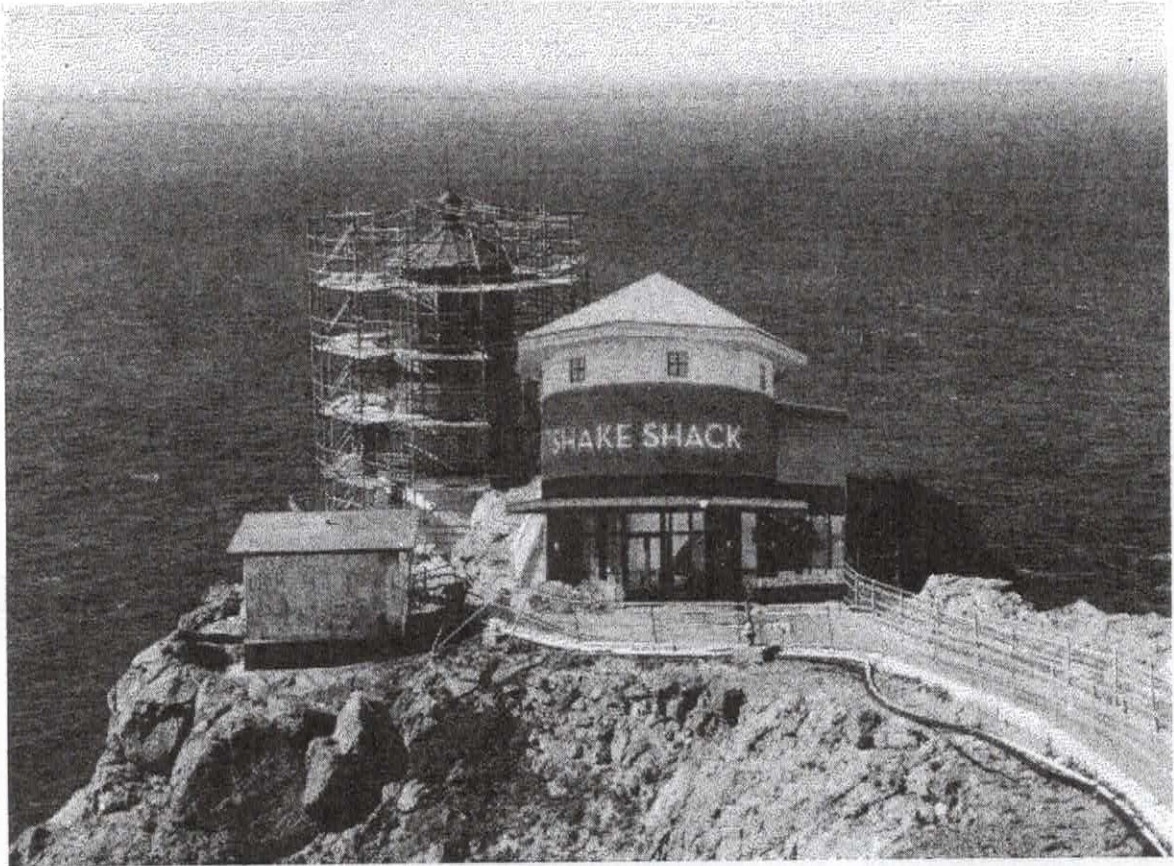

The Point Reyes National Seashore announced this weekend that the new Point Reyes lighthouse restoration will include a Shake Shack restaurant. In an effort to expand revenue streams for the park and provide more food options for visitors, the park cut a deal with the extremely popular fast food company after months of negotiations. The location will be down at the point right next to the lighthouse and will become the crown jewel of the Shake Shack westward expansion.

"We couldn't be more pleased," announced a park spokesperson, "the lighthouse is the most visited spot in the park and now we've teamed up with one of the most popular food establishments in the country. Imagine how incredible it will be to hike down the stairs to our newly renovated lighthouse and be able to enjoy an amazing chocolate shake and a tasty hamburger with one of the greatest views in the world."

The menu at the Shake Shack will be very similar to other locations around the country, including the newly opened location in Larkspur. Because of the uniqueness of this location, there will however be daily specials suited to the region like deep fried oysters, organic elephant seal shakes and free range elk burgers, all locally sourced. "We're still working out the details," the park spokesperson said, "but once we get it all sorted, it will be a big win win for everyone." Access from parking lot to the observation deck and the Shake Shack will be ready by late May/early June.

The BCLT is pleased to announce that the gas station is up and running; new pumps have been installed and they are beautiful! Because the ground water is still high from this year's wet winter, we will have to wait until summer for the finishing adjustments, but we are open and ready for business.

We greatly appreciate your patience and encouragement during these last two years of trouble shooting, repairs and upgrades.

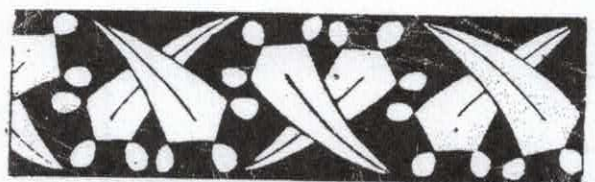
The BCLT wishes to thank the Rural Community Assistance Corporation for the \$200,000 loan that allowed this work to be done. We would also like to thank you, our community, for your patronage and support. We believe having gas in Bolinas is an important asset and we are happy to continue to provide this essential service for our community.

Although we know our gas prices are higher than rates "over the hill", our costs for operation and upkeep are also much higher. Being in a relatively isolated rural area our service and delivery costs are higher and our volume of sales are much lower than other gas stations. Therefore, in order to break even our margins must be set higher than businesses with easier access that sell much larger volumes. Our prices reflect the cost of keeping this business going in Bolinas and include a small surcharge to build up our reserve funds for repairs and upkeep. You can be assured that the additional money you are paying for gas goes first to cover costs, then for reserves and that anything left over goes directly towards maintaining our affordable homes. When you buy gas with the BCLT you spend a little more, but your money isn't going directly to a large corporation like BP, it goes back into your community to make gas available, and keep affordable housing a reality.

We try, and will continue to try, to make our prices as reasonable as possible. Ultimately however, the more gas we sell, the lower we will be able to make our prices. Please continue your patronage and know that every gallon of gas you buy from us helps ensure that gas is available when and if you need it.
