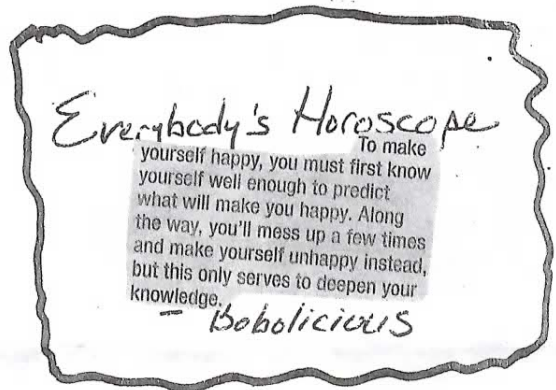
Grants for Bo-Stin projects

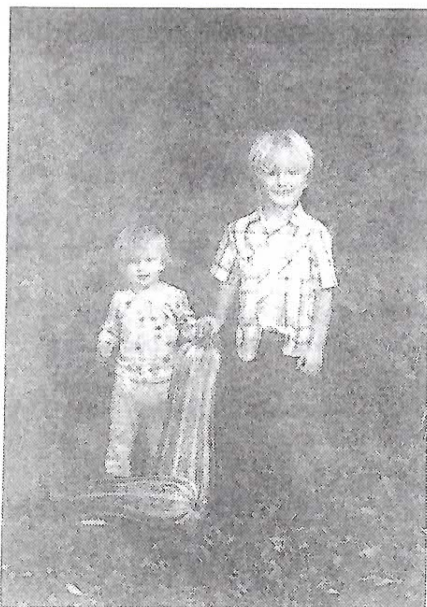
Chris Whitefield has lived most of his life in Bolinas. Drawing has always been part of his life. He studied early on at CCAC (now called California College of the Arts) in Oakland, and later lithography and drawing at Instituto Allende and Bellas Artes in San Miguel de Allende, Mexico and at the University of New Mexico. Five years ago he saw a line drawing there by Agnes Martin that inspired him to explore line drawing with ink. He moved back to Bolinas and became a full time carpenter. He spent his evenings during the next five years, starting from the outside of the paper and working his way into the inside marking 1000 lines, 1000 hours as his meditation. He states "As a woodworker, I spend a lot of time reflecting on the geometry of construction and the integrity of lines within structure. In the body of work, I bring my building skills into the act of drawing as I construct images line by line. Woodwork has pushed my drawing in a more meditative and less representational direction. In this series of ink images, I explore the tensions that exist between lines." mmmmmmmmmmmmmmmmm

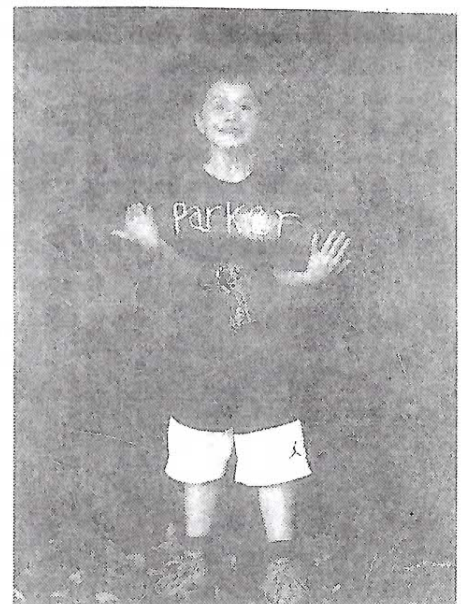

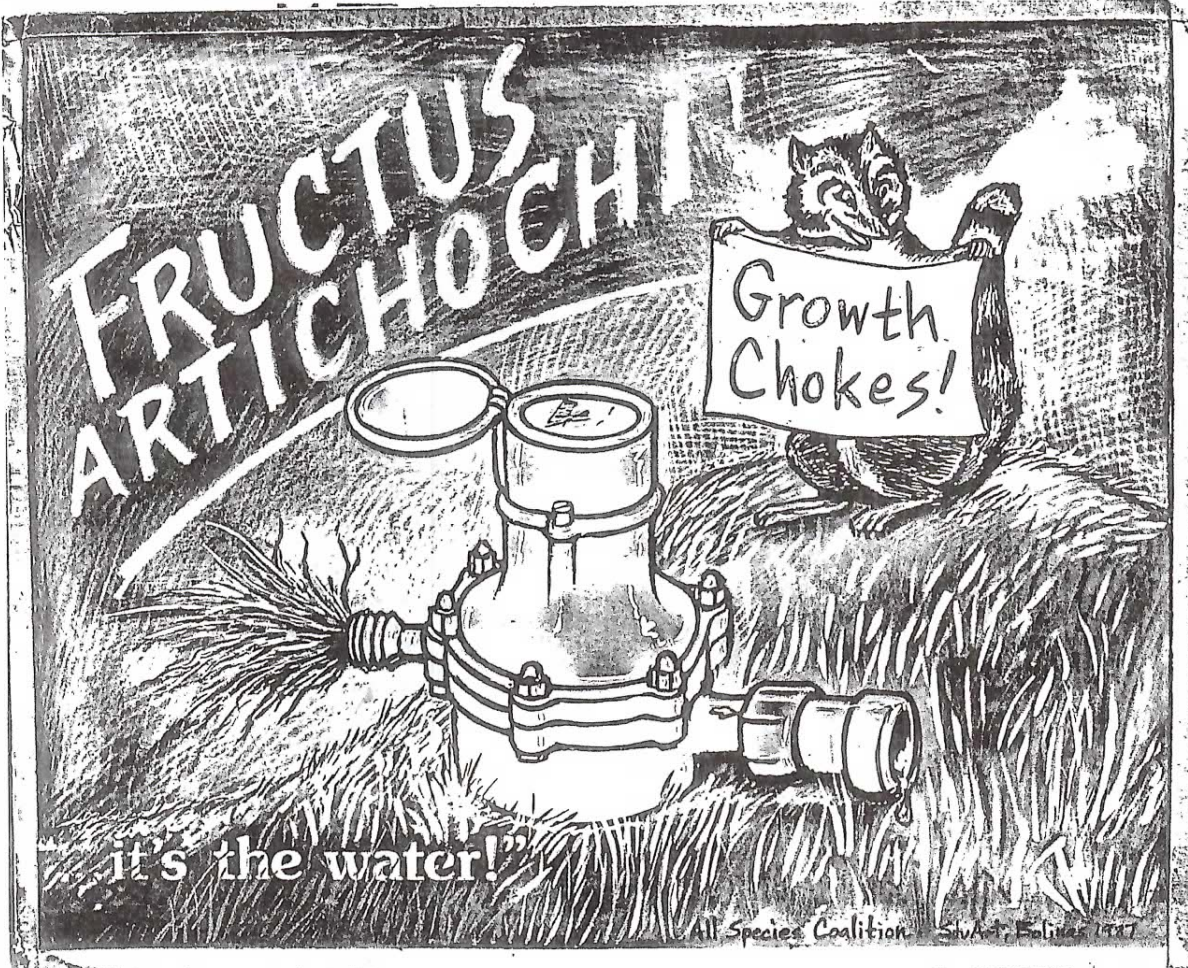

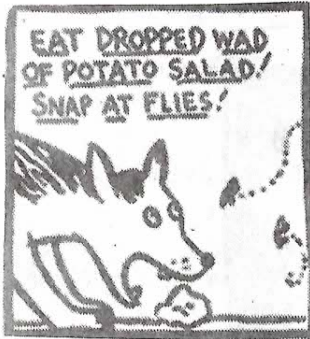

While denial is not an option, having a positive outlook on life is. Once peace begins internally, we can begin to deal with the many urgent problems facing us.

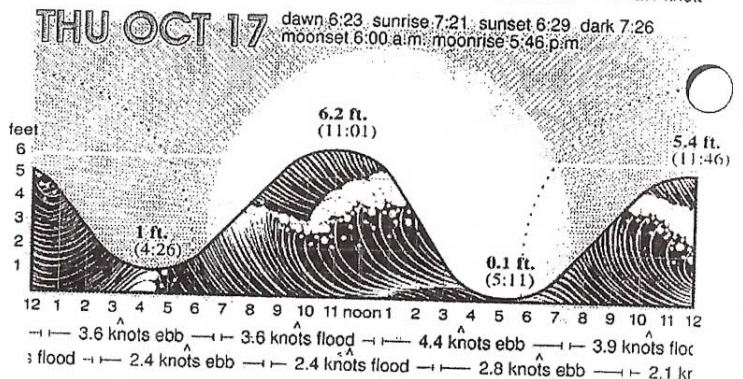
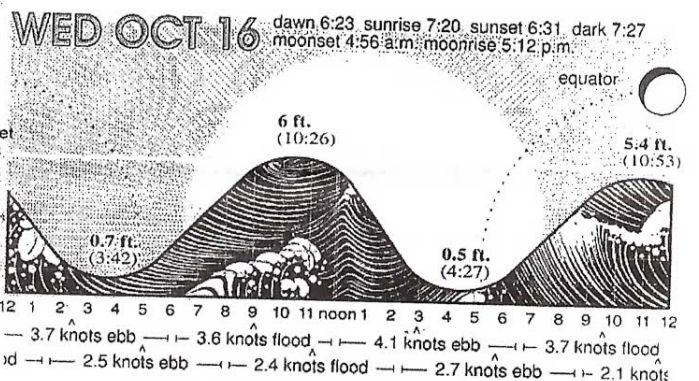
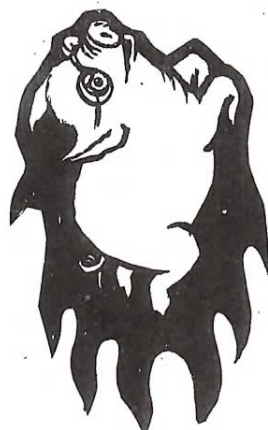
