Most spiritual leaders apprenticed for the majority of their lives before beginning their practice. In many parts of the world, elders are honored and respected for the wisdom they have gained through life experience. They are considered to be a valuable source of knowledge and have an important role to fulfill in passing on traditions and customs.

In many corners of the globe, nursing homes for the elderly are rare. Caring for one's aging parents is considered an honor and a blessing. In other cultures it is not uncommon for three or four generations to live together under one roof. Immediate families consist of children, parents, grandparents, great-grandparents, and sometimes great-aunts and great-uncles. Such intergenerational coexistence is beneficial to all. Respected for their life experience and wisdom, African elders serve as mediators between deceased ancestors and living family members.

Honoring and respecting our elders is a way of building community and strengthening society. It helps us appreciate every stage of life and view aging in a positive light. After all, hopefully we ourselves will have the opportunity to become sages in our later years.

Interview with Chloe McCollum

Tell us what you're doing

We're going to Vietnam to build a house for a family- in-need with Habitat for Humanity. I went last year with my dad Jesse and our team leader Paul Mann. We built a house. It took about 2 weeks. We met in Ho Chi Minh City and travelled to Lon Ahn with our team of 9 people. We met the family and others we would be working with. One guy from Habitat spoke English.

We were working in rice paddies building for the last family in Lon Ahn without a real house. Their last house was made out of sticks. The house we built was made out of bricks. Everything is built out of bricks

So you're going back. Why?

One of the most amazing experiences of my life. It's important to me to use my privilege to help. Paul and his group were my age during the Vietnam War and it was inspiring to see them reconnect. There's nothing like working in the mud to actually be "in country."

How can we help?

My commitment to the program is \$1700. Each member raises that amount which pays for the house to be built and feeding the volunteers. The plane ticket is extra. We're having a dinner and a show to raise funds at the Community Center on Saturday, Nov. 10 in the evening. My mom (Emilee) and Ben will be playing. My uncle David (Polo) might come. I'll be cooking.

Any last thoughts for Hearsay readers?

The idea of the global village is really beautiful, and coming from such a strong village connection, I feel called to sharing that.

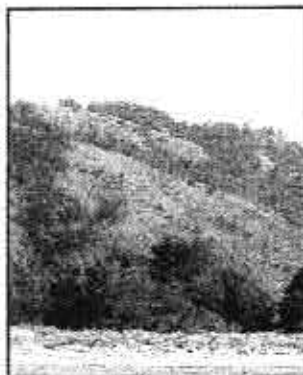

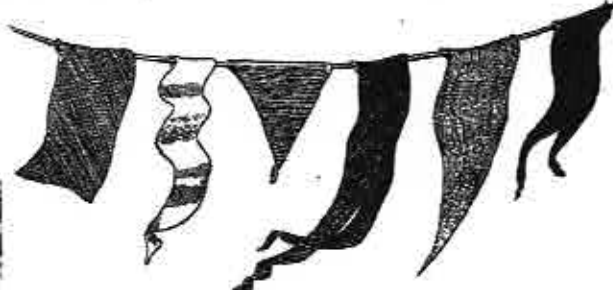

Wednesday, October 31st is the deadline for the grant applications. Applications can be emailed to info@sbcfgrants.org, or mailed to S/BCF, P.O. Box 367, Stinson Beach, CA 94970 (postmarked on or before 10/31/18), or you can hand your application to me at my work or in the street any time before next Wednesday.

The Stinson/Bolinas Community Fund provides grant funds to individuals and/or organizations that apply for projects or programs that directly benefit the communities of Bolinas or Stinson Beach. The maximum amount of funding awarded is \$3000.00 per grant cycle. There are two grant cycles per year, one in the Spring and one in the Fall.

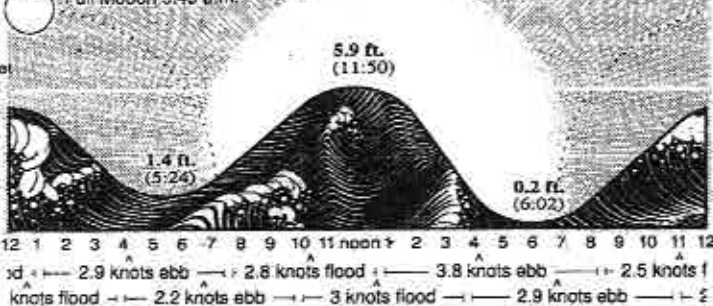

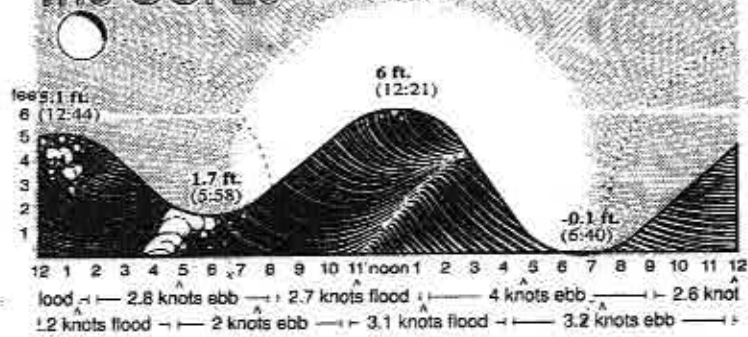
