Burning Man in Perspective

I came back from Burning Man a bit shell-shocked. The contrast between my sweet life in juicy Bolinas and the cacophonous chaos in the dusty desert was unsettling. For a couple of weeks I licked my wounds until I heard about the tragic deaths of two of my favorite Burning Man people in an auto accident in Portland.

It was a freak accident that happened during morning rush on Interstate 5. A truck in the opposite lane clipped another truck, went out of control and plunged across the median divider right into my friends' car.

Cary Fairchild and Steven Fritz both worked at the Oregon State Mental Hospital, she as a yoga instructor and he as a psychiatrist. Bill and I shared their "Burning Tarot" campsite last year at Burning Man. I knew Steven as an official Burning Man photographer. I called Cary "Papaya" because of her sweet nature and the slices of papaya she would pass out to the troops.

Cary would prepare dishes like bacon meatballs and offer the leftovers to us boys, Bill and me, who would be eating nothing but dried beef jerky and canned sardines. Cary was so beautiful and poised at Burning Man that naturally I developed a crush on her.

Steven was a talented photographer and had been working with Tiffany Brown for years photographing people at Burning Man for a tarot deck, Tiffany was a gifted Tarot reader and practiced her trade at our campsite, that's why it was called "Burning Tarot."

This year Steven brought a quadricopter drone to Burning Man and used it to do airborne photography. One day I was bicycling back from the Souk and I heard a buzzing that I thought was coming from the bicycle's chain. Finally I stopped to make sure the chain wasn't going to break and Steven's quadricopter zoomed past.

And now Steven has zoomed past. And there will be no more bacon meatballs from Cary Papaya. And I'm reminded how tenuous and fleeting life really is. And my personal "suffering" is replaced with humility and gratitude for this miracle that is life.

Burn on, burn on.

Stinson/Bolinas Community Fund Fall 2014 Grant Application Deadline

The Stinson/Bolinas Community Fund will be accepting grants for the Fall 2014 grant cycle up until **Friday, October 31st**. Grants must be postmarked by the 31st to be included in this cycle.

The Stinson/Bolinas Community Fund was created and is supported by a group of local donors to provide funding for projects that benefit the Stinson Beach and Bolinas communities. The maximum grant the Fund provides is \$3000 per grant cycle and there is no minimum amount. The Fund has two grant cycles per year with application deadlines of April 30 and October 31. To be eligible to submit an application, an applicant must be an organization or individual whose project benefits the Stinson Beach and/or Bolinas communities. 

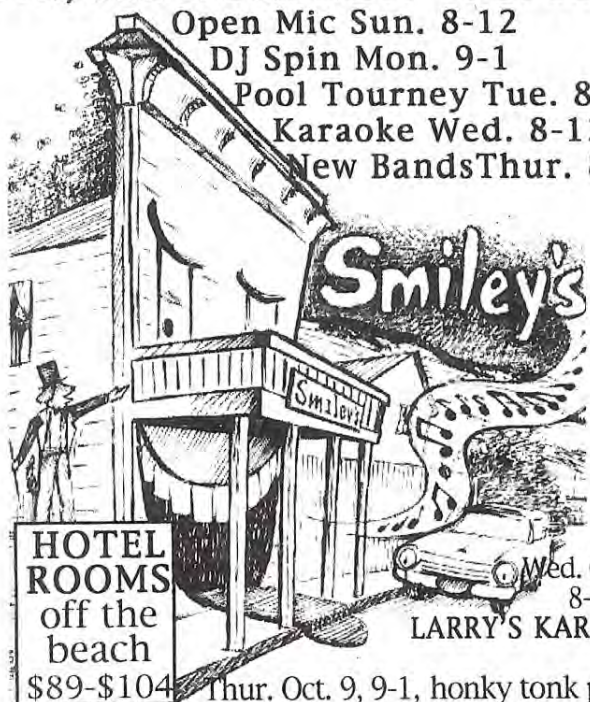

I Watched the World...30 Years After Brautigan

Morrison Library

Thirty years after **Richard Brautigan's** passing, friends **Joanne Kyger**, **Michael McClure** and **David Meltzer**, and family members **Ianthe Brautigan-Swensen** and **Paul Swensen** gather in discussion with poet and UC Professor **Robert Hass** to recall the man and the writer whose works (*Trout Fishing in America*, *The Pill Versus the Springhill Mine Disaster*) were synonymous with the cultural awakening of the 1960s in San Francisco. Created and screened solely for this event will also be Paul Swensen's short film *You Will Have Unreal Recollections of Me*, using interviews as well as unique images from the collection of Brautigan's daughter Ianthe.

The **Bancroft Library** is the proud repository of a significant collection of Richard Brautigan's papers, and is pleased to join with **Litquake** in hosting this memorial gathering in the Morrison Library at U.C. Berkeley. Come for this celebration of an American legend, with special guests!

Ianthe Brautigan-Swensen is an American writer and daughter of late author Richard Brautigan. Her parents separated when she was two and she spent most of her young life with her father. Her first book *You Can't Catch Death: A Daughter's Memoir* was published in 2000. It has been translated into Swedish, German, and Russian, and will soon be available from Audible books.com. She has also been published in *Confrontation*, *The Antioch Review*, and other publications. This last summer she appeared at the Dinefwr Literature Festival with Gruff Rhys, Joe Dunthorne & The Brautigan Book Club in Wales. She teaches at Sonoma State University in the Hutchins School of Liberal Studies.

Joanne Kyger is a prominent figure in California's poetry scene. She writes poetry influenced by her practice of Zen Buddhism and her ties to the poets of Black Mountain, the San Francisco Renaissance, and the Beat Generation. Her recent collections include *2012*, and *About Now: Collected Poems* from the National Poetry Foundation. Recent writing, *On Time*, will be published by City Lights in spring 2015. She teaches at the Summer Writing program at Naropa University.

Michael McClure is a living legend. One of the poets who participated in the famous Six Gallery reading that featured the public debut of Allen Ginsberg's landmark poem *Howl*, he was immortalized by Jack Kerouac in his novel, *Big Sur*. A central figure of the Beat Generation, McClure collaborated with Wallace Berman and Bruce Conner and was later associated with San Francisco's psychedelic counterculture. Michael McClure has received numerous awards. At the age of eighty-one, he continues to reach new audiences through his poetry, plays, and performance. His recent publications include *Of Indigo and Saffron: New and Selected Poems* from UC Press, *Mysteriosos and other poems* from New Directions. In 2013, City Lights issued his *Ghost Tantras*, which originally saw print in 1964.

David Meltzer is the author of more than forty books of poetry and prose. Titles include *David's Copy: Selected Poems* (Penguin Poets) and *When I was a Poet* (City Lights Pocket Poets # 60.) He's also edited various anthologies including *San Francisco Beat: Talking With The Poets*, (City Lights), *Writing Jazz* (Mercury House), and *The Secret Garden: Anthology of the Classical Kabbalah* (Station Hill). He taught at SF State, The Urban School of San Francisco, Vacaville State Prison, and at New College of California in SF for over 30 years in both undergraduate Humanities & Graduate Poetics. In 2011 Meltzer was nominated for the Northern California Book Award in Poetry; he received the SF Bay Guardian 2011 award for Lifetime Achievement.

Created just for this event, for a one-time only screening, **Paul Swensen** has produced a short film: *You Will Have Unreal Recollections of Me*, using interviews as well as unique images from the collection of Brautigan's daughter Ianthe. Swensen's upcoming documentary, *Here Something Beautiful*, (ETC., co-directed by Anthony Lucero, is scheduled to be released in 2015.

Paul Swensen has worked in the San Francisco Bay Area for twenty years as a filmmaker and has written and produced several award winning television series, and regional commercials. He has produced and directed over 300 thirty-minute programs ranging from Italian Cuisine to Science and Religion for American Public Television and just finished directing Joanne Weir's latest series.

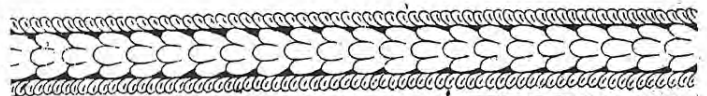

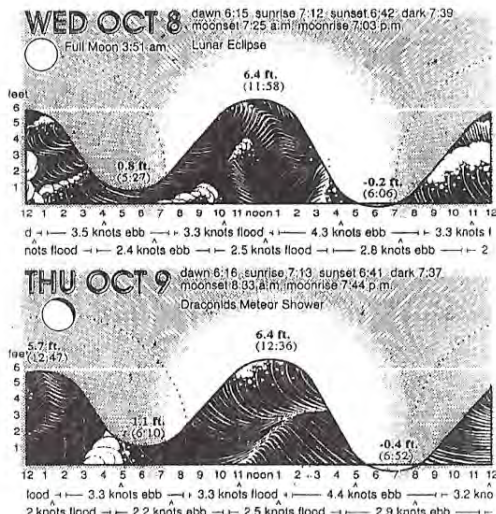

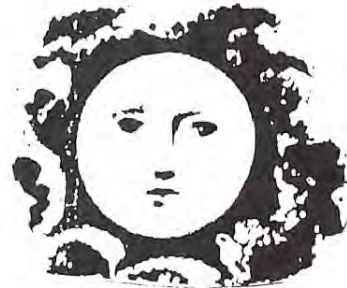
