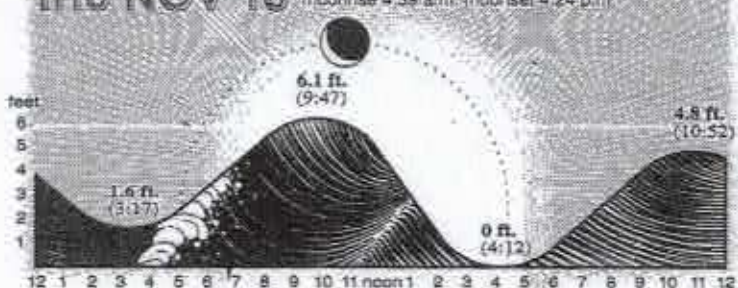

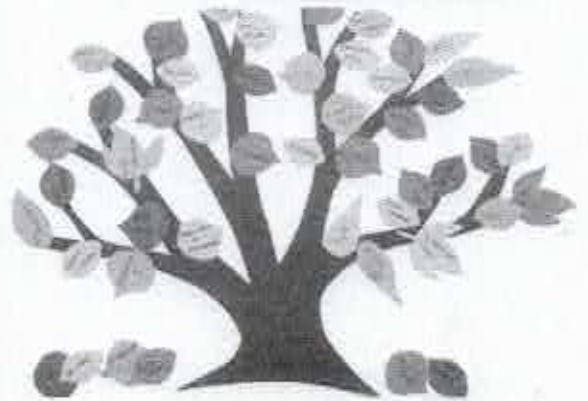

11 Wharf Restaurant Review

We've all had those moments of musing when a lifestyle redesign seems like a great idea, although rarely do these dreamy diversions from our real world seem to come to fruition. But with Eleven Wine Bar Bistro in Bolinas, the reverie became a restaurant, drummed up when sisters Kate Sterlin, a photographer and interior designer, and Rebecca Sterlin, a graphic designer, restaurant manager and caterer, were vacationing in Mexico. It was there that they decided to join forces and go into business together, and when the 1890s building at 11 Wharf Road became available, they made their move and brought their vision to life.

The idyllic, historic home rises on a small knoll in the town's center, twinkling beneath strings of lights covering terraced outdoor seating areas. With the help of their brother, Matt, a Bolinas builder, it took almost 2½ years to bring the building that was once home to Wild Rose restaurant and Blue Heron Inn to its present design-trendy farmhouse finish. The well-appointed set of rooms offer spaces for a range of patrons. It's a familial atmosphere that fosters inclusivity.

During the day, Eleven beckons with the scent of oven-baked goods wafting from kitchen to sidewalk. The wine bar/restaurant is by day a bakery, having just opened for coffee and sweets during the week of the Wine Country fires, when it became a comforting refuge. Selections might include blueberry muffins with molasses and honey, currant scones, crustless quiche, cinnamon brioche rolls and a seasonal galette.

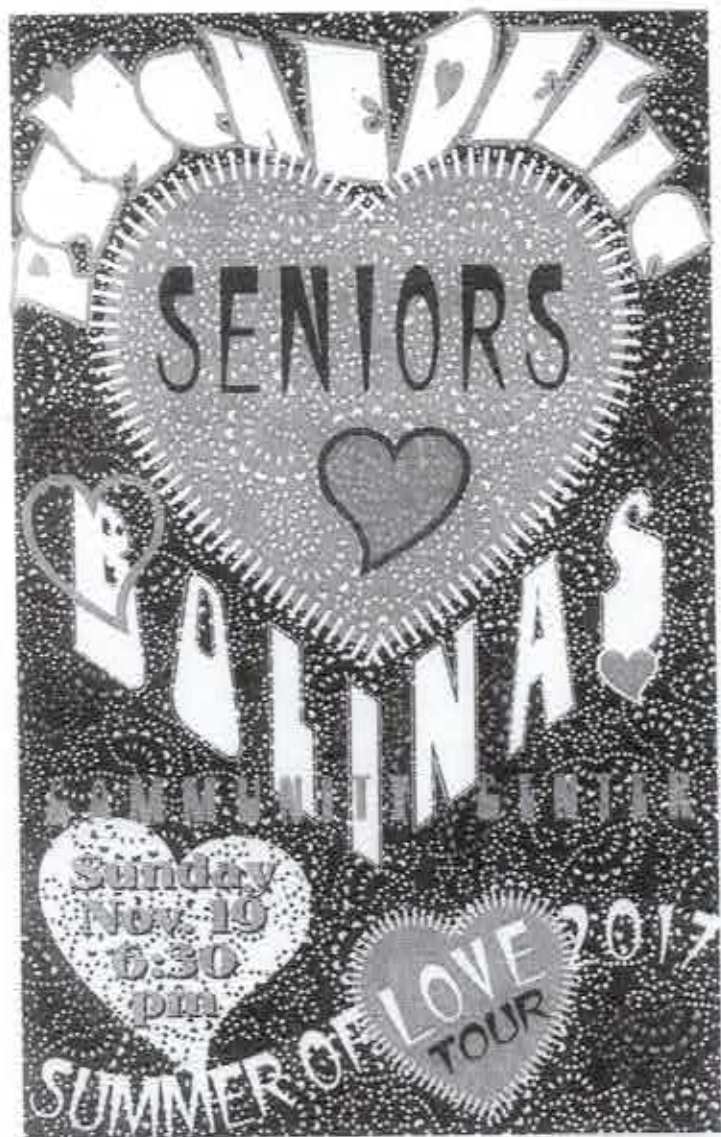
