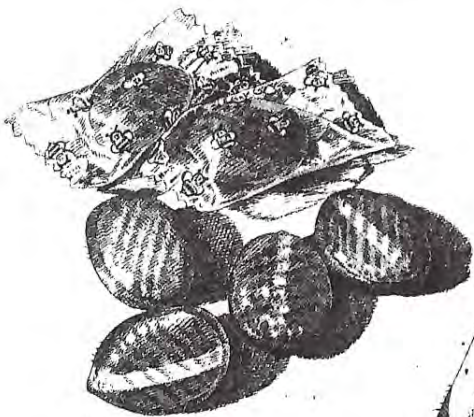

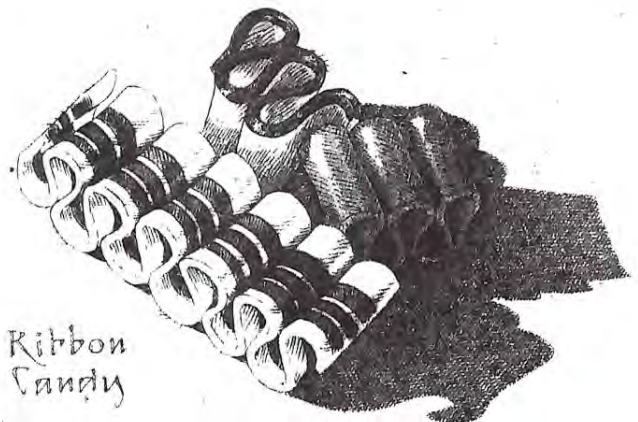

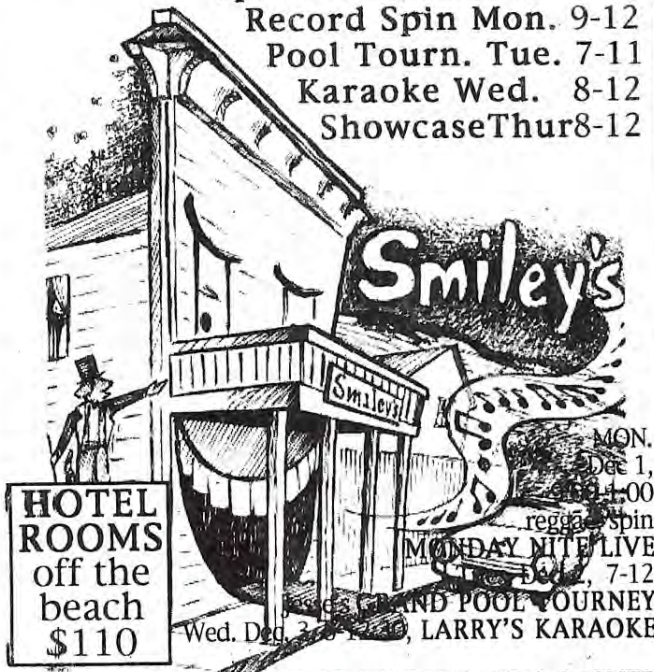

MAPPING A NEW GEOGRAPHY OF HOPE

Juried Group Art Show Open to West Marin Artists

Point Reyes Station CA—Point Reyes Books, the Black Mountain Circle, and the Geography of Hope Conference announce a Call For Submissions to West Marin artists for artwork for consideration in a juried group exhibition. The application deadline has been extended to December 31. West Marin includes the coastal area from Muir Beach in the south to Dillon Beach in the north, and the contiguous ranch lands as well as the villages of Stinson Beach, Bolinas, Olema, Inverness, Point Reyes Station, Marshall, Nicasio, and Tomales. The artwork must relate to the 2015 Geography of Hope Conference theme: "Mapping a New Geography of Hope: Women and the Land." Art selected for the exhibition will be on display throughout the month of March, 2015, at **Toby's Gallery** in Point Reyes Station. Art may include, but is not limited to: artist books; ceramics; drawing; installation; mixed media; multimedia; painting; photography; printmaking; sculpture; video; and woodwork. Both established and emerging artists are encouraged to apply.

"In times of great change and upheaval," says Art Show Curator **Tracy Taylor Grubbs**, "artists have created new forms that explore the relationship between nature and society. From artists working directly in nature during the industrial revolution to land artists working outside the gallery system in the 20th century to more recent "eco-vention" artists seeking to resolve ecological situations by rethinking problematic conditions, art continues to reflect our changing relationship to nature. As we move deeper into the 21st century what could the new geography of hope look like and how might the radical and inclusionary values of feminism influence this new vision? Whether made by men or women, we are looking for artwork that brings the ideas and perspectives of women into a new view of land and nature."
