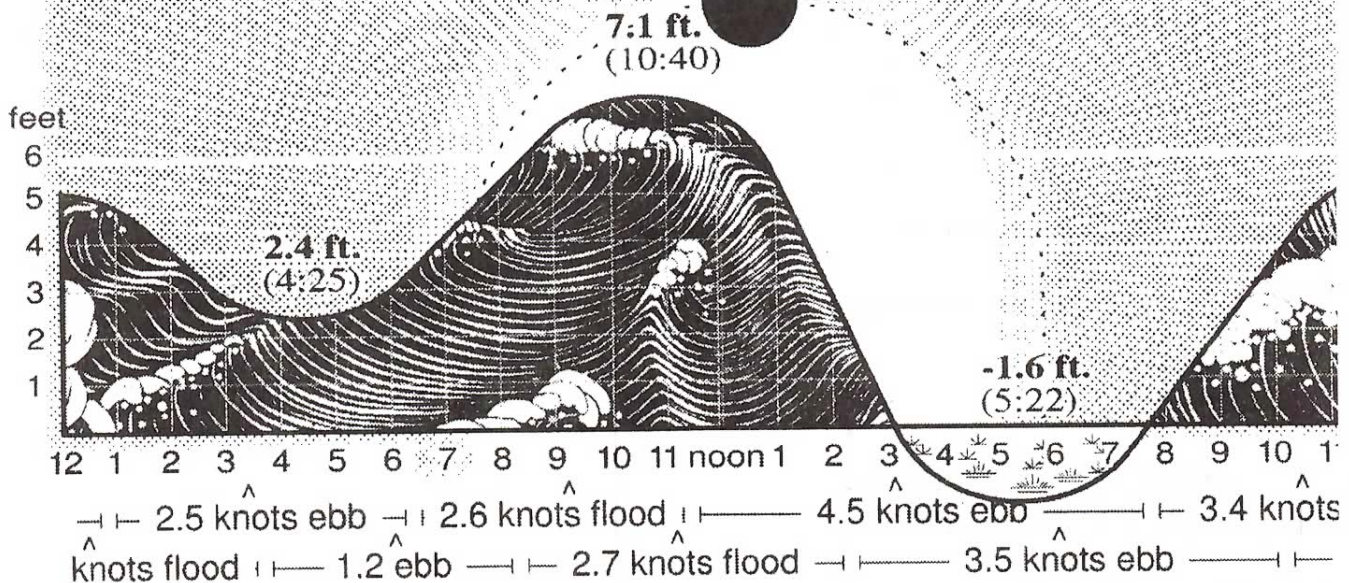

LITTLE MESA HAZARDOUS ROAD CONDITION

Ron and I were driving down Cliff Rd on Sunday, enjoying the ocean view near the end of the road when we were obliged to slow way down so pedestrians could walk in the road. After a while when they moved over a bit and controlled the dog. We wanted to make the right-hand turn at the bottom of the hill by the turquoise house belonging to owner Gary Rosenblatt. At that time there was a Volvo illegally parked across from the driveway and there were people in the street so we cut hard to the right and fell into a pit that is at the end of the retaining wall of Mr. Rosenblatt's driveway. In fact, the whole driveway drops off quite a bit. It is a car crunching drop-off and that is what happened to our car door and the body under it. Very nasty thing.

The present renter(s) said that this happens frequently – people falling right into that hole and she has placed a cone there at times that inevitably gets blasted away – not to be surprised.

If you don't know this, Cliff Rd. and the whole road on the Little Mesa is privately owned by the homeowners. Hence parking violations are not enforced by county as they say they have no authority; road conditions are not monitored by county and repairs are up to the association. So the question arises, who is responsible for this hole at the end of the road? The homeowner does not live there, he may not be aware of the problem, he certainly does not hear the scrape of the cars as they crunch out. The renters either have not informed him or are reluctant to do so and the Home Owners Association has obviously not addressed this hazard as it has been there for months and months. I occasionally fall into it when I come down the road especially if they are still installing the King's Highway at the newly-purchased house by the cliff and equipment and workers are in the road.

This reminds me of the parking dilemma in town – people parking illegally, parking too long in timed zones, parking dangerously in narrow streets, not heeding parking signs. It seems there is not authority available or willing to monitor and ticket in Bolinas. I know that in Ross, over the hill, all trailhead access was designated a no-parking zone to eliminate the invasion of the Lycra People and to keep them from taking over the town.

What can we do here? What is happening with the parking committee? What authority does Bolinas have to enforce any rules or regulations it may want to establish? Why aren't we earning revenue from marked parking places down by tennis courts to help haul away the garbage and clean up after the hundreds of people that use the beach? And who would be in charge? Finally, what about the hole in Gary Rosenblatt's driveway at the end of Cliff Rd?
