

 Vote on the use of one of the Mesa Park sports field for Anita's retirement party on July 6, 2019.

 Discuss details regarding the waiver of the no alcohol consumption policy on Mesa Park grounds for the duration of the party.

- b. All beverage sales exclusively occurring on Fire Department property. Only beer & wine, will only be limited to Fire Dept property. Michael spoke to carrier, they are ok with it as long as Mesa Park isn't in the business of selling alcohol.
- c. Fire Department requests to have tent erected for the weekend (Friday – Monday). Tent can't be removed until Monday due to holiday weekend.
- d. Discuss Fire Department assurances to repair any damages to the field & what that includes.

Details of the event include: FD will use picnic benches, not chairs to protect the grass.

Other important notes: Mesa Park bathrooms will not be used, they will get 6 portable toilets and 2 handwashing stations.

David Kimball suggested that Michael Cavette & George Krakauer do an inspection beforehand, take pics, etc. and then after the event take pics of any damages. In the case of damages, the fire dept is willing to compensate for any damages. Pete suggested running sprinkler heads and putting little flags on all sprinkler heads to avoid potential damage.

The serving of food & alcohol will be limited to the parking lot. The tent will be used for people making speeches with the use of a podium & speakers with some music.

Pete explained that the back baseball field is not in good enough condition to have a party.

Discussed soccer game on Sunday. Tables will be removed by Sunday, the only thing that would still be there would be the tent. The tent is 40'x80'.

Mark asked about use of baseball field, but Fire Department Rep's explained that access is a concern. Mark is concerned about setting up a precedent for other people asking to do large parties on the ball fields, but that is at Board discretion.

Jack Siedman mentioned another time when a group set up on Mesa Park as a precedent. Its on a case by case basis.

Leilani makes a motion to have the Fire Department erect a tent on the west side of the soccer field on July 5 for the event on July 6.

Amber seconds, all in favor.






