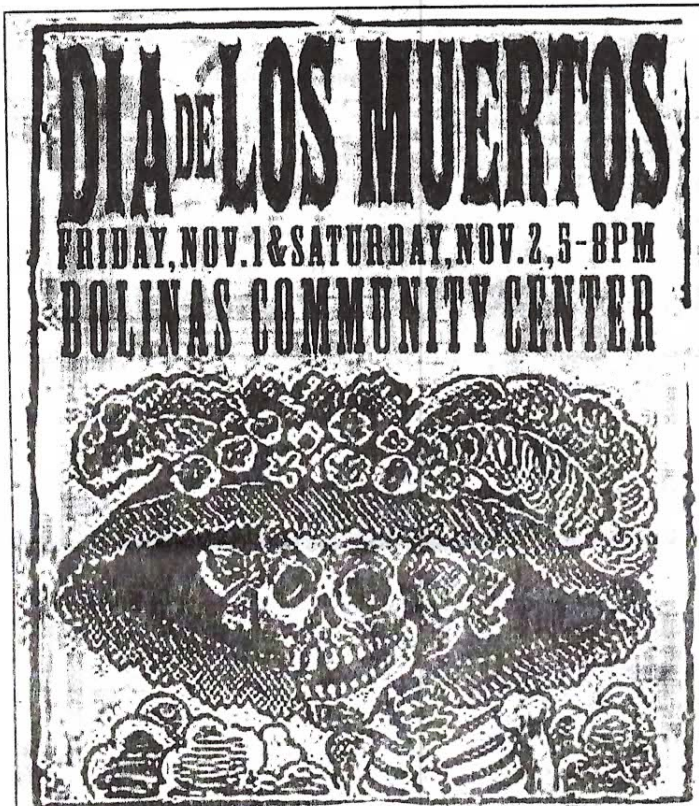

The altar will be decorated with the traditional marigold, which has been specially grown for the event by Ainabel.

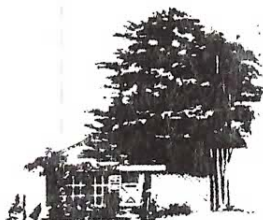

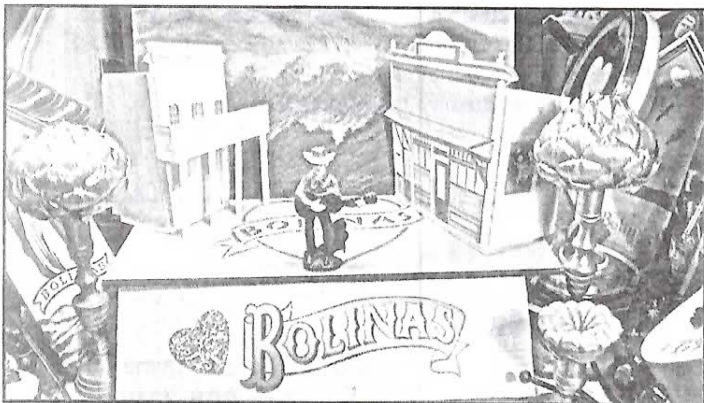

MESA PARK BOARD MEETING

September 9, 2013 7:00 PM

Bolinas Firehouse

Call to Order: 7:01

Members present: Bryan Lee, Jane Mickelson, Patricia Hickey, Dylan Squires, Charles Whitefield
Others: Jenny Pfeiffer, Vic Amoroso, Lia Sabbatini, Angela Vernon

Community Expression: Bolinas Community Center asking permission to use the downtown park for a food festival, October 12. Lia Sabbatini requesting permission for the BCC to hold a food festival in the DT park to raise funds for kitchen remodel. Follows same layout as last year, with kid zone in back, caution tape to prevent climbing up hill in back. Will have waivers for activities. Juice bar in the park, will clean up. The cob oven should be done and will be used for pizza making. Only acoustic music in park. Would like permission to set up a few tables for information booths. Any vendors BCC sets up will be under BCC insurance. May we use the MP parking lot & shuttle folks downtown? [Charles] We will still have road grindings but there shouldn't be a problem.

Action Item: Vote to allow the use of DT park for food festival: Patricia moves, Jane 2nd. All aye.

[Jane] Satris family requesting permission to use the MP parking lot for a wedding: [Charles] We have a basic protocol against overnight parking because of the no camping, but not for guests' cars. We need to have the cars gone by 11 on Sunday because of the food give-away.

Action Item: Vote to allow the use of the MP parking lot for wedding guests: We will hold off on approval until a family member can come and talk with us. We're putting it on the calendar.

Downtown Park:

Action Item: Vote to build a fence to protect hillside above DT park. [Charles] This was part of the orig. plan. [Angela] But we need to get the trees at the top down first. [Patricia] There was consensus on this. [Bryan] We should get an estimate from Oakander. [Angela] Where do we stand on the water issue? I've turned it off completely because of the water shortage. [Vic] I think keeping it to 50% of what you were using before it would be okay. [Charles] I think we should take the trees down if we have the money to do so. If not, put up a removable fence now and be able to take it down & replace it after the trees come down. [Charles volunteered be contact person for any issues with the DT park that need immediate addressing.] The fence could be redwood posts and no-see wire, down from the edge of the road. Patricia moves. Bryan 2nd, all aye. [Charles] I'll call Roger & get the estimates and that we'd like him to come up with a couple designs to choose from. [Vic] The neighbors should be alerted to the removal. [Bryan] We'd inform any neighbors before the work. [Charles] We need to inform the fire dept. when the parking lot is being used for road grindings, or event parking. The road grindings are already ready to be used by residents to fix potholes. [Dylan] I can set up the board e-mail address to forward to all board members. I can also respond to e-mails to let people know that we have received their comm. and will bring it up at next meeting.

Action Item: Discuss and design appropriate protocol for meeting with the county attorney.

Action Item: To authorize County Counsel to assist MESA Park Board in the adoption of Park Ordinances. [Patricia] Hopefully we will get approval from county council to get our ordinances through. The council will give us an answer on moving forward on this. But we have to sign for them to begin work on it. We need this for public safety and for enforcement for the downtown park. I will work through these issues with county council. [Dylan] I'd like to give them a limit on the hours the council puts in, not have it be open-ended. [Bryan] We need to ask the council if we need special ordinances for

our parks. [Patricia] You can't meet with them until you have a contract with them. [Dylan] What if we say a limit of 8 hours? [Bryan] I move to approve that Patricia can meet with council up to 8 hours; Dylan 2nd. All aye.

Maintenance Report: no report

Irrigation Report: [Bryan] Jennifer finally got a decision from State Parks that we cannot claim the initial engineering (\$45K) for the reclamation plant as match towards the grant. New grant total (amount from State) is \$408,700. Now we go back to the state and they know the work has to be completed by next year. We need to get final approval by Dec. or Jan. There will be a public hearing in Oct. for coastal permit. The stuff on the county side is going smoothly.

Treasurer's Report: no report. [Charles] I have an item. \$500 from 4th of July from the Lion's Club. They extend their gratitude for the use of the parking lot.

Up-date on election status: discuss bulk mailing options
Action Item: vote to acquire MP its own permit if necessary. Don Smith proposes to share the publicity mailing about the November election with the BPUD.
The board felt it might detract to have both. Perhaps community center might allow use of their bulk mailing permit. Suggest we do our own mailing. Dylan will contact Lia to ask about using their bulk mailing permit.
[Charles] I prefer names on the mailings rather than Boxholder. [Patricia] I move to buy the stickers for the registered voters, Bryan 2nd, all aye.
Action Item: vote to share the publicity mailing about Nov. election with the BPUD: not necessary.

Other: Measure A. Bryan & Jack S met with the county & the other special districts. As of that meeting county council deemed that we are not a special district. We were formed through a joint powers agreement, but to be a special district you have to be formed by the voters of that district. But we could be funded from the measure outside of the special district funds, which would have to be reapproved each year. We're setting up a meeting with Mesa Park board, Jack and the county council.

Alison Pincus wants to meet and look at the park to see how the play area can be improved. Perhaps she can help publicize the park. If the measure doesn't pass we will need to close the park.

Approve Warrants: no warrants. [Patricia] The audit was approved.

Approve Minutes: Dylan moves, Patricia 2nd. All aye.

Next meeting: October 14

Meeting adjourned: 8:54

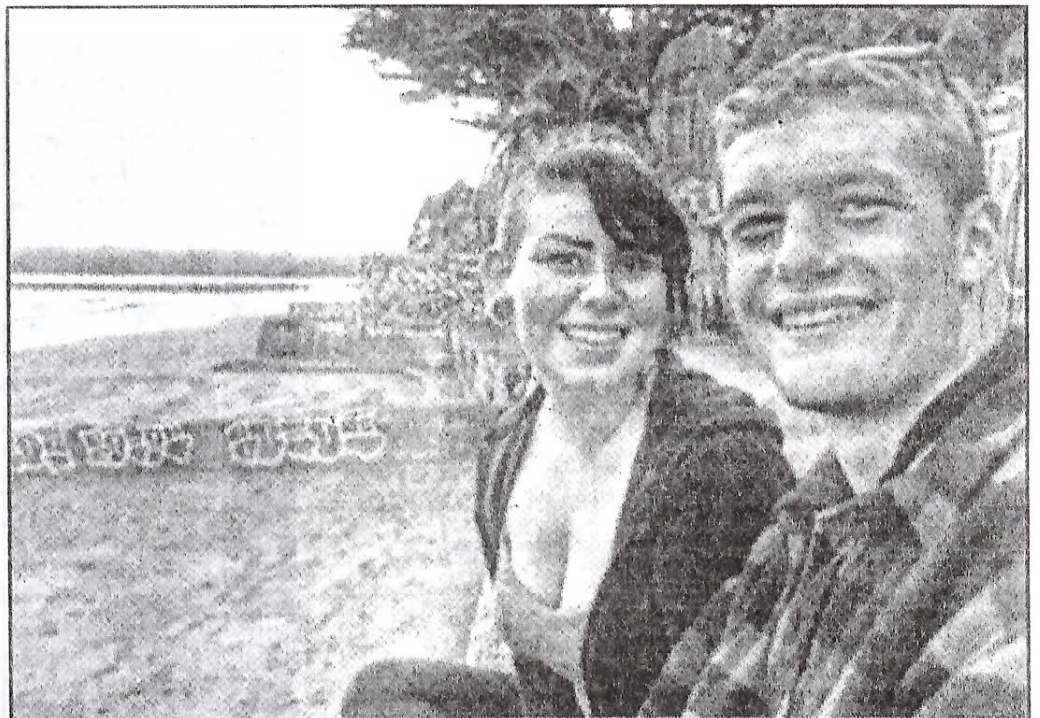
