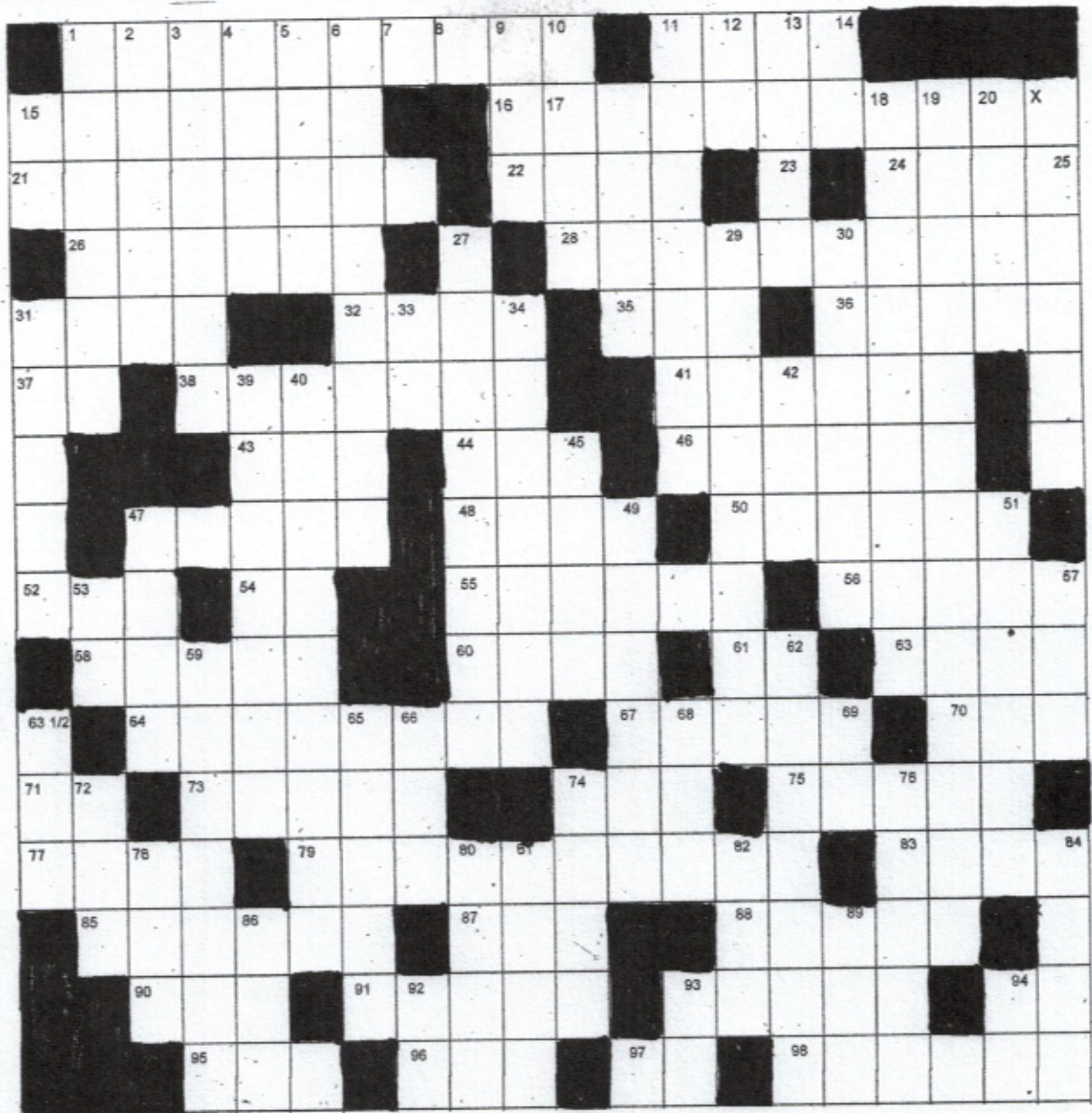

Ralph's Rain Report

The 2017-18 rain season ended on Saturday June 30th and the 2018-19 season has just opened.

I collected 23.43 inches for the year. So, how does 23.43 inches compare to previous years? Last year the BCPUD measured 51.3 inches, I measured 45.14". If we look at the years back to 2010-11 it looks like this.

10-11	39.3.	14-15	34.96
11-12	20.3.	15-16	32.25
12-13	39.9	16-17	51.3
13-14	27.4		

This averages to 33.6 inches a year, which is about normal. [32.39 inches is our average rain fall, 1951-2017]. This means we got about 70% of normal and 46% of last year. It is a pretty sure bet that we will not get any more rain until September/October; we will get wet "big a mist" days for the next month or so giving us trace amounts of moisture. Which is important to the watershed.

I guess I can take the next couple of months off. However, if we get a freak downpour, I will let you know...

I collected .05 of an inch of moisture last night, Sunday night.

They have sent the County and the Coastal Commission an alternate version, suggesting inclusion of both sides of these streets plus Wharf Ave. with the ban from 2:00am to 5:00am. 

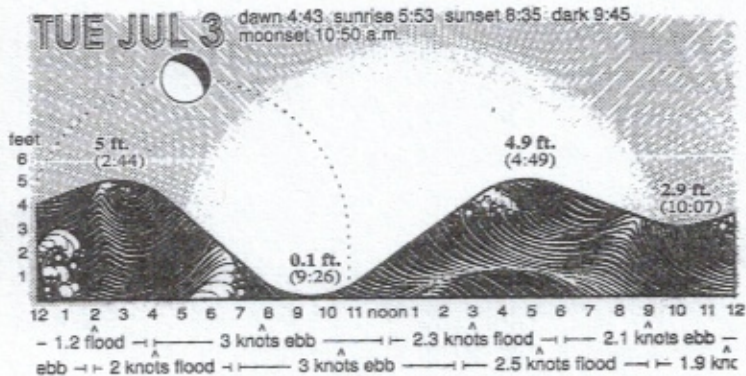
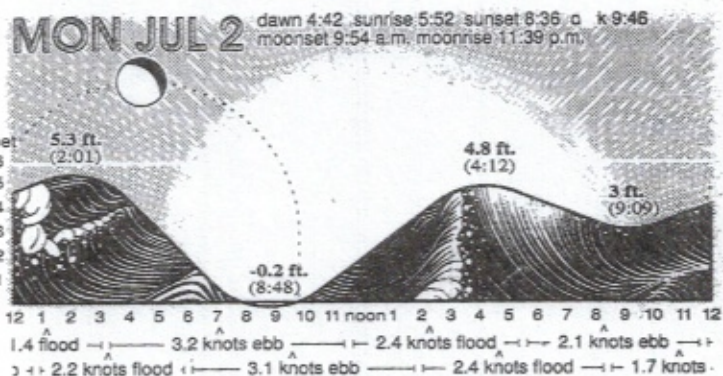

2018 ELECTION NEWS! DEADLINES FOR CANDIDACY AND FOR BALLOT MEASURES! PLEASE READ!

The terms of three (3) BCPUD Directors expire this year. If you would like to run for one of these seats in the November 6, 2018 election, you must declare your candidacy during the filing period, which opens **July 16, 2018** and closes **August 10, 2018**. The appropriate forms are available from the Registrar of Voters office at the Civic Center (Room 121) and must be filed there. If any of the three BCPUD Directors whose terms are expiring at the end of November decide that they do not want to run for another 4-year term, the filing period for **non-incumbents only** will be extended by several days (the specific date is not yet available).

The last day to submit measures for placement on the November ballot is **August 10, 2018**; the last day to withdraw a measure from the ballot is **August 15, 2018**; The last day to submit ballot arguments is **August 20, 2018** and the last day to submit rebuttal arguments is **August 27, 2018**. In each case, the pertinent documents must be received by the County's Election Office by **4:30 p.m.** on the deadline date.
