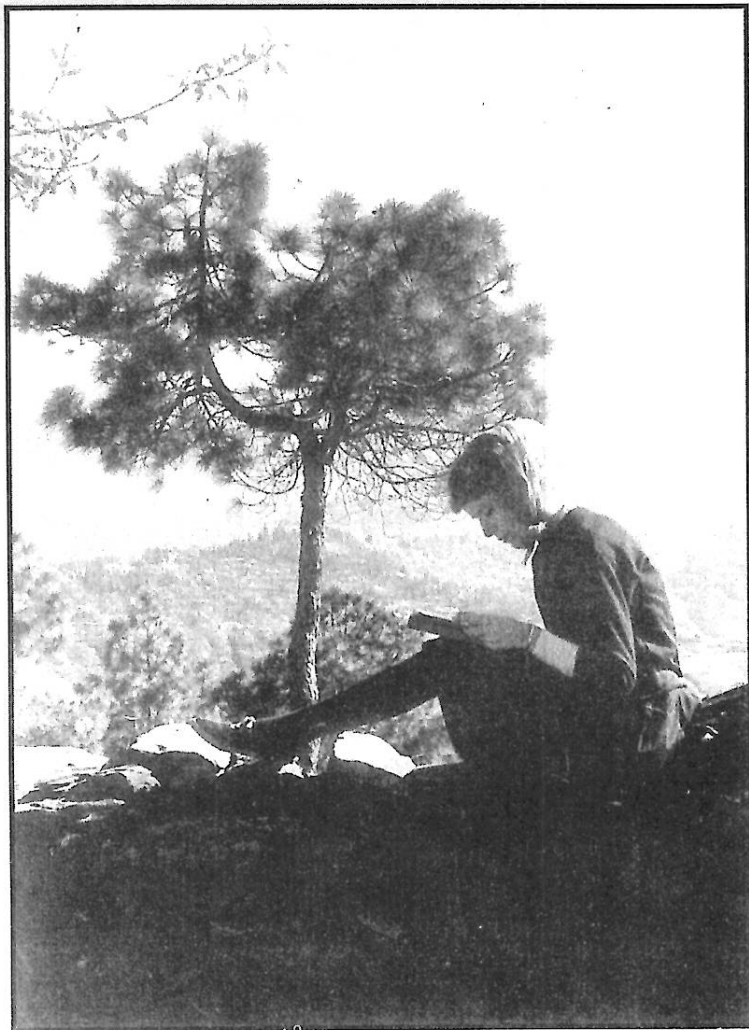



 Week in Review Recap from Jennie Pfeiffer

Joanne Kyger slipped away from this life on Wednesday – very sad news to hear. She was a long time friend and a person I held in great esteem for her intellect, sense of humor, and larger than life poetic presence out in the greater world. Though she wasn't a "visit everyday" sort of good friend, I loved knowing she was part of the fabric of this town, (and will continue to be so), and I'm finding I miss her profoundly. Her passing is more than a death, it's an extinguishing of a brilliant flame, a bright light that illuminated the old Bolinas. She was such a part of what made me grab on to this place when I first came here over three decades ago and I am clutched with a deep nostalgia for that place and time.

I miss the poetry nights, the political fights, the irony, the back-and-forth on Wharf nights, going from Smiley's to Scowley's, to the Shop (where any kid in town who wanted/needed to work could scoop up cones at the ice cream counter for an hour or two), down to the Gibson House where at some point in the evening there would be singing around the baby grand piano where locals could gather to join in spontaneously, whether they knew the words or not. I miss the midnight moonlight basketball games around the hoop outside Smiley's, and the BCPUD or School Board meetings that would adjourn down to town to the bar.

And everywhere there was poetry feeding the soul of the town; readings and wine – sometimes too much – leading to self-appointed critics shouting out their approval or disapproval, often rudely, and then Gary doing handstands in the back of the room, or the street, or wherever. I miss the hysterical hilarity of Hearsay News meetings, everyone speaking at once until it ended in peals of laughter; and Joanne's weekly Wednesday editing of the paper, always leaving space to breathe, in her Zen way, with calligraphy and her writing that made the mundane magically writ large and the major catastrophes brought down to everyday edible bites.

I miss Magda, another poetic soul who recently passed on, a large personality who kept it real in the neighborhood, waving a gun at across-the-street neighbor Fred Wade over some issue of parking etiquette, with Fred responding by telling her that if she was going to shoot him she better not miss, and then we would get together for a pot luck and laugh at the absurdity of it all.

A different sort of soul-tender was memorialized yesterday, Sharon Glasson, who was beautifully eulogized at Calvary Presbyterian Church – flowers arranged by a creative hand, words reminding us of her deeply felt religious beliefs that moved her to provide her Eucharist of chili for Soup Saturdays and free brunch Friday's, and her caring friendship for whoever needed it, friends from her childhood days in Bolinas to her departure March 19th.

So I miss these women who have recently left us, and though those days are now memories, it is comforting to see new energy stepping up to maintain community. Melinda Stone, working with Jennifer Gately brought us together Saturday night for a Bo BOP (Bring own plate) dinner at the Community Center to share polenta, lentil loaf, salad and stories about chairs, elevated to art by framing them with historical perspective.

Lost dollars, empty plates

How would you like to have a debit card, good for food purchases? Did you know CalFresh, a nutrition program that helps people buy healthy food, offers this assistance? A household of one person could receive between \$16 to \$194, based on net income and allowable expenses, yet only 18 percent of our state's eligible seniors participate in CalFresh.

You won't know if you qualify until you apply. Teresa Newman, an eligibility worker for the county, will provide more details and help you apply for the program during the West Marin Senior Services community lunch at noon on Thursday, March 30.

The mission of West Marin Senior Services is "to help seniors live safely and with dignity in our community." Our care managers work with seniors and their families to develop care plans for those at risk, to assure they have food, medication and emotional support to remain at home. Our home-delivered meal program and community lunch improve diet quality and nutrition, resulting in an increase in physical and emotional health.

We encourage all seniors over 60 with a net income of \$1,980 for one person, or \$2,670 for two, to complete a 10-minute application followed by a scheduled interview to determine if you qualify for assistance with food purchases. Certain housing expenses and out-of-pocket medical expenses may be deducted from your income to increase your monthly benefit.

According to a 2016 California Food Policy Advocates publication, "Lost Dollars, Empty Plates," one in three eligible CalFresh recipients are not taking advantage of the program. Over 15,000 individuals in Marin could receive benefits.

but Kelley took her and three foals later gave her to me.
I took her for Buttercup's companion, but she became my happiness.
I shall never, ever forget what pleasure we had together, as she carried me lightly, delicately, delightedly over the trails and beaches around Bolinas. So spirited a being that she simply cantered in

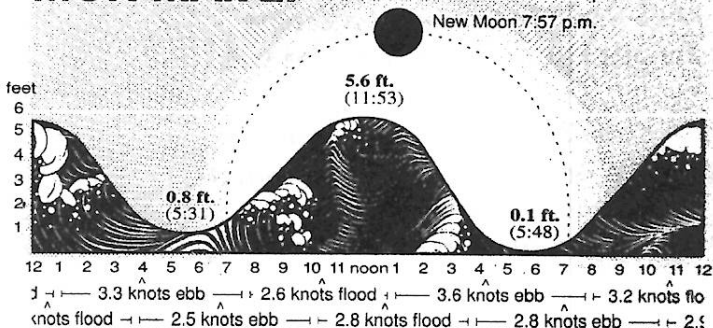
place when held back by horses in front of her.. To see her run and dance filled the heart with joy.
One day she figured out how to open the door to the feed shed, bumping it with her little Arab nose catching it on the bounce, flexing her head to the side to open the door wide enough to get in to eat the alfalfa. (Then Buttercup would follow, pry off the feed can lid, pull the bag out of the can and and put his nose in. it)
She tolerated Buttercup, but trusted people all the way.
Twelve years she was with me, giving her more than thirty years of life.
At last, when she was dying, she came to my door and laid down and died. I found her there in the early morning and put a blanket over her, but she was gone.
No one but me to remember this unique, perfect little horse, so beautiful, sensitive, responsive a being
But I will mourn her, now and forever!

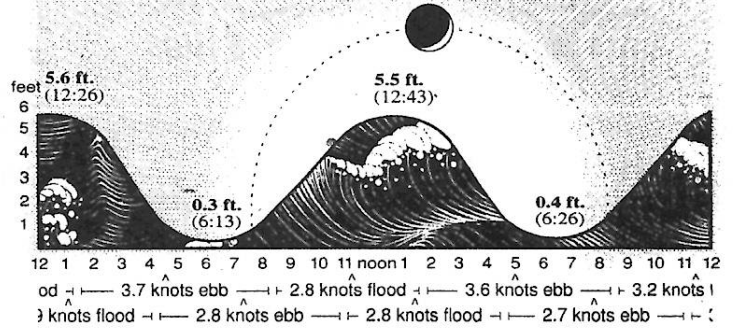

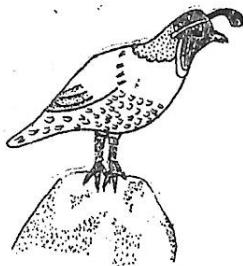
