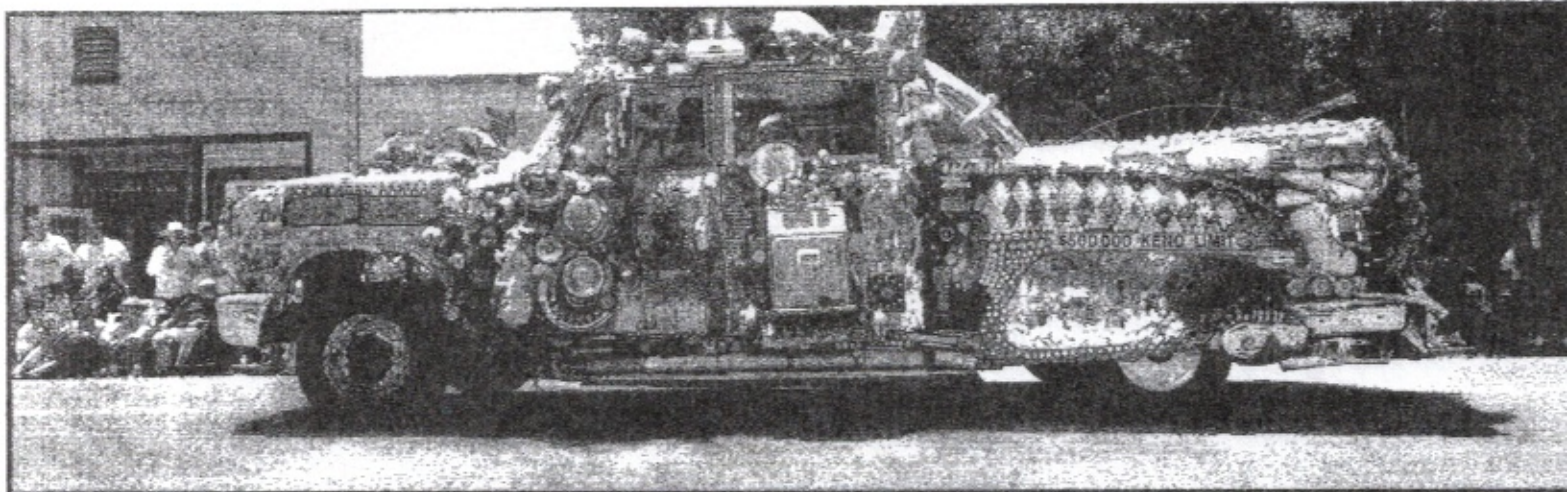

 Jennieffeffer's Monday Morning Recap

The week started with a holiday, always a great way to start a week, and Monday's Memorial Day Barbeque and picnic in the Plaza met and maybe even exceeded expectations for food, family fun, music and merriment. Many thanks to Kate, Katie, Randi, and the Bolinas Community Center Board, staff, and many volunteers for all the planning and preparations. Thanks also to the musicians who kept it lively all afternoon: BoBo Tempo; Estrella's Del Mar, Anny, Bob, Camilla, John & guests; and Los Padres wrapping it up in such fine form. I was serving up the salads for a big chunk of the day, so sorry if I missed some of the folks who kept the music flowing, but it all sounded super and made the party perfect.

There was more barbeque and partying on Thursday, with a Don Jolley Bone Voyage (the final Bone Appetit) party at the Bolinas Campus of the Bolinas-Stinson School, as students, alumni, families, staff and community members turned out to say farewell to Don, retiring after 31 years of teaching our middle school students. There was a large turnout gathered in the school garden, which has now become our place for cob oven pizza, campfire circles, and celebrations of all sorts. The evening ended with a group of students and alumni, dancing and swinging up a storm in homage and gratitude to their mentor and former teacher, Don Jolley. Thank you Don for all those years of giving our students what they needed to launch them into lifelong learning and creative ways of looking at the world.

Saturday morning I attended a meeting of the Stinson Beach Village Association, a first for me, where I got a different perspective of concerns, in this case regarding school matters, from the other side of the Lagoon. I learned a lot, and recommend it as a way of staying connected with community members from across the water, who share our Bolinas-Stinson Beach Union School District. I will do that more often.

There is a School Board meeting tomorrow night, Tuesday at 4:00 in the Library at the Bolinas Campus. I hope we hear from some Stinson Beach parents and community members, as well as those in Bolinas.
