## Go to Health: Junk food advertising to children// Population trends

Anna Lappé is a food activist and author. With her mother, Frances Moore Lappé, she founded the Small Planet Institute and the Real Food Media Project. She plans to spread the power of sustainable food using creative movies, and online action center and grassroots events. In an online film called "Is junk food what we really crave?" she recounts her experiences with her daughter and junk food advertising. Here are some of her findings:

Food corporations spend about \$2 billion each year on ads aimed at children and teens, for foods that are cheap to make, "cool" and addictive. As a result, one third of kids eat fast food daily, and nationally, about 50% of calories they eat come from sugar and fat. Only 16% of children and teens are eating enough vegetables and fruits. Food companies have found that parents 'cave' after about 9 nags from their kids for a particular treat, so they use psychological techniques to appeal to children, including the use of special colors, cartoon characters on packaging, clever ads on TV and social media, and toys with fast-food meals. Companies will lose money if they don't market to children.

Michelle Obama hosted a big conference on this topic at the White House in mid September. Along with many health advocacy groups and Universities, food corporations were in attendance – Coca Cola, Pepsico, Walmart, Disney, McDonalds et al. The discussion not only concerned the rise of obesity and diabetes among young people, but also how to market healthy foods.

McDonalds, the world's largest fast food chain, has announced that it is teaming up with the Alliance for a Healthier Generation (funded by the Clinton Foundation) and the American Health Association to serve healthier meals. When you order a Big Mac, you may be asked if you would like a side salad, fruit or vegetable at no extra cost. Children will be offered water, milk or juice with their Happy Meals. Look for this new trend, but don't hold your breath. McDonalds has said that it will be 2020 before they will be able to introduce this healthier food in all their outlets.

Population Trends Alan Weisman, author of *The World Without Us* (how the world returns to a natural state in the absence of humans) has written a new book about population growth and its relationship to environmental destruction and human suffering. He traveled to 21 countries to report on how different cultures are responding to booming populations and the strain this puts on governments and resources. Here are some findings:

Pakistan – current population 193 million. By 2030, they will have 395 million. They are the size of Texas, which has 26 million.

Iran – current population 80 million. Iran has managed its population growth with a humane program, according to Weisman. They got down to a replacement rate a year faster than China with voluntary means. Pills, condoms, IUDs, implants, tubal ligations and vasectomies were easily available. Couples took a class in contraception before getting married. There was one government disincentive to having a large number of children – elimination of the individual subsidy for food, paid maternity leave and social welfare subsidies after the 3<sup>rd</sup> child. In 1989, Iran's government declared that Islam favored families with only 2 children. However, in 2006, President Ahmadinejad called for a reversal of this policy, and asked women to devote more time to 'their main mission of raising children.' Regardless of these changes, the lesson from Iran is that population control does not have to be as coercive as that of China to be effective.

### Marijuana eradication in Tomales

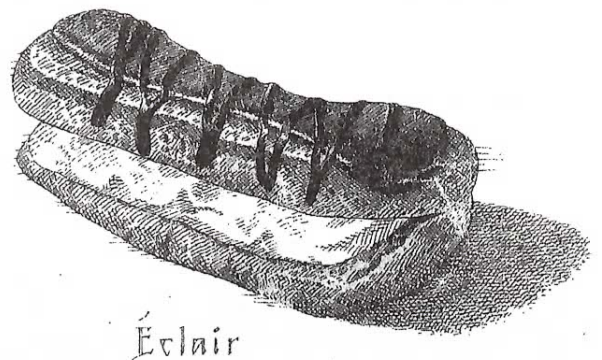
Forty-two mature marijuana plants growing in plain view on a Chileno Valley ranch were eradicated Friday after a report of a physical altercation drew Marin County sheriff's deputies to the property, where they inadvertently stumbled on the pot farm. The residents of the Silva dairy, located on Tomales-Petaluma Road at the intersection of Chileno Valley Road, denied any knowledge of the illegal crop, said Lt. Doug Pittman, the Point Reyes station commander, though one family member was overheard asking, "How are we going to pay the electric bill now?" The four to five-foot tall plants would have yielded about half a pound of dried marijuana each, said Karl Nichols, a spokesperson for the San Francisco division of the Drug Enforcement Agency. On the streets, he said, a pound sells for \$1,500 to \$2,500, meaning the Silva ranch yield could have topped \$50,000. Small growing operations have become increasingly prevalent in the last five years as attitudes toward medicinal and recreational marijuana use have changed, Mr. Nichols said, resulting in lower street prices. "People know they can make money from it," Mr. Nichols added. "There is a relatively low risk of arrest or prosecution." Since no one claimed the plants at the Silva ranch, the property owners will face no charges. — C. P.

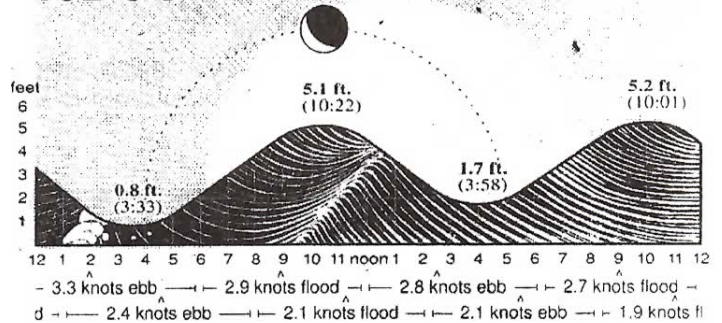
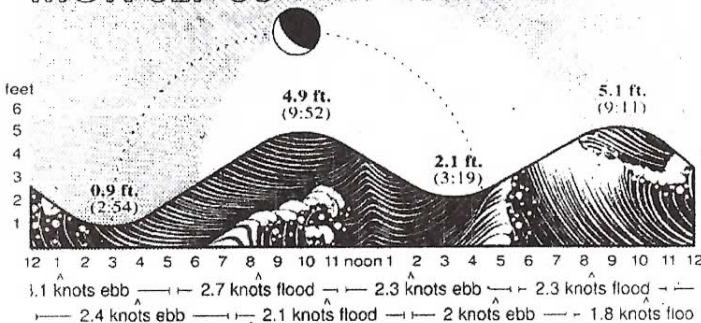
