THE B.C.P.U.D. WEDNESDAY NIGHT AGAIN STRUGGLED WITH GOVERNMENT DOUBLE-THINK SPECIFICATIONS JARGON IN CONNECTION WITH OUR NEW SEWER TREATMENT PLANT.
