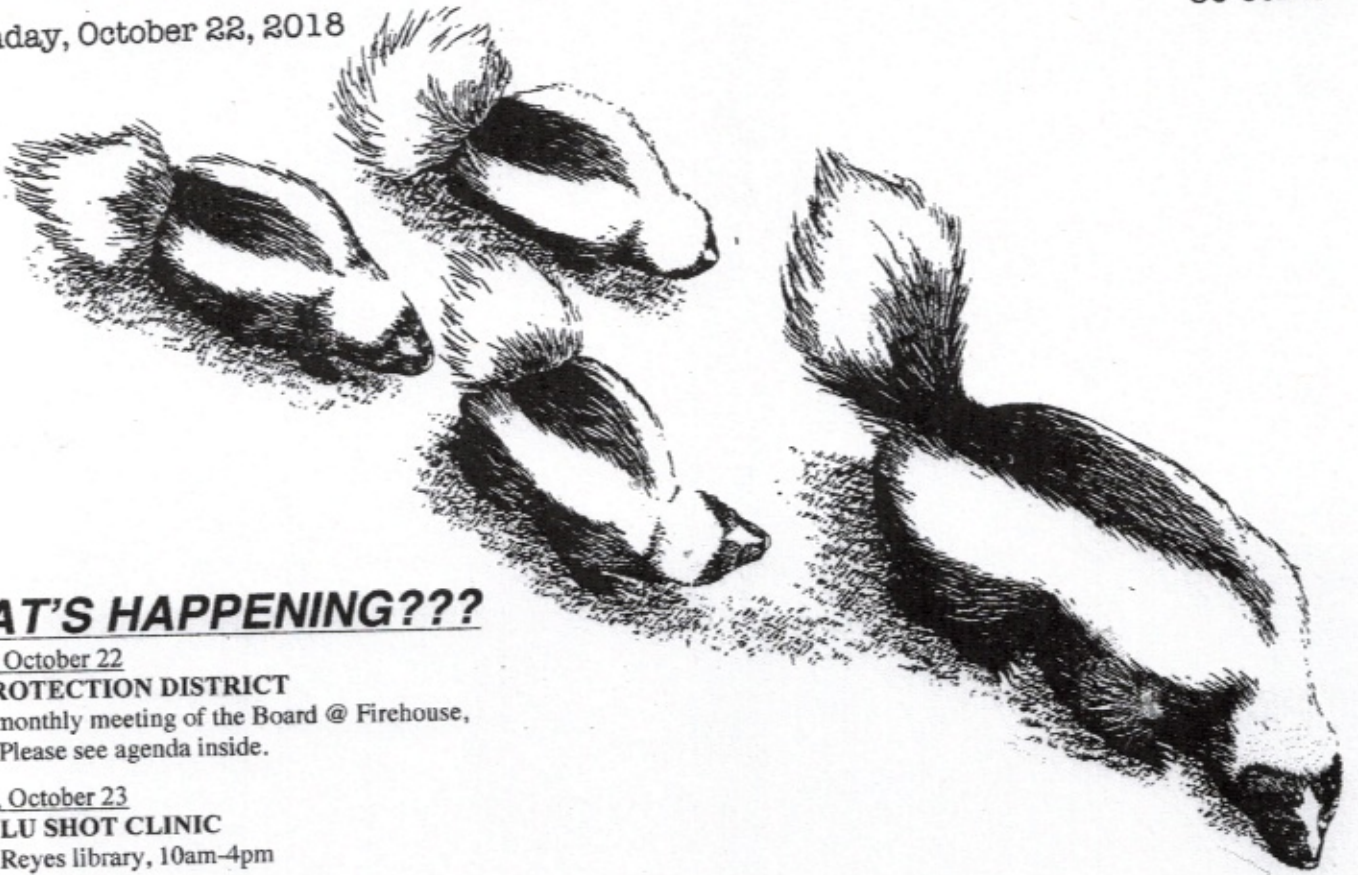

WHAT HAPPENED
10-22-18 Monday Morning Recap
Week-in-Review from Jennie Pfeiffer Riley

This past week ended with some excellent music last night, at a house concert showcasing the fast fingers of two outstanding musicians, Eli Carlton-Pearson on guitar and David Polo on ukulele. This is not your childhood ukulele, that would get pulled from the toy shelf now and again for versions of "Ukulele Lady", this is a truly grown-up style of rock Uke played with loops and echo peddles, sometimes at crazy warp speed, sometimes bluesy, sometimes jazzy, always engaging. Both of these musicians added their voices on songs of their own poetic excellence. Eli included some crowd-pleasing interpretations of Jimi Hendrix classics, reminding us how timeless some of those early electric compositions are. The night was a benefit for Jesse McCollum and his daughter, Chloe, for their upcoming trip to Vietnam where they are travelling to work on a Habitat for Humanity home building project. Thanks to them for representing the town out in the world, and to host Amelia Straton, and to the musicians that gave their time to support this generous undertaking.

Saturday afternoon the Bolinas-Stinson School revisited a long-time tradition, the October Harvest Festival, that has lapsed in the past several years. It's great to have it back with all the games, face-painting, cakewalk, home baked goods, apple pressing, and auction of student-crafted scarecrows, all to support the School Foundation.

Otherwise the week for me has been sorting through election literature to fill in my ballot. I still have some questions, but on the ballot measures, I am going with the recommendations of the California Progressive Voter Guide at couagevoterguide.org. For most everything else, I'm voting Democratic, because in this year of Orwellian Trump, well, how could I not? Where there are two Democrats running, here are my opinions, for what it's worth: State Senator, Mike McGuire; Assembly, Marc Levine; State Superintendent of Public Instruction, Tony Thurmond; U.S. Senator Kevin De Leon. On judges, as well as others not listed here, I'm still gathering information. I would love input.

Local measures, I'm yes on "W" and no on "X". "X" is a tough one for me. I hate to turn my back on my Brighton friends, but I also don't think this measure speaks to our concern for townspeople who have to reside in vehicles. I think we have a way to go yet.

For School Board of Trustees, I, of course, would love your vote - in any case we will press on regardless. jp



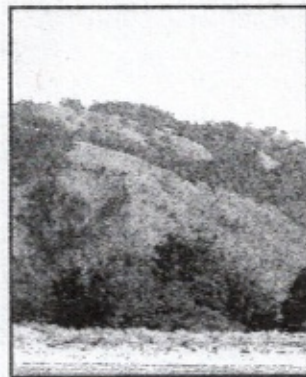

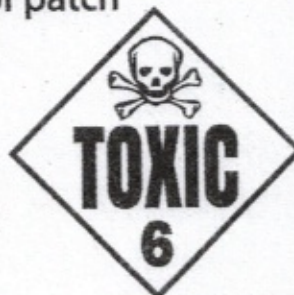

Bolinas Marine Lab Coalition Endorses Three Candidates in Marin Community College District Governing Board Member Election

Marin County, California – October 22, 2018 – The Bolinas Marine Lab Coalition is a group of citizens, scientists, educators, nonprofits and others formed in late 2017 to encourage the College of Marin to place its Bolinas Field Station back in service for hands on science training for its students and continued research with respect to the ecologically important adjacent Bolinas Lagoon and Duxbury Reef areas that has been in process since the College gained ownership of the Field Station in the 1950s. It has been closed since 2005.

The Coalition wholeheartedly endorses **George Rothbart** for Marin Community College District Governing Board Member as he has made restoring the Field Station for programmatic use by teachers and students a centerpiece of his campaign

The Coalition also endorses incumbents **Wanden Treanor** and **Diana Conti** with the understanding that, although they have been hesitant to take action in the past, they now understand the ability of the College to place the Field Station back in service and have committed to doing so.



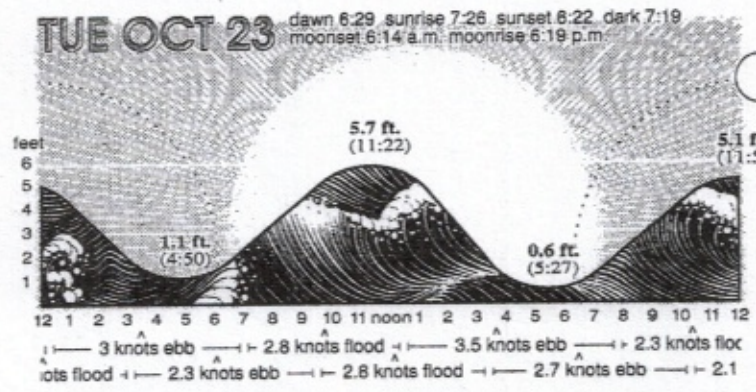
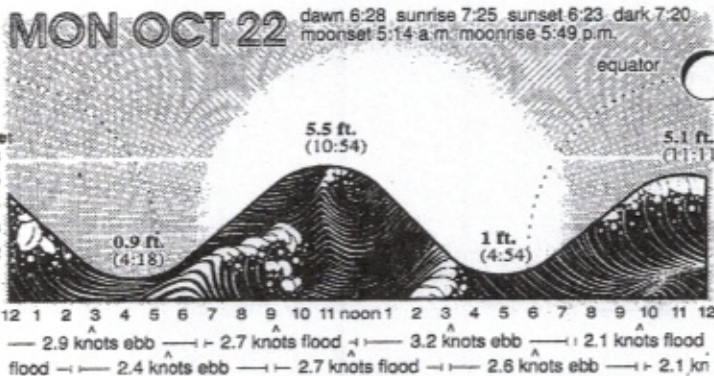
