## Deep Hanging out with Malcolm

Yesterday I had the pleasure of hanging out with Malcolm Margolin, the publisher of Heyday Press in Berkeley. Malcolm was in conversation with Michael Lerner and Steve Heilig at the New School at Commonweal.

Malcolm is like a wise tribal elder. Except his tribal background is a combination of his Jewish heritage, the hippie ethos of the 60's and his deep love of Native California. Malcolm is probably best known for writing "The Ohlone Way" a book about the Native Americans of the Bay Area. His subsequent book, "The Way We Lived" is also a chronicle of the original inhabitants of California. He also publishes "News From Native California" a quarterly magazine devoted to California's native people.

Malcolm's first book was "East Bay Out" a guide to exploring the natural beauty of the area. He wrote, typeset and published the book on his own, with some help from Stewart Brand of the Whole Earth Catalog. Malcolm distributed the book out of the back of his VW bus, selling "East Bay Out" to bookstores throughout Northern California. He decided that his next book should be on a regional subject because of the limited range of his VW bus, so he decided to write a book about the native Americans of the Bay Area, (The Ohlone Way.)

He fell in love with the native way, which he attributes to the fact that he was an Ohlone princess in a previous life. Much of yesterday's talk was about his experiences with California's original inhabitants. Like the native people, Malcolm used story-telling to describe his encounters. At one time there were 500 tribes in California with 100 different languages. "You had to learn a new language every 10 miles"

At one point he was demonstrating the guttural sounds of a certain tribal language. "Is this a podcast?" he asked, and then took great delight in enunciating gutturally into the microphone.

Malcolm praised the independent and vibrant diversity of the native Californians, and how they drew power and story from the land. He noted their intimate connection with nature, how the elderberry with trembling leaves was best for flutes, and how when the fruit of the elderberry ripened it was OK to collect shellfish.

He talked about publishing books at Heyday Press, which publishes 20-25 books a year. "I love the social aspects of the book," he said "the community of people that make and read the book. I love to read and to visit other people's minds."

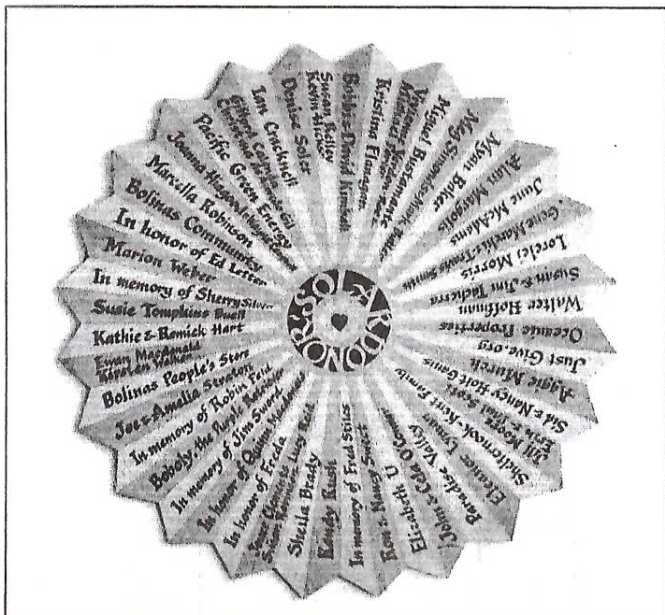

## WHAT IS MY ENEMY?

*My Enemy*, the vision and prayer of painter and healer Yisrael Feldsott, in collaboration with Dee O'Neal, and made manifest through the participation of many, is a cross-country, interactive pop-up art installation, seeking to soften and repair the divisions between friend and foe. It is a call to move through the world with more heart, even in places of conflict. *My Enemy*, while traveling across the United States, catches up to us, and asks that we consider the aspects of humanity that we all share. In putting onlookers behind enemy lines, *My Enemy* challenges us to consider the "other" as something more than different. It engages our beliefs about justice: across cultural and religious divides, among sexual, racial, and gender identities, toward wilderness sustainability, for prisoners and outcasts, and in viewing inequality. The art brings to focus the complexities we share, letting us find ways to dismantle the structures that isolate us in separation.

Feldsott's career of almost five decades has consistently revealed bold, confrontational work, from which it is nearly impossible to look away; the imposing, new installation is no exception. *My Enemy* consists of life-sized silhouetted figures, two inches thick and five feet tall, condemned, kneeling, and waiting for execution. Alongside them stand figures to suggest monks aflame, referencing the

protests on the streets of Saigon and Tibet. The backdrop, a series of five-foot by six-foot metal plates, bears words (in many languages) of relationship: *Father, Lover, Sister, Friend*. The installation, which the artist calls "s," is designed to challenge the notion of "us" and "them" and invites participation in parking lots, street corners, community centers, schools, houses of worship, galleries, and museums.

In these localities, starting with the core installation that Feldsott created, *My Enemy* asks you to conjure up your own enemies. The crew of *My Enemy* will provide blank figures at each stop, along with painting materials, inviting participants to summon up their own enemies. Painting figures to give their hatred, revulsion, or rage a voice and a physical embodiment, will add to the core installation. In this way, the traveling medicine road show will continue to grow and represent the voices of many. Accumulating and traveling with these painted figures is a vital part of the show; the interactive art suggests a reckoning place where a dialogue based in empathy might begin. *If the person across from me is as human as I am, how can I hate them so much?* The question starts the infusion of possible understanding and peace. As it expands, the traveling show gives priority to exploring and visualizing harm done in neighborhoods and populations across the nation. Active participating is the medicine itself and creates an atmosphere where we are all absorbed by the questions and responsible for the healing.

Feldsott's work with healing comes from the traditional shamanistic belief that reconciling with our enemy is essential to finding our own peaceful existence. Engaging with Feldsott's piece ignites that process of cease-fire, challenging the illusion of separation when we re-consider our understanding of the person we have grown to dislike, to de-sympathize, to hate or fear, to kill in wartime, or simply, to look away from in the grocery store.

The 'medicine show' shouts out to be installed in places where the label of *enemy* has famously led to the objectification—and, ultimately, the justification—of violence toward another. The installation will visit Laramie, Wyoming, near the site of Mathew Sheppard's murder; the Mexico-US border fence; the site of Trayvon Martin's murder in Florida; the legendarily intolerant Westboro Baptist Church in Kanas; Wounded Knee, near the Lakota Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota; Pelican Bay State Prison in Crescent City, California; New York City's site of Park51; and Jackson Hole, Wyoming, where heated conflict rages about the survival of wolves. It is precisely in the bitter, impassioned, and bloodied places—where damage, prejudice, and outrage have drawn breath—that *My Enemy* makes room for powerful questions and demonstrates a heartfelt willingness to enter into conversations.

Traveling with the installation will be a documentary film crew to capture the questions, answers, and reactions from participants and onlookers. As the exhibition travels across the country, the team will track the project's growth and impact through video and blogs on their website, [myenemy.org](http://myenemy.org). Upon conclusion of the 10,000-mile trip, filmmakers Annie Micayla, Miles Feld, and Keith Evans will create a feature-length documentary to honor the diverse group of people in assorted cities and landscapes who are involved. The documentary film expands on this age-old divisive story, seeking to show new paths of healing and recording moments of human connection and triumph.

At the root of all hatred is the idea that we are somehow different, so Feldsott begins a healing dialogue by posing the question: *Can we then justify violence against someone who is perhaps more similar to us than not?* In answering this question, as *My Enemy* covers many miles across the country, wide-range opportunities arise to address the isolation, injuries, and responsibilities in our post-modern world. This is Feldsott's peace offering: ceremonial paintings that inclusively invite anyone who chooses to participate in painting, talking, considering forgiveness, and spreading the word. Feldsott sparks a public ritual to consider the humanity of "our enemy," in an innovative effort to bring us closer toward the ancient idea of connectedness.
