orifice known to the human frame: up your nostril, down the hatch, in your ear and up your bum with some eye drops thrown in for good measure. If you happen to have a basketful of mushrooms from the forest with you, the pharmacist is even trained to distinguish the tasty from the poisonous, and if your school-aged child happens to have some suspicious nits in his hair, the pharmacist will move in for a gander as well as anyone else who might happen to be standing there in line.

Growing up in Bolinas, our medicine cabinet contained pots of beauty cream, wart remover, a variety of nourishing teas that removed tooth enamel, garlic oil and the everdreaded Golden Seal powder which, when applied to blemishes, turned my cheeks and forehead an appalling shade of chartreuse. You can imagine my elation when I discovered that France is the most over-medicated country in the world and its pharmacies make Ali Baba's cave go all pale and uninteresting in comparison. Sadly, however, my brimming pharmaceutical goody bag brings me no relief this time and I have to go to the Emergency Room. Only in France, I pass all of the ambulances and arrive at the door to find a patient in a hospital gown hooked up to an IV smoking a cigarette.

Long and the short of it is, I have diverticulitis. What?!!! I don't meet the criteria: I do not eat Krispy Kreme donuts, I am not an inert couch tuber and I never deep-fry my turkey for Thanksgiving. The doctors shrug and chalk it up to genetics. That seems to be the pat, universal excuse these days. They hide safely behind 3 billion bits of DNA and at least 30,000 human genes. Who in their right mind would want to sift through that miasma. . .

Just so you know, this is what you can eat whilst having an attack of diverticulitis:

Phase One - Water

Phase Two - Anything resembling slime

Phase Three - Any and all nutritious food resembling sawdust P.S. By the way, scientists believe that the ability to learn French depends on genetic make-up. So, if you don't have that




Guiding Light, monotype 2010
