Nature Notebook By Loretta Farley

The new moon of June 3 begins the cycle of extra-low summer tides, though it can feel difficult to figure out which season we are in as rainstorms wash across West Marin. The low tides will come just after sunrise each morning. Thursday, June 6 will see the lowest, at -1.3 at 8 a.m., and the next extra-lows will arrive around July 4.

Levee Road telephone poles have been a handy perch for turkey vultures to spread out their wings to dry; they typically roost in a group overnight and dry out in the mornings. Grasses are already turning to summer colors, especially the "rattlesnake" or "quaking" grass along Bear Valley Road. This Mediterranean grass has seed-bearing, golden-brown spikelets reminiscent of a rattlesnake tail.

The California Coastal Commission is displaying award-winning poetry and artwork at the Bear Valley Visitor Center. Students from around the state write poems and create art in response to the ocean and the lives within it. The exhibit runs through June. The national seashore will mark Memorial Day on Monday, May 27 with the annual ceremony at the Historic Life-Saving Station Cemetery at 1:30 p.m. The ceremony honors the Life-Saving service and Coast Guard members who lost their lives. The Bear Valley Visitor Center will be open across the holiday weekend, though the lighthouse area remains closed as the restoration project continues.

I hope to see you down at the Plaza today for munchies and music and good times.

A quick rundown of the week includes Monday's Resource Recovery meeting with a report that folks are doing so well with their fire safety efforts at defensible space, that there has been so much material brought in to the Resource Recovery site that compost is over-abundant and the mounds of material must move on out, so it is all free for the taking.



Tuesday morning was a West Marin Kindergarten Readiness meeting in Point Reyes, where all the groups and individuals working with our tiniest citizens, that would be those in their first 5 years, get together to see what systems are in place for care of children and support for parents. We seem to be doing well for 3-5 year olds, but more needs to be in place for the 0-3year olds. There is an excellent group of dedicated, committed caregivers working toward this goal, and they need to be receiving a living wage, and the availability of housing so we don't lose them. This is important work.

By Friday, arrangements were in place for the annual Bolinas-Stinson School Student Art Show, another extraordinary showing of the work of our talented and prolific producers of creative works of art. It was fabulous, with food produced on site, including pizzas made in the beautiful pizza oven, all so generously constructed by volunteer staff and parents. Thanks to all for the efforts and the enthusiasm. Special thanks to Nuria Lee, Kathy Bustamante, Janis Yerington, and Ron Brown, art studio lab instructors, for nurturing the native creative talents that all our students bring with them into this life.

It is now time to get down to town and serve up some comestibles and listen to music of the many bands we are fortunate to have in this town. May the Memorial manifest in a marvelous manner. JP
