



DID YOU MISS THE FUNRAISER ?

The event Sunday evening was to raise money for Al Otro Lado, legal team working with The Caravanistas. What a lovely celebration of community !

Several presentations helped put the current Refugee crisis into a historical perspective.

The longer perspective was told by David Escobar, Indigenous man, former administrative aide to Supervisor Steve Kinsey and UN delegate for the Indigenous Permanent Forum. We learned about some of the migrations of ancient peoples who lived many generations on this continent before going south and whose descendants are seeking refuge from the ravages of war in their countries.

Looking at more recent history -'70s and 80's- Douglas Mundo, Executive Director of The Multi Cultural Center of Marin and native of El Salvador, told of how he and his people were caught between the violent struggles of so-called guerrilla fighters & heavily armed government troops whose weapons were supplied by the US .

After these very moving presentations Jenny Pfeiffer and Noah and Dinah Stroe showed pictures and told about their visits to shelters at the borders. They went down with the many donations and the money they had gathered.

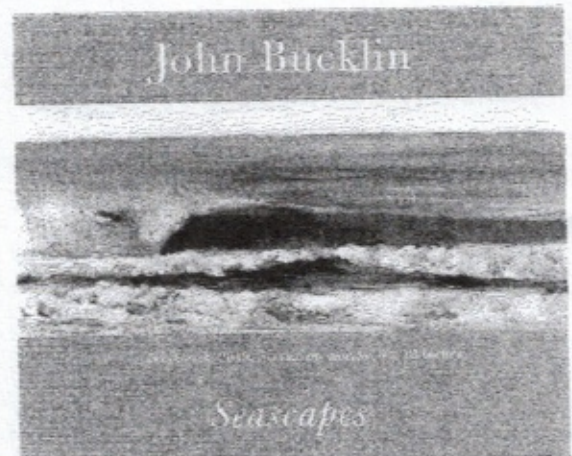

It was an enlightening night, with delicious food and moving music, and I am thankful for the people in our communities of West Marin, some who have come from other places and have chosen to be here, all of whom are adding to our lives in such a rich multicultural way. Thanks to Pam Dake for all the work she did to make this such a wonderful evening.

Also this weekend, there was an opening of art at the Bolinas Gallery with artists Margaret Trost, and Tiffany Nicole showing their impressions of THE GODDESS PORTAL - worth a look.

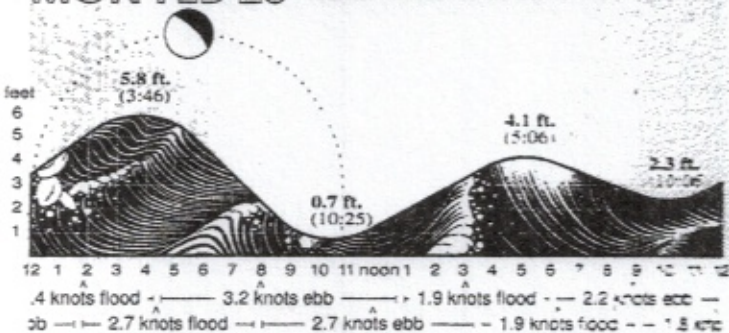

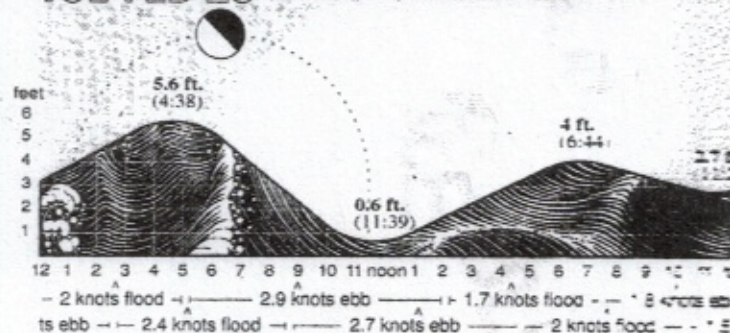
