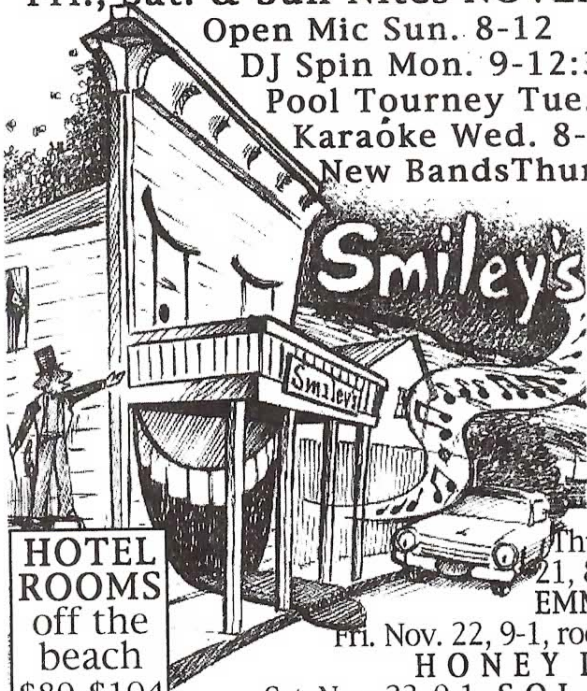

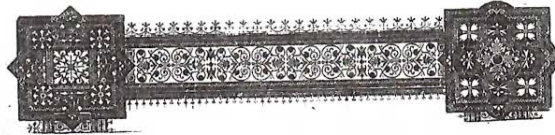
I am pleased to announce the opening of 11 Wharf Road

This has been a fascinating and challenging project for the last year and a half, re-imagining and rehabilitating this old farmhouse and inn built in 1890 (formerly the Blue Heron Inn). It has been a rewarding adventure, restoring its wonderful history and building a new place for hospitality and celebration. The art gallery will begin with a three-day open house Thanksgiving weekend (Friday, Nov 29th - Sunday, Dec 1st - 10AM - 6 PM) coinciding with the West Marin Open Studios.

This first show features hand-blown glass by David Lewin (my best friend from junior high school, and College of Marin graduate), and large format drawings by Rachel Higgins, long-time Marin resident, and my mother (1923-2005). We have two newly-refurbished rooms available for overnight lodging--each with new beds and large bathrooms with clawfoot tubs.

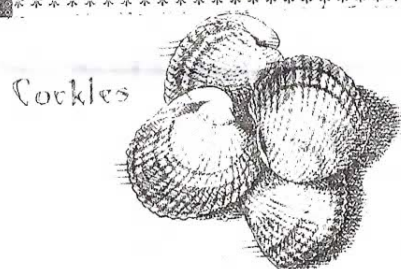
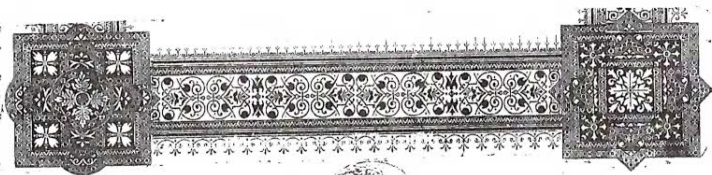
ART RAFFLE TO BENEFIT
