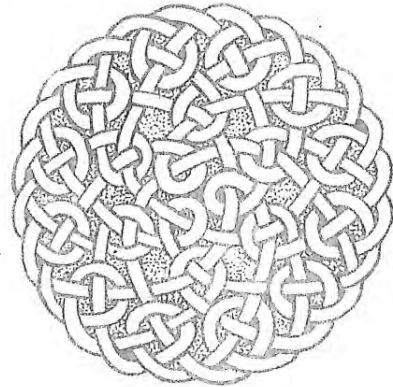

WHAT HAPPENED

MONDAY MORNING WEEK IN REVIEW

11/10/14 WRAP AND RECAP from Jenniepfeiffer

It was a week about elections, with some art openings and music here and there to help with any voting outcome miseries you might be having.

This column is not the place for definitive reporting on the "what's" or "why's" around California elections or the national scene. TV, radio, internet, and large newspapers have been doing that all week. Reporting locally, Measure B, for Bond - Bolinas-Stinson Union School General Obligation Bond - went down in defeat. There were 343 "no" votes or 51.66%, and 321 "yes" votes at 48.34%, so a difference of 22 votes, which shows how important every vote is in a small election. It needed 55% to pass, so looks like we will rethink strategy and, mainly, do better with our communication. One of the important messages to take away from this, is that the School Board - which saw the three incumbents: Nate Siedman, Steve Marcotte, and me, Jennie Pfeiffer, reelected (much gratitude and thanks for the continued support) - needs to reexamine the thoroughness of our posted meeting agendas and minutes. All the months that the Board discussed this Bond measure, it was not articulated independently, but came under the fiscal oversight committee heading, so this was a major failing in getting it out to the two District communities - very large oversight. Hopefully, as we continue our discussion of how to finance our very real needs for facilities upgrade, we will articulate this more clearly, have more community input and get to "yes". Thanks to Christine Cunha for all her diligence on this campaign, and for stepping up to run for School Board. It takes a lot of time and courage.

The art openings in town were a distraction from the disquieting prospect of turning the U.S. Senate from blue over to the red ragers. I mean no disrespect to our local Republican voters, but how a group of people who have had no agenda for the last 6 years, other than sabotage President Obama, will be able to move our Country forward, is a big question mark for me. It looks as though we will be seeing more advantages go to the advantaged, and less for the rest, as we try to hang on to our hard won healthcare improvements, and maintain privacy with our health decisions, work for wage fairness, improve education, and hope for a return to a more sane relationship with firearms.

ART: I always love Richard Shaws openings, even though Sacramento is a bit far to go. Locally, Janis Yerrington is showing her folk work at the Bolinas Gallery, and yesterday, Mary Siedman and Danny Vitali, opened an excellent show at the 24 Hour Farmstand. After Sunday soccer, sitting in the warm afternoon sunshine with color all around, was a delight. Speaking of soccer, the Mesa Park soccer fieldwork is going well with its beautiful new green coming up. Thanks to the park Board for all the decades of work to get this finally happening. jp

A Music Video and a Book - Both are Wonderful

HarvestPlus is an organization that works to introduce new varieties of healthy foods to developing countries, using traditional plant breeding methods. The micronutrients most often missing in poor people's diets in Asia, Africa and Latin America are vitamin A, zinc and iron. Harvest plus has developed sweet potatoes and maize high in vitamin A, millet and rice high in zinc, and beans high in iron. They use a variety of methods to interest farmers to grow these crops, and to get people to eat them. Often, it is not easy to change planting and eating habits - we can see that in our own culture. In Rwanda, many children and pregnant women are deficient in iron. HarvestPlus has helped to develop a musical video explaining the virtues of new beans high in iron. Like most music from Africa, it is rhythmic, tuneful and fun, combining R&B, rap and good melodies. The singers are great. You can watch it on line - <http://bit.ly/EatHealthyBeans>. I guarantee you will be singing along!

I read about a book in the NYTimes a few weeks ago, and found it at Point Reyes Books last week. It's by a Japanese 'tidying' expert named Marie Kondo: *the life changing magic of tidying up: the Japanese art of decluttering and organizing*. I'll quote from the back cover "With detailed guidance for determining which items in your house 'spark joy' (and which don't), this international bestseller featuring Tokyo's newest lifestyle phenomenon will help you clear your clutter and enjoy the unique magic of a tidy home - and the calm, motivated mindset it can inspire." I really like her ideas, especially what she writes about expressing gratitude for your possessions and your dwelling place, and paring down to what is essential. Her discussion of Japanese methods of folding clothes and storing things using shoe boxes helped me see decluttering in a new way. The book is short, funny and charming. I'm writing a short column this week, so I can get back to tidying.

If nothing is done, Terrace Avenue may need to be closed as a through road within the next few years, leaving only one route out of town from the Bolinas Mesa and other areas of town. A Working Group of representatives from the BCPUD and the Bolinas Fire Protection District ("BFPD") has been working for several years with the County of Marin to identify solutions to preserve this important section of road. Please come hear Supervisor Steve Kinsey and your local BCPUD and BFPD representatives present an overview of the problem, the potential solutions, and necessary next steps. We need your input and your participation in order to move forward; please come to this important meeting!
