

The Hippie Church

Yama was visiting with her friend Roland, an old hippie wearing flowers and feathers in his hair. Roland's colorful fashion sense was straight out of the Haight. His deeply furrowed face seemed noble and wise with vast experience. I learned that Roland had lived on the street in Venice. He told me that he was into lightweight, low cost living structures built out of bamboo and clear plastic.

"Claustrophobia and water are the two main problems of nomadic structures" Roland explained to me. "But plastic sheeting solves them. Plastic isn't ideal, I agree, it should be made out of hemp," he continued. "But plastic is cheap and readily available, and will work until we have something better."

He went off into a long explanation of building design and crystalline structure, and I quickly got lost in his theories. But I was intrigued by Roland's concepts of housing alternatives.

"Why not build a demonstration dome in Bolinas?" I asked him. We discussed building a small dome for the kids in the kids' corner in the Plaza. Then I remembered the gorilla mall on Saturday. (The gorilla mall is a spontaneous gathering of people who like to exchange stuff. It happens every Saturday when the weather's nice.)

I invited Roland, with the assistance of Yama, to build a structure in the park during the gorilla mall. On Saturday Roland and Yama showed up at the park with a bundle of bamboo poles, a big skein of twine and a box of colorful fabric.

"Five over six crystalline structure." Roland said as he positioned five pieces of bamboo into a pentagon. He arranged the rest of the bamboo poles into a running fence of equilateral triangles.

Roland and Yama spent a some time lashing the bamboo poles together with the twine. I knew that Roland was getting serious when he brought out a big roll of duct tape. Roland's lavish use of duct tape concerned me. But I didn't intercede. I recognized that he was in an artistic zone and I didn't want to interrupt his reverie by voicing my concerns over duct tape.

James immediately sensed the holy atmosphere and spent the night inside chanting and praying.

No doubt about it, Roland's art installation was a hippie church. A psychedelic crystal ship of hippiedom had landed in the park. I loved Roland's vision of alternative housing. But I knew that some would hate it.

Sure enough it didn't take long for the bitty committee to condemn the project. The critics never appreciated the beauty and frivolity of the structure. Instead they saw it as a public nuisance and a potential hang out for the drunks.

I was not surprised by the reaction. I knew that an outrageous art installation like the hippie church would never last downtown. I was grateful that it stayed up for the weekend. On Monday morning, Arn helped me take it down.

The demonstration of a housing alternative was a total success. Roland's sculpture was a beautiful addition to the park. Like a rare orchid, it bloomed for a few days and then faded.

The hippie church will bloom again. When it does stop by and see for yourself what we mean when we say alternative housing.

I helped Roland lift the pentagonal cap onto to the ring of triangles. I discovered that duct tape was great for joining bamboo. We soon had a solid five on six duct taped together.

Roland began to cover the framework with fabric. I assumed that he would tent the structure with fabric. Instead he scissored the fabric into free form shapes and tied them between the poles. Roland had a unique style of scissoring which left a richly feathered edge. He left no fabric edge unadorned.

He seemed to be painting the space with colorful swashes of color. The feathered fabric hung like opulent curtains on the bamboo frame. Light and color danced around the spacious interior. It was a magical play place and a mystical, sacred space. There was an undeniable psychedelic feeling about the structure. "Color and fun." it said, and "let's play make believe."

Sometimes realization is in knowing who We are not.


A wonderful cast of local denizens are there To support Nuxa, as friends and mentors.







Decision to be made Monday Night, September 26, about Adding More AT&T Cell Antennas!

Please come to hear the discussion, the presentation by Don Smith and the new proposed amendment to the existing lease.

Don has done some remarkable work, as well as David Kimball. They've toiled away behind the scenes for months and now are going to present their conclusions to us.

All this new information needs to be thoroughly understood by the community before action is taken.

After all these months of concern by the community, we hope that we can take the time to digest this complex new data, and not rush to a vote Monday night.

This decision will be a binding one impacting the health and welfare of the total community for decades. We must have the time necessary to understand the implications of the proposal to expose us and our children, to additional RF radiation, a class 2B carcinogen, 24/7 until these leases run out, and why it is truly necessary.

Though some in Bolinas get more RF exposure from their household wireless devices like cordless phones and wi-fi, many of us are extremely careful to avoid exposure and decided not to have any of those. But we have no choice about this exposure; our exposure to constant RF radiation from the cell tower won't be avoidable. Let's give everyone who wants it, enough time to fully comprehend the new data.

NEUROLOGICAL EFFECTS OF RADIOFREQUENCY ELECTROMAGNETIC RADIATION

EFFECTS OF VERY LOW INTENSITY RFR

For those who have questions on the possible health effects of exposure to radiation from cell masts [towers], there are studies that show biological effects at very low intensities. The following are some examples: Kwee and Raskmark [1997] reported changes in cell proliferation (division) at SARs of 0.000021- 0.0021 W/kg; Magnras and Xenos [1997] reported a decrease in reproductive functions in mice exposed to RFR intensities of 160-1053 nW/square cm (the SAR was not calculated); Ray

and Behari [1990] reported a decrease in eating and drinking behavior in rats exposed to 0.0317 W/kg; Dutta et al. [1989] reported changes in calcium metabolism in cells exposed to RFR at 0.05-0.005 W/kg; and Phillips et al. [1998] observed DNA damage at 0.024-0.0024 W/kg. Most of the above studies investigated the effect of a single episode of RFR exposure. As regards exposure to cell mast radiation, chronic exposure becomes an important factor. Intensity and exposure duration do interact to produce an effect. We [Lai and Carino, In press] found with extremely low frequency magnetic fields that 'lower intensity, longer duration exposure' can produce the same effect as from a 'higher intensity, shorter duration exposure'. A field of a certain intensity, that exerts no effect after 45 min of exposure, can elicit an effect when the exposure is prolonged to 90 min. Thus, as described earlier, the interaction of exposure parameters, the duration of exposure, whether the effect is cumulative, involvement of compensatory responses, and the time of break down of homeostasis after long-term exposure, play important roles in determining the possible health consequence of exposure to radiation emitted from cell masts.

We are asking the Fire Board to please respect the work that community members have done over the past year to educate ourselves about this highly complex subject and to not rush to a vote on the same night that Don Smith's new data and the new amendment to the lease is discussed. We all need time to digest the new information. We appreciate the Board's patience in not rushing this highly important decision that will effect our community's health for many years to come. Please be there to add your voice.
