COMMUNITY INC. BOARD DISCUSS RAMP TOPICS REACH SOME CONCLUSIONS

GORDON BALDWIN WAS BACK IN THE CHAIR AT THE COMMUNITY CENTER'S BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING FRIDAY NIGHT, AFTER TWO MONTHS IN NEW YORK AND A SUCCESSFUL SHOW OF HIS DRAWINGS. THANKS TO KURT KIRKHAM FOR CHAIRING IN GORDON'S ABSENCE, THE BOARD:

VOTED YES ON LEWIS MACADAMS' PROPOSAL TO PROCURE TARANTINO'S HAMBURGER SIGN TO HAND AS A RELIC IN THE COMMUNITY CENTER; DECIDED TO REPLACE THE PLUM TREES THAT HAVE DIED; STOOD FIRM ON REQUIRING A \$100,000 DAMAGE DEPOSIT FOR REENTING THE CENTER FOR DANCES; ACCEPTED JIMMY HERERRA'S RESIGNATION AS CUSTODIAN AND HIS RECOMMENDATION OF DANIEL MATNIS AS HIS REPLACEMENT; DISCUSSED MAINTENANCE AND FORMED A COMMITTEE TO TELL DANNY HIS JOB DUTIES; TOOK MICKEY CHANNINGS' SUGGESTION OF INCORPORATING THE MESA PRESS UNDER ADVISEMENT AND DECIDED TO LOOK INTO THE LEGAL RAMPLICATIONS OF SUCH A MOVE; DECIDED TO WRITE A LETTER ASKING THAT THE TARANTINO RUMBS, being so ugly and depressing, as well as dangerous, be cleaned up with great dispatch; Agreed that it would be a good idea to put overhead power lines underground when the new sewer is dug; And voted to look into the possibility; Directed that the broken windows be fixed as soon as possible; Heard a report that the Saturday Night movies are breaking even; Agreed to spend \$15.00 to re-tune the piano; Waived the \$35.00 Ballywine Rental fee for two events scheduled to benefit fire victims;
