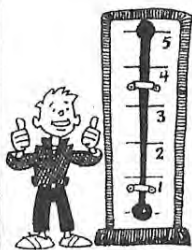

WHAT HAPPENED

MONDAY MORNING WEEK IN REVIEW
11/17/14 WRAP AND RECAP from Jenniepeiffer

It was a meeting, greeting, memorial, birthday, coming and going sort of week, and as always in our creative town, there was art and music. Plus, it was the opening of the November crab grab. Last night I counted 50 boat lights on the water as I stood on Poplar cliff at sunset. Friday night was the first crab dinner of the season at our house. That pretty much tops my list of eating delights. With that first bite of fresh caught crab dipped in melted butter, all the memories of childhood days of catching, cracking, cleaning, crab at family food fests come flooding back. It was an excellent Friday night fortification for the marathon of events scheduled in town Saturday.

Saturday was such a packed day I was feeling the need for a personal event trainer. It started Saturday morning at 10:00 with a Town Meeting at the Firehouse. There were more than 100 people there to hear about the options for the repair of Terrace Ave at Surfers' Overlook. Our champion County Supervisor and Coastal Commission president, Steve Kinsey, was there to inform, as was Jennifer Blackman, general manager of the Bolinas Community Public Utility District, and Fire Chief Anita Terrell Brown, flanked by a variety of individuals with engineering and coastal expertise. In case you haven't been paying attention, Terrace is being undercut by the ocean's erosion of the cliff underneath. To do the complete reconstruction of the cliff to shore up the road and make it beautiful and graffiti ready, would cost us ("us" being a combined effort of public/private fundraisers) \$6million. As I understand it, this would include an initial \$500,000 project to rebuild the road at the top because reconstruction work would have to be attacked from both the top and the bottom. The options set out at the meeting were: 1) Do just the road rebuild, a temporary fix for \$500,000; 2) Do the complete \$6mil, more lasting reconstruction (maybe 70 years?); 3) Do nothing, which is not really doing "nothing" because it will continue to rapidly decline which means some things will have to be done as a result, such as an expensive sewage pipe relocation (probably as costly as the road fix), and a road/ cliff collapse that I imagine would be the start of what Ocean Parkway looks like. There was enthusiasm at the meeting to get going on the first phase of the complete project and see what funds could be put in place for the completion. Kinsey explained that the County contribution is limited because they put such an enormous amount of money into Terrace at Overlook, so the money isn't there for us for this fix. He also mentioned the Coastal Commission is becoming more interested in moving roadways back from ocean erosion, due to global warming ocean storm surge onslaught, so they are approving fewer rebuild projects.

I left the meeting reeling from sticker shock on how much it costs for all the various town infrastructure projects that need to be done, so I was happy to join a non controversial ceremonial circle of support for the eminent arrival of new baby Biddle. This took me right up to the time for the Bolinas Museum opening celebration of the Bolinas Hearsay News exhibit of 40 years of our local paper, started 40 years ago by a group of local citizens led by Michael Rafferty. This exhibit is in the History Room of the museum

and is well worth taking some time to peruse. All the archives of Hearsay issues are there to look at, which is such an amazing overview of all the past 4 decades of happenings in our town.

Then, it was on to the Bolinas Community Center for a memorial gathering to hear stories of the life of David Franklin, who died this past summer. I remember him most as the big haired, brilliant radio aficionado, who walked everywhere in shorts, no matter the weather. Food was shared and the circle was formed as we got to know more of the life of this interesting personality, who spent most of his friendly life in this town. The lead off reminiscence was by master storyteller, Neshama Franklin, David's mother, giving us the background on David's childhood in an amusing and heartfelt way. There are stories in the Hearsay archives at the Museum about his radio antennae project along Overlook, and probably others to be found as well. I miss his intense, creative energy. Love to his family.

The end of the day, Saturday, took Ned and me into S.F. to the Tonga Room at the Fairmont, to a family birthday party with lots of eating and dancing, to celebrate Happy 45 to Lincoln Smith.

Tragically, at that same time, we lost Michael Guilkey, who died Saturday night. We know that every arrival means a departure, but saying goodbye to such an upbeat, fine friend is harsh. Our loving condolences go to Carol and Lucas. RIP Michael. jp

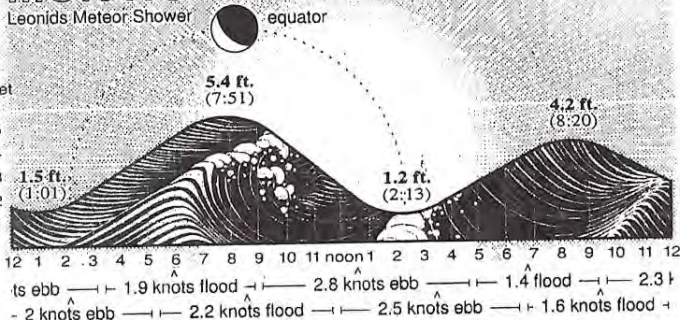

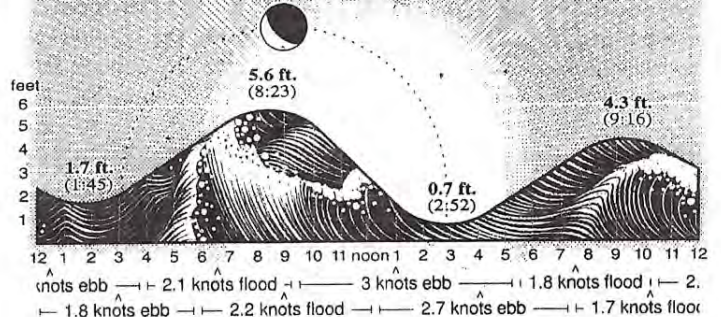

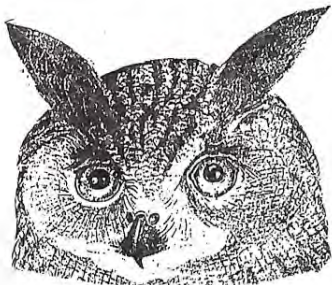
