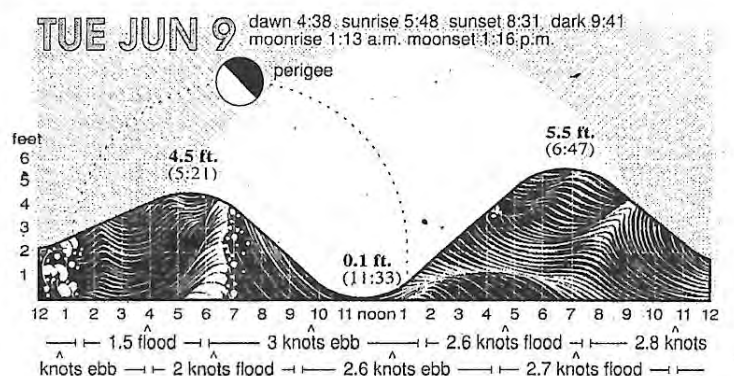
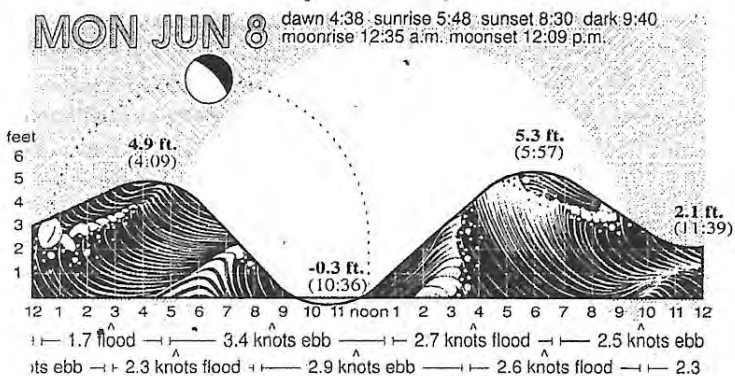

### Graffiti versus vandalism

As one of the world's oldest graffiti artists, and a huge fan of the form, I am compelled to weigh in on what has been happening in Bolinas.

There is and has to be a line, not a hard or fine one, but a definitive line between legitimate street art and outright vandalism. And I freely admit that when it comes to street art, "legitimacy" can be difficult to define, particularly when so much of it is produced without express permission.

Legitimate street artists, among whom I include myself, work where they are invited or permitted to work—the public or private surfaces of structures owned by themselves, other people or government agencies that really want art on their exterior walls, and vet the artist before they allow them to paint. On the opposite extreme are talentless assholes with cheap spray cans and nothing to say but "f\*\*k you and the community you live in." In between these are talented artists at risk of being arrested, who adorn the sides of freight cars, subways, tunnels, warehouses or other boring or ugly surfaces with creative, even beautiful, images and statements. Most of them improve our increasingly squalorous industrial and urban viewscape, albeit illegally.

There has been some truly fine street art produced in Bolinas over the years, welcomed and appreciated by almost everyone who observes it. But all art is subjective, and rarely loved or appreciated by everyone. However, the random "bombing" of angry and relentless images and messages on cars and private property is not the way serious artists express themselves, or the way serious street artists want their work to be defended.

Ready for some civil discourse on graffiti? Count me in.
