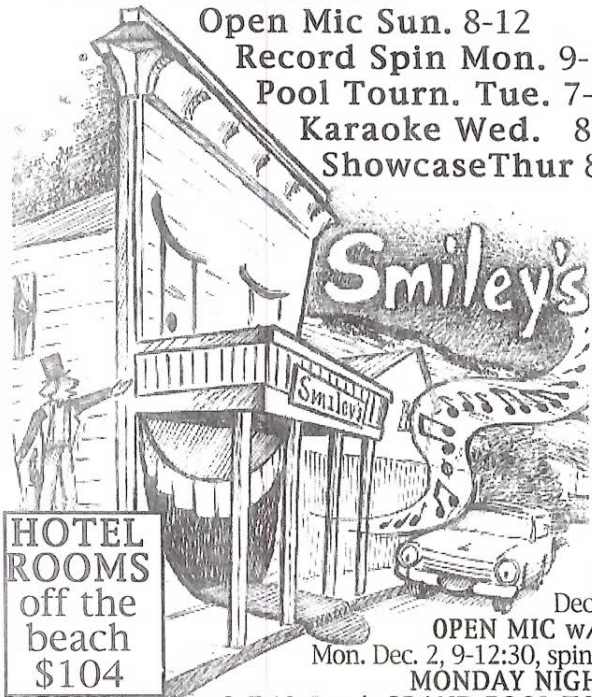

TAKE ACTION - LAST DAY
Comments on The Farallones
Eradication Plan as put forward by
Fish and Wildlife for managing the
mouse problem.

I have read the DEIS and I am not reassured. The risk is high and the collateral damage is unknown no matter what the studies say. The weather and the ocean cannot be controlled.

1. The proposed plans are aerial dropping **1.3 metric tons of rodenticides** on these rocky islands during the rainy season. Not only would this plan have adverse effects on non-target species some of this poison will be washed into the ocean to be consumed by the food chain.
We're part of that chain.

2. Rodenticides such as Brodifacoum-25D and Diphacinone-50 are extremely toxic to all birds, mammals and aquatic life.

3. What about the "Marine Protected Area" with a declining fish population? What about a productive marine food web?
*"This plan would undermine the protections for a Marine Sanctuary."
 (Richard Charter NOAA Advisory Council)*

4. I'm told by a Wildlife Refuge Specialist, Jonathan Shore, that the toxic chemicals in the dissolving pellets drop to the ocean floor. This is where the bottom creatures dwell like halibut and crabs. We eat these creatures.

5. The ocean is a vastly moving thing - the poisoned fish and crabs would wash up on our coastline to be eaten by vultures, gulls, crows, ravens and others.

6. *"The USFWS has not demonstrated a compelling need to do this project at this time and with this rodenticide. The asny storm petrel is not endangered (though it is a California Species of Special Concern) since populations occur all along the California coast.*

Supporting that conclusion is the fact that the Endangered Species Division of the USFWS has declined to list it.

Eliminating non-target effects is particularly important considering that Hawk Hill is 25 miles away and will be teeming with raptors, vultures and owls at the time of the proposed eradication in November.

All these birds routinely cover large amounts of territory every day to find prey. Dead or moribund mice and gulls would be quickly detected and draw the birds in to collect the carcasses. *No hazing program could possibly prevent all the birds from eating the carcasses".* (Sonse Devries of Fish and Wildlife)

7. *According to Wildcare, rodenticides have been documented to persist in animal tissue for as long as 9-10 months.*

8. These are extremely harsh measures appropriate for an island that is so close to populated areas where there are fishing and crab industries.

9. *Wildcare's position is to choose a non-toxic alternatives or more research needs to be done to determine a safe way to rid the islands of invasive mice. I say yes to that.*

10. In light of the serious potential for harm posed by the use of these toxic products, we urge the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service *not* to proceed with the aerial broadcast of rodenticides on the South Farallon Islands, but rather to employ a responsible, non-toxic and environmentally sustainable approach to mouse eradication. (BCPUD Board)

11. It is appropriate to exercise the *precautionary principle*. Rodenticides are on the verge of being phased out and replaced by better solutions.

I support the non-action alternative for now.
