

UPDATE on Jim Vest:

Jim will be coming home from the hospital on Friday, after a very intense 6-week stay at UCSF, in which he was diagnosed with metastatic melanoma (to spine, brain, bones, lungs, liver, spleen and pretty much every vital organ in his body). As of today, he cannot walk or perform everyday activities by himself, and is currently undergoing Whole Brain Radiation Therapy (WBRT) at Mount Zion on a daily basis -- for a total of 15 treatments ... He has had to undergo major surgery on his back (spinal fusion) because he had begun to lose the use of his legs -- in other words, he was becoming paralyzed. During surgery, the docs found -- and removed -- a massive malignant tumor that was wrapped around his T-8 vertebrae .. they also removed the T-8 vertebra itself and replaced it with titanium -- and fused together his T-7 and T-9. Since the surgery, he has not been able to walk but he is amazingly determined, so our hope is that with with time, physical therapy and a little luck, that could change in coming weeks ... He is set to begin an intensive chemotherapy regime once he is finished with the WBRT, and the docs believe this could "at least buy him a few months." We, of course. are hoping for much more than a few months, but at this point, we'll take whatever we can get.

Right now, we are just so happy and excited that Jim is finally coming home from the hospital ... We will need a lot of support going forward ... getting his home environment in order ... hospital bed, wheel chair, the works ... So, toward that end, we are in the process of organizing a "Living Room Project," in which we turn again to our dear friends and extended family in our community for support and assistance.

Our family has changed a lot since Jim became ill ... In so many ways, he was the center of our universe ... He has been not only the acting "head of our family," but our strength and our support -- physically, emotionally, financially. Jim had a way of making all of us feel very secure. Without Jim, I would probably not be here today ... Without Jim, I could never have made my newspaper (SolarTimes) a viable enterprise, nor could I have continued my political work or produced my radio program at PRN. In fact, as many of you already know, I am lucky to be alive myself, as I have been fighting (for 13 years) my own battle with with a hematological cancer (Non-Hodgkins Lymphoma) that is also considered "clinically incurable and terminal."

Over the years, Jim has saved my life (literally) many times, seeing me through two surgeries, countless setbacks, recurrences, chemotherapeutic regimes and comebacks ... He has been my caregiver, my "coach" and my best friend. He convinced me that I could beat the odds of this cancer -- and, as it turns out, I have. Thanks to Jim -- and perhaps miraculously -- I have already outlived my own rather grim prognosis, and I am currently feeling stronger than ever -- strong enough to do a complete role reversal, and to now assume the role of Jim's primary caregiver -- something I feel unbelievably fortunate and honored to be able to do ...

Jim is, and will always be, my soulmate.

And so, it is in this context that we -- Jim and I and our little family -- now take on our biggest challenge thus far ... Jim is fighting a cancer that is so vicious and voracious ... so devastatingly aggressive that it has already nearly consumed him ... Yet he remains optimistic and determined to fight it with all he has I him ... My hope is that whatever time remains for him ... for us together ... will be filled with love, friends, laughter -- and of course, music.

So many of our friends here in Bo have already done so much ... Cleaning our house, filling the jars placed at the local stores and businesses with money, cooking and delivering meals and even doing our laundry ... I promise to thank each and every one of you -- personally and publicly -- the second I come up for air ... Billy Cummins and other local friends/carpenters are building a wheel chair ramp, so we can move Jim in and out




of the house, and I am clearing out our entire living room, in order to accommodate a hospital bed and numerous other furnishings that will give him joy and comfort in whatever time remains. In a very literal sense, I'd like to transform our living room into a "Living Room," where Jim can surround himself with all of the beautiful things that give meaning to his life. His music -- and whatever facilitates him being able to play it -- are front and center in this effort.


Our current (and most pressing) needs are: Local (dry) storage space for a few of our things, along with some "helping hands" or people who can help move them. We will also need help now and then with labor-intensive jobs, such as helping to move Jim around and maybe some (minor) carpentry and perhaps a few other other home modifications that facilitate and make our day-to-day life a little easier. if people want to support Jim and/or the effort to make his life beautiful. please feel free to contact me either here on Facebook (via message or replying to this "comment") or you can email me at solartimeseditor@gmail.com. you can also reach me or leave a message on my cell, at 686-7759 and our home number is 868-1340.

I need to say yet again how moved and grateful our family is -- really beyond what words can express -- by the love and support that have consistently poured forth from our wonderful circle of friends and family here in Bolinas, and that we are now moving into a new phase with Jim's "health challenges."

We welcome all of you into our family of friends and loved ones ... we will need all the love and support our little community can offer, and we hope to get to know each of you much better in the coming weeks and months ...

WEEKLY WRAP & RECAP 7/15/13 From Jenniepfeiffer Riley

It's been difficult to get to the mundane business of local life, after hearing the "not guilty "verdict in the George Zimmerman trial for the murder in Florida last summer of Trayvon Martin, an unarmed teenager. Here's what I have read about young Trayvon. He was: an honor student with a 3.7 grade average; accepted into college with a full scholarship; a volunteer of over 600 service hours; a devoted member of his church; a loyal friend and loving son; walking home after doing nothing more than returning to his parents house on a drippy night with his hoody up after buying skittles at a 7-11. He was shot by George Zimmerman, a self-appointed neighborhood "watchman" who perceived him as a threat, called police, was told by police to stay in his car while they checked on the report. Zimmerman did not stay in his car, but followed Trayvon, accosted him, fought with him, and ended up shooting him, killing him. Zimmerman was found not guilty because Florida has a so called "stand your ground law" that somehow makes it okay to shoot people out in the world if you feel threatened (unless you are a woman, or a black male, or a teenager, when you can never use deadly force) even though in this case, Zimmerman was not standing ground, but was in pursuit. This is outrageous to me. There are other states attempting to enact such laws. Time to contact our lawmakers' (J 129d Huffman, Barbara Boxer, Diane Finestein) offices to encourage the U.S. Attorney General's office to investigate this murder as a civil liberties crime. We need a Federal law that would override the forming of such state vigilantes laws.

Otherwise, back in Bolinas, it is still safe to walk the streets at night. I am thankful for this town.

Three big yard sales this weekend worked to help move the stuff around. I enjoyed working at the Uniquities 2nd Saturday Sidewalk sale, watching the lucky lunchers at St. Aidens enjoying the excellent free meal available there the 2nd Saturday of each month. The choice this weekend, was a hearty meat stew or a vegetarian corn chowder, which I sampled and can say it was delicious.

Lots of art around town, and lots of youthful, enthusiastic Stage riders, coming out for some summer beach days. Let's protect our youth and ourselves with open hearts, not loaded guns. jp







