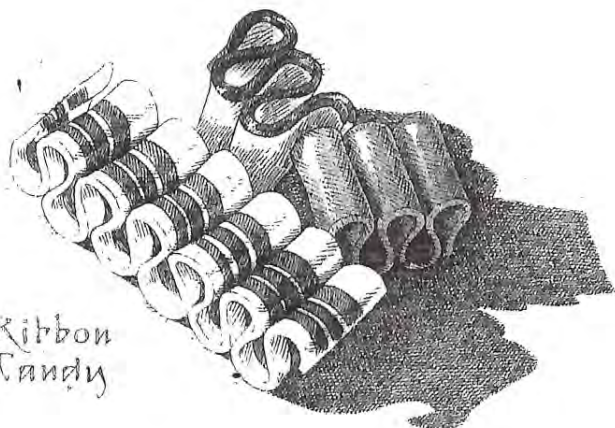

West Marin Senior Services seeks southern volunteers

Marin County is quietly playing host to the state's fastest growing aging adult population, and nonprofit organizations like West Marin Senior Services are calling for more volunteers to help fill the gaps in elder care.

According to the 2010 census, 27 percent of Marin's population is over the age of 60, and several studies estimate this number will rise to over 33 percent by 2030. West Marin Senior Services faces the challenge of caring for a greater number of seniors, and doing so over a much wider and more remote area than the rest of the county—what the nonprofit's staff are calling "a rural curtain."

"It's like the old Cold War Iron Curtain of Soviet Russia," said Skip Schwartz, the nonprofit's executive director, "except for us it means being out here in the country.

Part of our mission is to help people live safely and with dignity for as long as they can at home, if that's what they want to do. And that's more challenging in a rural area than an urban area."

The agency oversees 300 clients who need specialized care under the supervision of case managers, runs meals-on-wheels and shuttle shopping services for hundreds more and operates Stockstill House, an assisted-living facility in Point Reyes Station. It does not have enough staff to visit all of its clients, many of whom are spread out over long distances.

Instead, the group depends on volunteers—and it's currently in a desperate search for more.

"Volunteers multiply our paid staff tenfold," Mr. Schwartz said. "Imagine if we had to have paid staff to drive our clients everywhere. That would be impossible."

Park Wavelengths

The new moon and the winter solstice come December 21, when the sun is at the lowest point in the sky and we experience the shortest day of the year. The dark sky offers glimpses of the Ursid meteor showers - only 5-10 per hour for a little extra glitter in holiday skies.

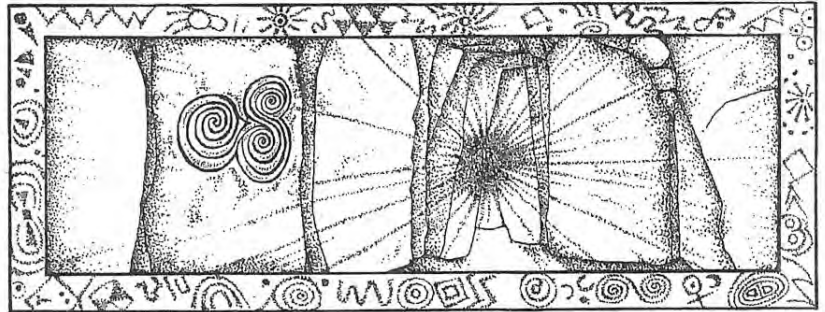
Northern elephant seals are returning to Park beaches around the headlands and the first pup has been born in the main colony. Typically, the height of activity is February in the north Drake's colony, which may be seen from Chimney Rock. Over the past weekend, a dozen gray whales made their way past the lighthouse, heading towards the warmth of southern waters.

Park Visitor Centers are closed on Thursday, December 25. Rangers are on duty, and trails and roads are open.

Many trails are blocked to horses due to downed trees: Horse/Mt. Wittenberg/Olema Valley/Stewart Hikers are able to pick their way through/around but watch for poison oak and use caution. Trails are being cleared between rain showers. Be sure to check the Park website and visitor centers for date information. Conditions can change rapidly.



MUIR BEACH: Thursday's rains washed away soil beneath a portion of road on Highway 1 between Panoramic Highway and Muir Woods Road, causing the roadway to crumble. Caltrans estimates that the affected stretch will be closed until March.



Winter Solstice is the time when light is born out of the womb of winter's darkness. Every year, on or around December 21, the sun appears to stand still, or rise and set in the same place for a few days. It is the time of the longest night, when Earth's very breath seems to falter in the face of the overpowering dark. Then, imperceptibly at first, the sun begins its long journey toward the south, and all of creation begins to exhale.

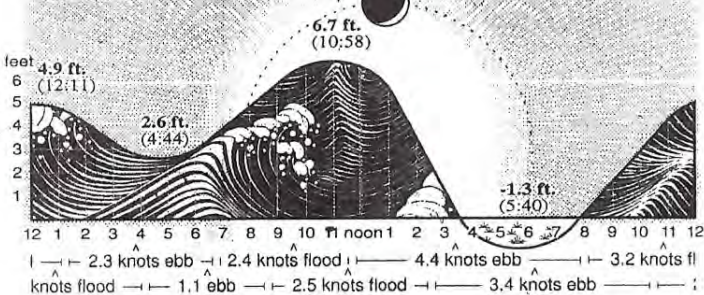

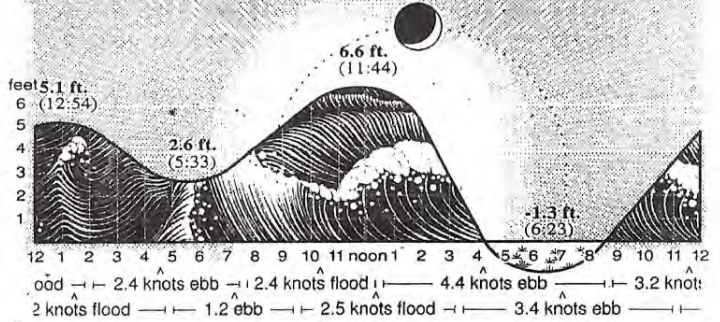

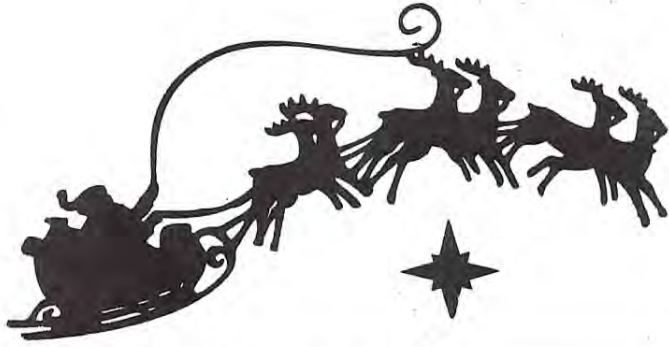

She commemorates the old year and the potential of the new.
