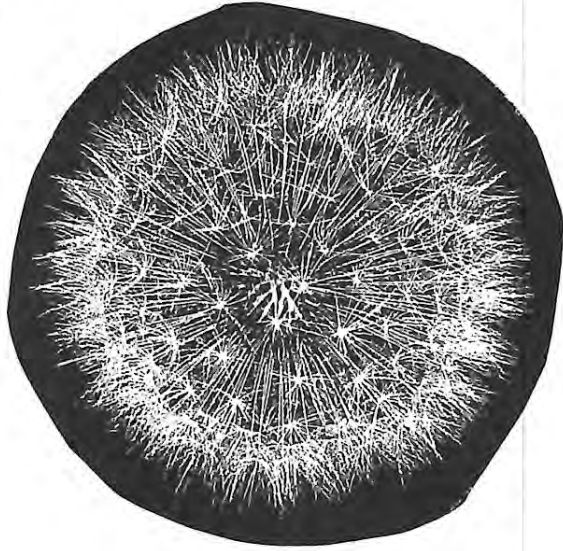

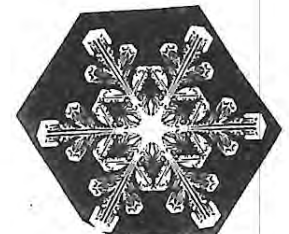

WANT TO KNOW ABOUT (OUR) WATER?

The Bolinas Community Public Utility District (BCPUD) was formed by the Marin County Board of Supervisors in 1967. At that time, the two previous water districts were merged, one which had served the Big Mesa and one which had served the downtown and Little Mesa.

In 1027, a 300 acre former dairy on the Big Mesa was subdivided into a grid of streets with 5,336 lots measuring 20'x 100'. As most know, many of these lots were sold for \$69.50 with a subscription to the Chronicle.

Lucky for us, the visionaries who managed to take the reins of the BCPUD after the oil spill, realized that there was a limited supply of water available. In November 1971, they instituted a moratorium on new water permits, which halted the construction of new homes. In 1990, the BCPUD enacted a moratorium on new sewer connections, to address the limited capacity of the sewage collection system.

Living with finite resources – in particular Water - is not a new idea for those who live here. We are a community that has been grappling with what “sustainable” means for a long time. And, while the rest of California wobbles beneath the ramifications of drought, in Bolinas we can be proud to find ourselves confident in our ability and intention to continue to be respectful of our resources.
