Last Friday the Marin County Board of Supervisors brought in edutainer Iain De Jong to present a workshop entitled Housing as the Answer to Homelessness . It seems so easy when you put it that way, right?

Bolinas has been in an affordable housing crisis for several decades now and it's not exactly that houses are available; the Mesa is filled with unoccupied houses, vacation homes and investment real estate. Empty lots where houses just magically fell down. The problem is and I really hope that this is changing. In fact I'm going to believe that it is changing due to the large turnout at the Real Community Rentals Workshop in Bolinas. I am going to believe that there are homeowners who want our community to stay a community. So what does that look like? Homeowners who would like to take Section 8 vouchers are encouraged to contact Carmen Hall Soruco, Homeownership Programs Manager at the Marin Housing Authority. Her phone number is 415-491-2532 and her email address is csoruco@marinhousing.org

De Jong asserted that these service organizations need to care for the most vulnerable populations first and that's not something that Marin has traditionally been great at doing as a whole but Bolinas knows how to take care of its own. I would like to start a nonprofit out here called The Fragile Flower Foundation about growing strength from adversity. One of our duties would be to help our most vulnerable populations find and keep housing here. It's kind of difficult for me to write this because at the moment I am among that most vulnerable population and a lot of what De Jong said on Friday really resonated with me particularly when he talked about fight, flight, or freeze and about how vulnerable populations always seem to need the most help and then more help after that. I have to admit that I resemble that remark but I do have a stability action plan if anybody's interested in sponsoring that. The way that I see it is that our most vulnerable populations, our most traumatized populations have holes in their life like a sieve and then when we Endeavor to offer stability and compassion these holes can and start being plugged up, these vulnerable populations can start becoming whole.

Iain De Jong told the service organizations that showed up on Friday that they need to be trauma informed and operate from a place of equality and compassion. It was sage advice and I look forward to seeing how it gets implemented over the hill. I, however, am fully trauma informed and look forward to putting my skills to use. So my beautiful brave Bolinas peeps, I leave you with a question De Jong asked early on in the day on Friday.

How do we get people to invest in change and spend on impact?
