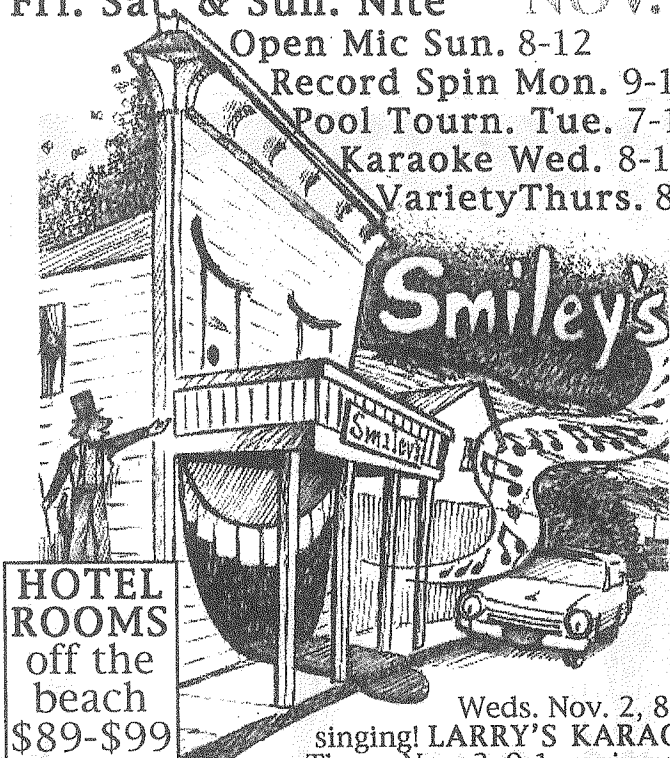

The Slavyanka Male Chorus was formed in 1979 by several former members of the Yale Russian Chorus. Membership has varied from 20 to 30 men, all with other primary occupations ranging from business and the trades to law, science and medicine. The chorus toured the former Soviet Union in 1986, 1989, and 1999, where it performed for historically its largest and most appreciative audiences.

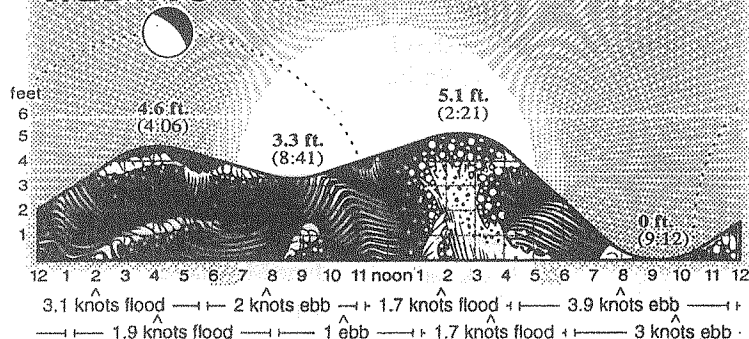

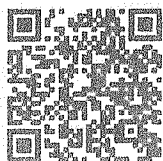

The Leonid meteor shower, which produced a memorable display in 2001, peaks this year on Friday. The parent comet is well on its outbound journey after returning in 1998, so nothing comparable to the 2001 show is anticipated. However, recent Leonid showers have exceeded lowered expectations, and the shower has earned a reputation for unpredictability. The best chance to see these fast meteors emanating from the Leo constellation is after Leo rises around midnight, in the wee hours of the morning, before the rising gibbous moon lights the sky.

Mill Valley author to deliver lecture on Sausalito artist's work

The Marin Museum of Contemporary Art at Hamilton Field in Novato will present "Mary Tuthill Lindheim: Agent of Change," featuring the work of the late Sausalito ceramicist, sculptor and activist Mary Lindheim (1912-2004). It will be the first museum exhibition of Lindheim's work since her death, and the most comprehensive solo show ever of her work.

MarinMOCA Executive Director Heather Murray will curate the exhibition in close collaboration with the artist's estate and Mill Valley resident Abby Wasserman, editor and essayist of the recently published "Mary Tuthill Lindheim:

Art and Inspiration." The exhibition honors Lindheim, who lived in Sausalito and Bolinas for the last 65 years of her life, not only as an artist but as someone passionately dedicated to social justice.

There will be a lecture by curator Heather Murray and a book signing by Abby Wasserman on Dec. 10, 4-5 p.m.

The Marin Museum of Contemporary Art is located at the Novato Arts Center at Hamilton Field, 500 Palm Drive, Novato. Hours are Wednesday through Sunday 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Admission is free. For more information, visit marinmoca.org or call 506-0137.

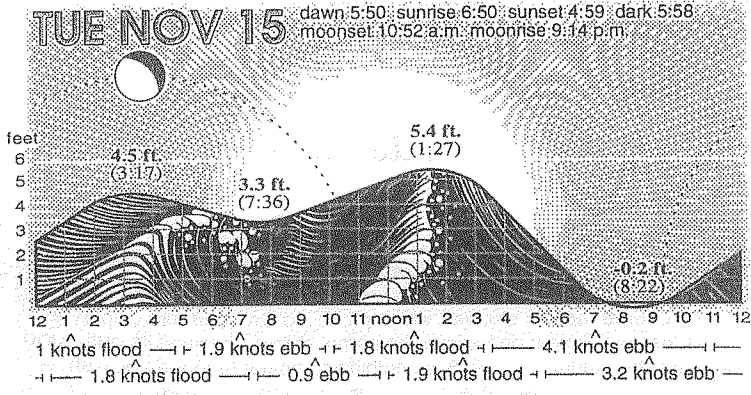
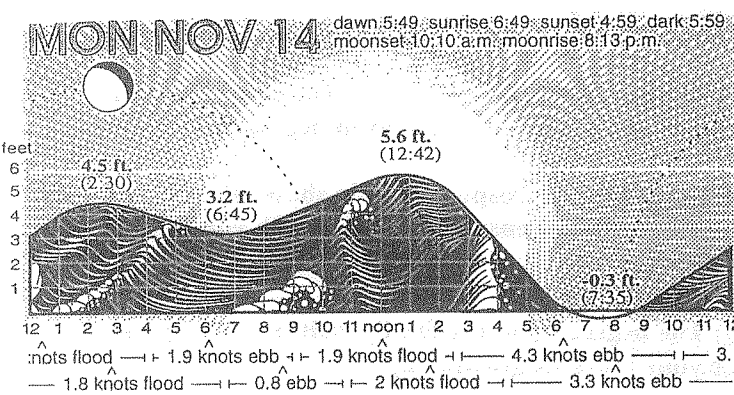

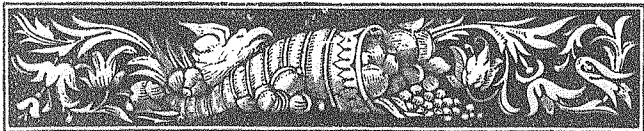
