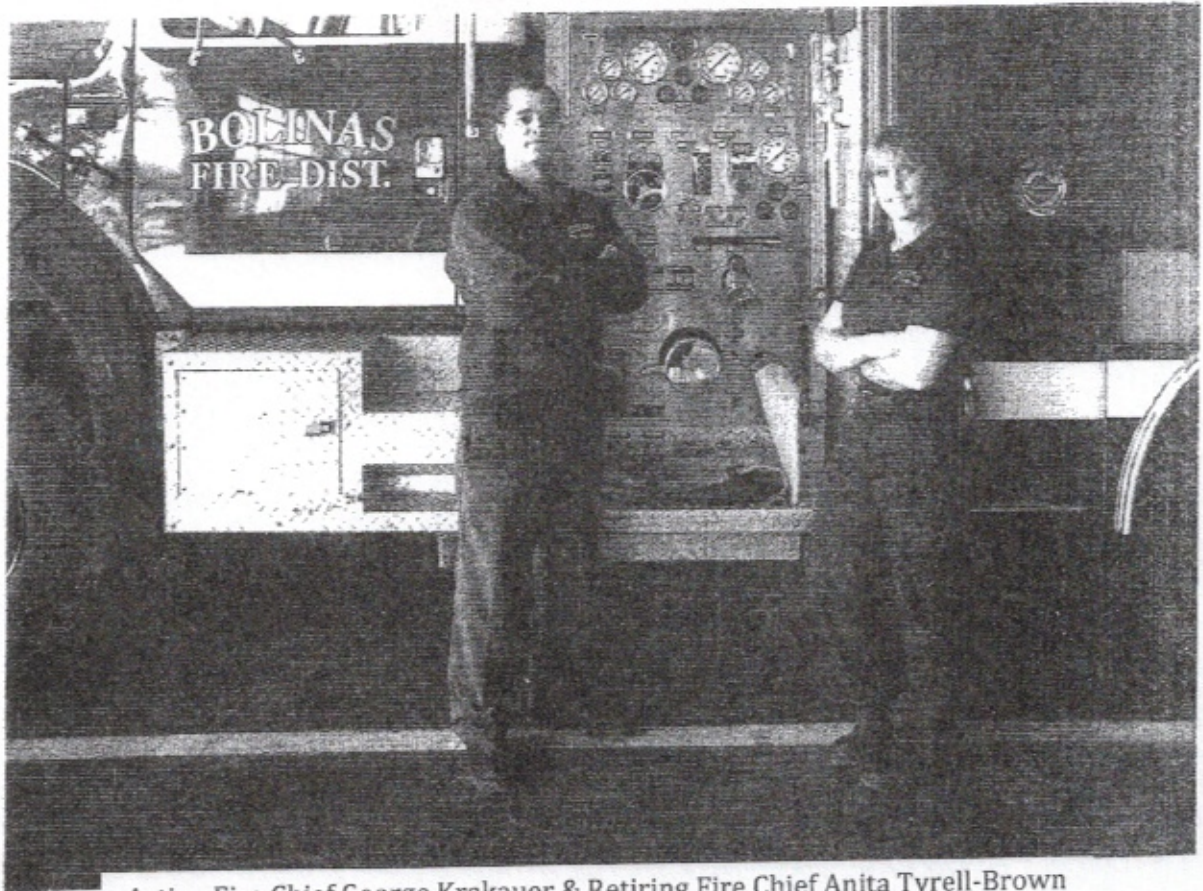

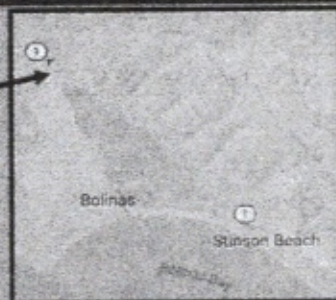

Like Santa, so that's got to be fun*

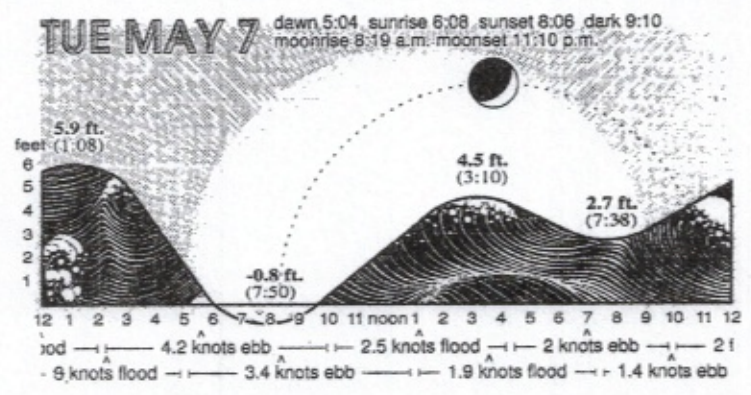
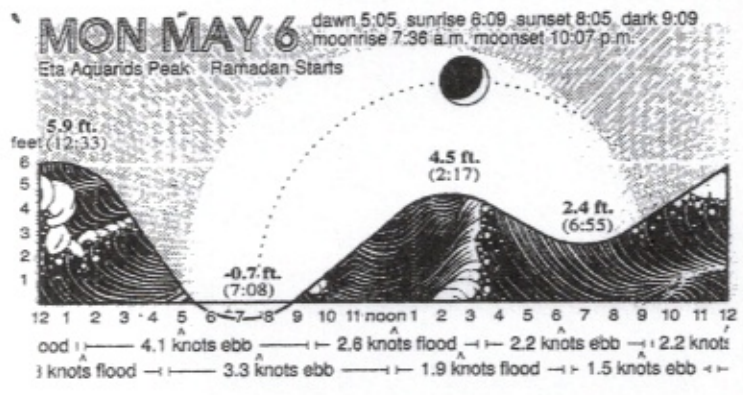
*Here, let me give you a hug Gavin, spread

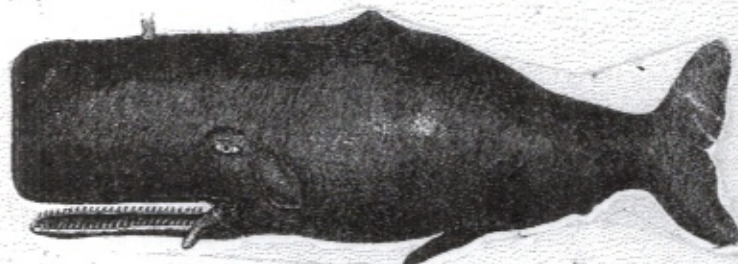
