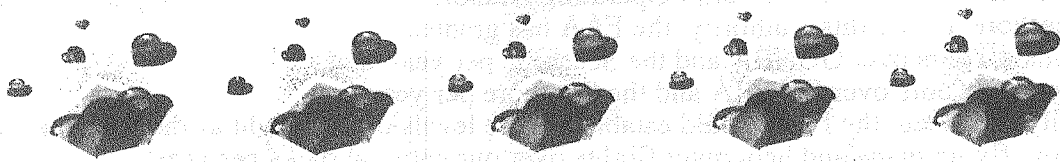
IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING AIR TOURS OVER PARK LAND! That would be us. This item was on Wednesday's Bolinas Utility District monthly meeting agenda, down around number 12, when I was starting to drift a little, but it woke me right up. There is an article about this elsewhere in today's paper, with information about how you can respond IMMEDIATELY. Here's why you need to do just that. There is an **Air Tour Management Plan Development** at 1.) Golden Gate National Recreation Area, 2) S.F. Maritime National Historical Park, and 3) Point Reyes National Seashore for 3,000 helicopter and seaplane tours each area! That's 9,000 combined tours, potential for 15,000 flights overhead a year! What are they thinking? It's an invasion of privacy and an assault on the wildlife sanctuaries of the Bay Area! This is not why people move out to the back of beyond to live peacefully with the birds and land creatures. This would cause major sound and ozone pollution and is in direct conflict with the concept of wildlife preservation. We have enough planes flying overhead - in the space of time it has taken me to write this, 10 planes have flown over, low enough to make the dog bark. This new plan would change the nature of our lives from now forward, and in a very negative way. Please let your voices be heard on this Measure G issue.

Some other BCPUD Agenda items: office is now ADA compliant and looks beautiful; we need to check our old, leaky toilets that are causing excess water use and high bills; Jeremy Kidson offered to donate Ocean Parkway property to BCPUD but Board wants to first check to see what liability would be; latest county roadwork asphalt grindings weren't checked for toxicity so have been refused this time. Maybe next project will work out.

Bolinas-Stinson School Trustees met Monday at Walker Creek Ranch with Lagunitas School District and Shoreline District to start thinking of ways we might share services to help hold down costs. It was facilitated by Marin County Office of Education, was informative, and I look forward to the second one, early next January.

Thursday was Back To School Night and the school is looking good, with great staff, and enthusiastic parents, off to a great start, with many excellent programs for our eager students.

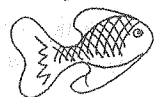

Two air tour operators have been granted Interim Operating Authority to operate low-flying air tours over the GGNRA and the Seashore. Under this Authority, the FAA has granted:

- 2,190 Seaplane Tours over GGNRA and the Seashore per year, and
- 2,900 Helicopter Tours over GGNRA and the Seashore per year.

Unless heavily contested, the FAA would establish these levels of overflight as the baseline – allowing by right this many low-flying plane and helicopter flights over our national parks per year!

Your comment letters are essential to stop these commercial uses from substantially impacting the parks' natural and cultural resources, disturbing wildlife, and invading the visitor and wilderness experience at our beloved Bay Area national parks.

Talking Points

- GGNRA and the Seashore are national parks for people – not private commercial use – and these commercial overflights should be prohibited.
- Resident and migrating birds and marine wildlife are already subject to a number of potential human disturbances, including motorized water craft, motorized aircraft, recreational users, commercial, government, and industrial marine transport, oil spills, plastic in the ocean, marine debris, and climate change. Given the increasing number of negative pressures on birds and marine wildlife, EAC strongly believes that an outright prohibition of low over-flights is necessary for these national parks.
- The special national significance for which the GGNRA and Seashore were established, combined with the adjoining Gulf of the Farallones National Marine Sanctuary, the Cordell Bank National Marine Sanctuary, and Tomales Bay recognized as a tidal estuary and wetlands of international significance under the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands, and the importance of providing marine wildlife protection from undue disturbance, warrants an outright prohibition against motorized aircraft flights below 5000 feet except in the case of an emergency.
- Low-flying helicopters and planes will drastically diminish the ability to experience wilderness and the many wilderness values, including solitude, renewal, reflection, and immersion in wild nature, at the Seashore.
- A full environmental impact statement – not merely an environmental assessment – is necessary to ensure that the individual and cumulative impacts to resident and migrating marine wildlife and birds are considered under best available science. Such science shows adverse impacts to birds and marine wildlife from motorized boats and aircraft.
- The Interim Operating Authority establishes exceptionally high numbers of annual flights as a baseline – the FAA must submit factual evidence for the public to review from the air tour operators before establishing and allowing this level of operation.

Background Information

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), in cooperation with the National Park Service (NPS), is developing Air tour Management Plans (ATMP) for Golden Gate National Recreation Area (GGNRA) and Point Reyes National Seashore (Seashore). The ATMP will only apply to the airspace below 5,000 above ground level over the area encompassed by the park and to the half-mile buffer zone surrounding the park's boundary. The ATMP will apply to all commercial air tour operations in this airspace.

Current Planning and Air Tour Operations

The FAA and NPS are required to review environmental impacts on the natural resources, cultural resources, visitor experiences, and tribal lands within the Seashore and GGNRA under the National Environmental Policy Act. Comments are due by the close of business on Wednesday, September 28th.

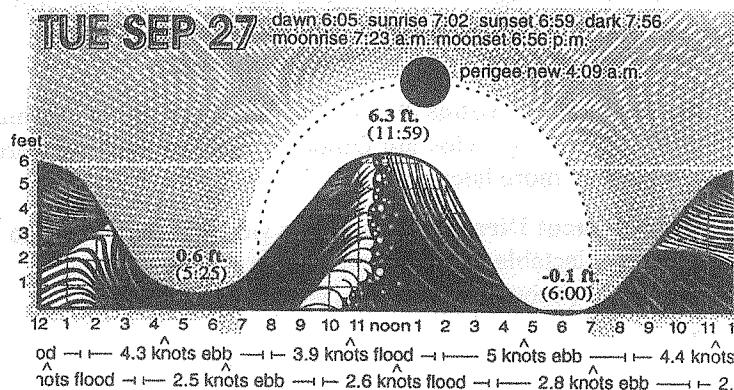
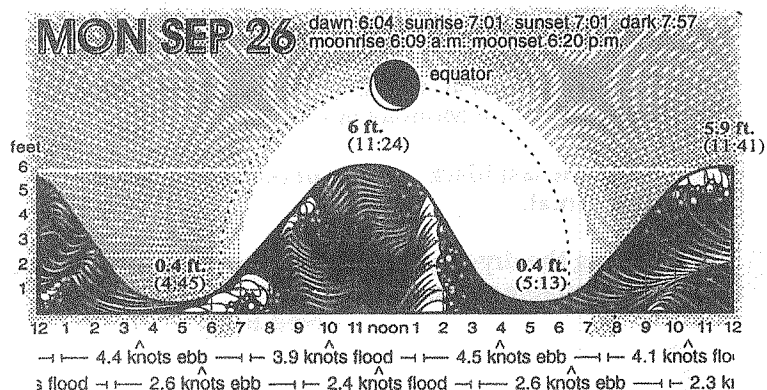

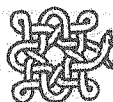
