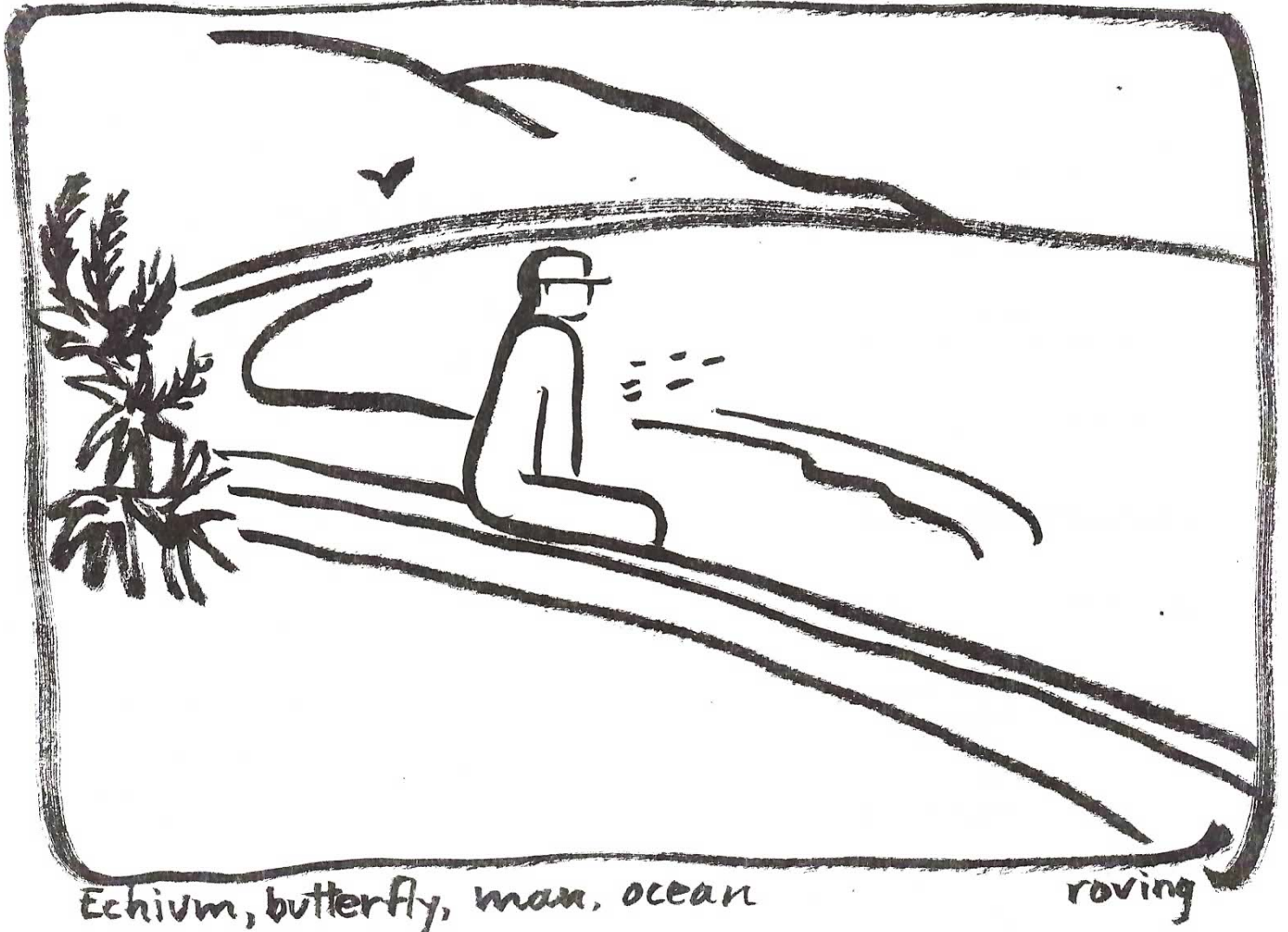

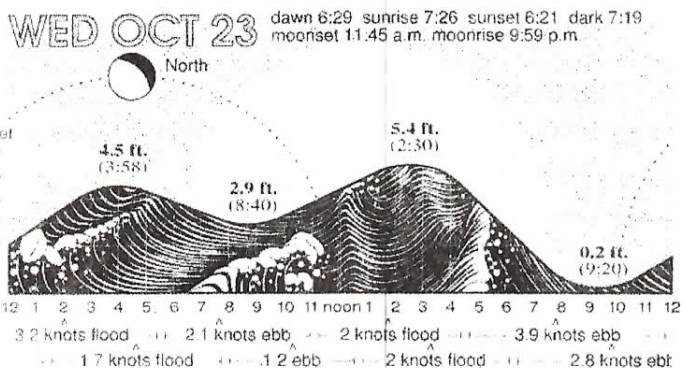

September BCC Board Meeting -

Directors and Staff Present: StuArt Chapman- El Presidente, Eleanor Lyman- Vice-President, Stacy Besenty- Secretary Lia Kourula Sabbatini- General Manager, Randi Dyhr-Arnold- Development Director, June McAdams, Steve Wrenn, Jenny Pfeiffer, and Chris Besenty.

President's Report: The meeting was called to order at 10:15 with the singing of the Mission Statement. StuArt attended the Bo-Stin Fund Meeting at the Farm Stand to give the grant report. He said his singing version was well received by all and that it was a good chance to connect with all of the various other non-profit participants involved. The previous meeting's minutes put up for motion by Jenny and seconded by Chris, and were approved. A Sunday Potluck Dinner was discussed. A once a month happening between 5-8 was suggested and Tuesday night was decided to be a better night because of hall scheduling. Discussion of the dinner will be brought up at the Annual Membership Dinner to get more members involved.

Treasurer's Report: The report was given by Stacy. The numbers are looking great, especially for the time of year and all of the improvements being made to the building.

Manager's Report: We need to think about having a head Food Coordinator for the Labor Day Event. It would be advantageous to have a point person to handle the organization of pick up from the farmers, food prep, menu and to organize the chop. This would possibly be a paid position for the event. There were several suggestions made for improvements for next year- use of hot boxes for chicken, move BBQ to kids area so it is next to food tent, grillers not having to engage with the public, and them problem of volunteers not showing up for their assigned times needs to be addressed. Next year a second bar needs to be put across the road to keep cars from going around the road block. We need to purchase tents for the BCC so that we have adequate coverage without the need to borrow from other sources.

The painting party that is coming up, StuArt will prime the shed in preparation. Painting inside the hall needs to be attended to, Pine Tree will be asked to bid on the painting and spackling needed.

StuArt and Maitreya are now trained Event Managers. Jeff Trotter sold the BCC his light board and Don Smith is looking for dimmers to work with it.

We need to generate more interest in Youth Night and we plan to advertize more to get additional people in as well as bringing in ping pong tables to add to the fun.

A storage locker is being planned for outside of the front entrance as well as storage cabinets in the back of the stage for yoga equipment.

Chris is going to add a past newsletter link and board notes to the website.

Meeting ends 11:40am.

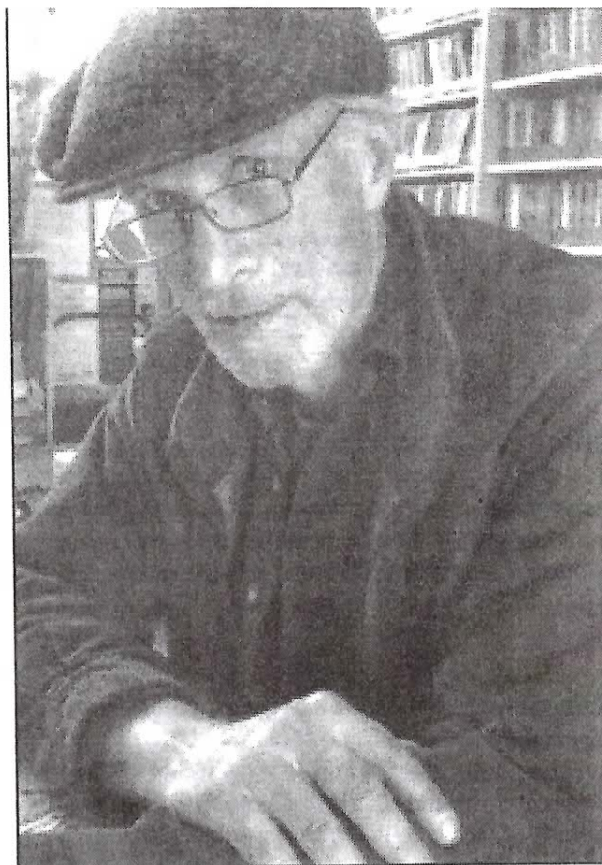
WEEKLY WRAP & RECAP 10/21/13

I was reminded of how much I have appreciated the calm, intelligent competence of Bobbie Kimball and Kim Bender, and how much I will be missing them on the Board. I want to thank them for their years of excellent service. It requires a lot of personal time commitment to take on such a task, and they have given a lot to our community. Kim served on the school Board of Trustees before joining the BCPUD Board, so that's a lot of community involvement. community pillar David Bunnett dies age 65

Citizen co-editor and longtime West Marin resident David Bunnett died Sunday afternoon from cardiac arrest. He was 65.

According to the Sheriff's report, Bunnett was feeling unwell and experiencing chest pain while he was working in his garden in Inverness Park. He collapsed, and a neighbor Ken Seeger, came to his aid, administering CPR while his wife, Tracy Power, called 911.

The Inverness and Marin County Fire Departments both responded to the call and took over attempts to revive Bunnett. A medical helicopter - automatically requested for all cardiac incidents in West Marin - landed in Love Field ready to take the patient to a hospital. But sadly the trip proved unnecessary, and the helicopter was not needed. Bunnett was declared dead at the scene.

As with any sudden death, an investigation is being conducted by the Marin County Sheriff's Department. Lieutenant Doug Pittman told the Citizen that although it was too early to say for sure what the cause of death was, signs pointed to a heart attack. (It was later confirmed to be a heart attack.)

Bunnett moved to West Marin in the early 1970s and for nearly forty years served as a pillar of the community. Aside from his role as co-editor, reporter and jack-of-all-trades for this newspaper, he was most recently on the Board of Directors of KWMR and the Coastal Health Alliance, and had served as Board President for both.

Bunnett had appeared in good health recently. He had just returned from a short vacation in the Sierra's where he hiked vigorously with his partner Ellen, and "step-dog" Tessie".

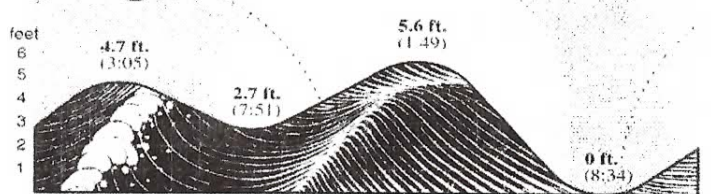

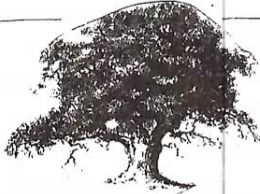

these are moments I willfully presage

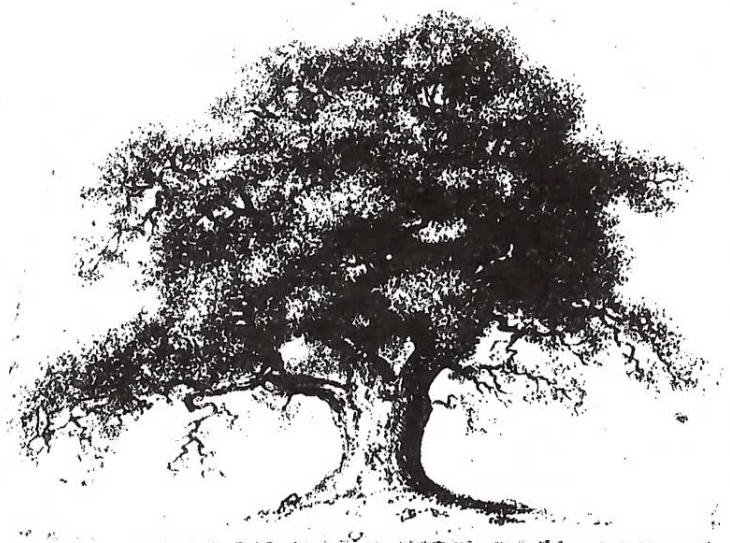
