## TARANTINOS SEAFOOD GROTTO DESTROYED BY FIRE

IT WAS A HOLOCAUST.  
THE FREEZERS FILLED WITH ABALONE AND CLAMS MELTED LIKE ICE CUBES. PEOPLE WATCHING FROM ACROSS THE STREET HAD TO SHIELD THEIR FACES FROM THE HEAT, WATER FROM THE FIRE HOSES EVAPORATED BEFORE IT TOUCHED THE FLAMES, AND IT IS AMAZING THAT THE STORE (AND ALL OF DOWNTOWN) WAS SAVED, THANKS TO OUR FIREMEN.

EVEN SO, THE LOSS WAS STUPENDOUS. THOSE WHO LIVED ABOVE AND BEHIND THE RESTAURANT GOT OUT WITH THEIR SKINS. EVERYTHING ELSE WAS BURNED. ED HEIBER ALONE LOST THESE THINGS: A GIBSON HUMMINGBIRD GUITAR WITH CASE, A 100-YEAR-OLD ITALIAN TAPESTRY (HAND-WOVEN), A HAND-CARVED WALKING STICK, A DOUBLE BED AND DRESSER, A TACKLE BOX WITH 3 REELS, ALL HIS LINEN, A PAIR OF WHITE BUCKS, AND ALL HIS CLOTHES, A TENT, SLEEPING BAG, AND A 2 QUART CANTEN, ALL HIS JEWELRY, A TOASTER, FRYING PAN, ENAMEL COFFEE POT, RUGS, 3 HANDMADE PIPES, A BOOKCASE AND 30 BOOKS, ALL HIS TOOLS, POTS AND PANS, HIS EYEGLASSES, AND A DIARY FROM OCTOBER 10, 1972.

EVERY DAY HE REMEMBERS MORE THINGS GONE.

DONATIONS FOR VICTIMS OF THE FIRE ARE BEING COLLECTED AT THE STORE, AND A BENEFIT FUND-RAISING IS BEING PLANNED FOR NEXT WEEK.

MEANWHILE, LIFE GOES ON. BOLINAS MADE THE FRONT PAGES AGAIN, AND HOARDS OF TOURISTS WERE IN TOWN SATURDAY TO SEE THE RUINS. THE VIEW WAS BLOCKED BY SEVERAL TOWNSFOLK HAWKING THEIR WARES ON THE SIDEWALK. IT LOOKED LIKE A CARNIVAL.
