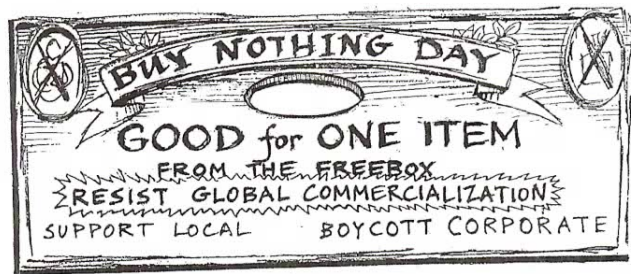

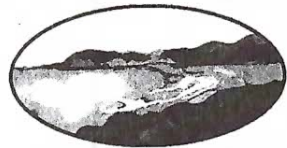

MESA PARK BOARD MEETING

October 14, 2013 7:00 PM

Bolinas Firehouse

Call to Order: 7:05

Members present: Bryan Lee, Patricia Hickey, Jane Mickelson, Dylan Squires

Others: Ed Chiera, Syd Bass, Angela Vernon, Julia Maxwell, Vic Amoroso, Anita Brown, John Bryant

Community Expression: [Vic] You're on the agenda for Wed. PM at BPUD mtg. to request the water meter transfer. [Bryan] May we move it to Nov. if necessary? [Vic] Yes. [Bryan] We want to have everything complete with documentation.

[Julia] Requests to know where the parcel tax money goes. Also, I like to sell at the DT park & have heard that there are measures against. [Patricia] The parcel tax just covers the maintenance here. [Bryan] the funds are only for the MP. [Patricia] As for the vending, in terms of opening it up, there's a concern with the location of the stands. [Bryan] We've asked that vendors to please come to the monthly meeting and ask for permission to vend. [Vic] When the country passed an ordinance for street vending, we fought to allow vending in front of the BCC. The county accepted it. [Julia] Is there now a set of rules? I don't think we need to adopt any more than we need to. [Bryan] There needs to be some recourse to avoid problematic situations. We're working with the county to set up sensible regulations.

Discussion with Fire Chief & fire board members concerning the requested hook-up with the Firehouse/Clinic sewer system: procedures, financial obligations. [Ed] Director of the fire protection board, Syd Bass is also a director. We're here to express concern about tying into the sewer line here by the FH; we have an agreement with the lift-station maintenance. We'd like to bring our concern to you in some areas that we feel need to be resolved. [Anita] When we were working with MP originally it was thought good to have bathrooms. In 2008 we signed an agreement for the maintenance of the lift station. Coastal Health Alliance & FH would share expenses until MP came on line whereupon MP would cover 1/3 of the cost. Since then we've learned more about the system: there's annual expenses to operate the system. The sewer line runs along the fence, and meets up at the lift station. The pumps turn out to be very delicate & easily plugged, which breaks the pumps. It's very expensive to repair them. It costs about \$1000 per year for the clinic & FH to run the station. MP would cover 1/3. The pump replacement can run \$10,000 to \$15,000. It's all shared 3 ways unless there's clear evidence that someone using MP is responsible for damage. We're concerned about flow rates. Each agency is responsible. for putting aside a certain amount of money each year, and we need to have MP do likewise in a similar way. There is a cistern that would need to be pumped out to clean out the litter. [Ed] One thing we've discussed is to look at putting in a grinder that would grind up anything flushed down, or put in a catchment area. [Anita] You would need to have some oversight. [Bryan] I have my packet from the county with the comments, and will add a compartment and a grinder in the grant project. I've found pumps for \$5200 each. The problem will be coming up with that reserve. [Anita] We maintain the system each week and so far there haven't been too any problems. We have to be very careful because it's a shared facility. And the

proposed pool will have to have its own sewer hook up. Our next step is for you to look at the agreement; it needs to be up-dated. [Bryan] When I resubmit the plans to the county I'll add the receptor tank, which is about \$1200. [Anita] Once you've brought the agreement up to date, bring it to the FH and clinic.

Downtown Park: [Angela] We've had some problems. The cob oven has been used, even though it's not finished. There has been vandalism to the cob. There's been a lot of cooking happening there, using the ash box below the oven, and leftover rubbish. The oven really needs to be finished. In the plans they included a sink and tables & benches. [Bryan] It was meant to be for community events. [Angela] There are a lot of cobbles still piled there. [Bryan] We need to contact Roger and request he comes to the next meeting. [Patricia] Could you make us a list of what needs to be done for it to be finished? [Angela] Roger has lists. We've been waiting to see where people walk so we can put in paths, and I'd like to get some heavy flat stones to place a path. [Bryan] I'll call Roger tomorrow. [Patricia] We need to meet with you & Roger at the park and see exactly what's going on. [Dylan] I can meet with Roger & you on Friday morning. [Vic] The water use was \$620. [Angela] That brings it down by half.

Maintenance Report: [Patricia] I walked around MP last week. The bleachers behind the skate park are in good shape, while the ones by the softball field are rotting. Can we swap them out? [Bryan] If the old ones are a

hazard, they should be pulled out. [Patricia] Also, the rats in the containers are really bad. Every time they take out the mowers the rats run out. It would also be nice to pick out the new ground cover for playground.

Irrigation Report: [Bryan] Everything's out to the agencies. The issue of tying into the sewer system at FH was the biggest issue now. We need now to walk the site with Geoff Geupel; they'll accept his report on environmental concerns. I talked with the county about reimbursement status. They now want everything to be finished before reimbursement. We need to treat the coastal permit as a separate project. I can appeal that to Roy Givens, and will. We're in the process of communicating with the state towards final approval. [John] For the bathroom you need the water meter transfer. I can get the application to you. [Dylan]: I make a motion to authorize Bryan to sign the application for the water meter transfer. [Jane]: I second. All aye. [John] We've been waiting for several families to have a fundraiser for seed money. After the election, we'll go forward.

Treasurer's Report: We came in about 15% under budget for the park, and some property tax revenue came in from Marin county, as a tax return. DT park expenditure was lower this month. [Vic et al] Discussion of the possibility of sinking a well to water DT park.

Up-date on election status: [Jane] The information letter on Measure I went out. Thanks to the helpers who labeled, stuffed, and sealed more than 950 letters, one to each registered voter. Now everyone needs to call friends, inform & encourage. I'll need help making posters, and will be giving an informational talk at White Caps this Thursday. [Patricia] I can call Dieter Tremp and the youth soccer coach and get the names of the parents. Jane will meet Patricia on election day & check the voter lists, then call to remind folks to vote.

Other

Approve Warrants: Bryan moves, Jane 2nd, all aye.

Approve Minutes: Bryan moves to approve, Dylan 2nd, all aye.

Next meeting: Tuesday, Nov. 12, due to long holiday weekend.

Meeting adjourned: 8:24 PM

Re: Opposing the Aerial Broadcasting of Rodenticides on the South Farallon Islands as Proposed in the Draft EIS for the Invasive House Mouse Eradication Project, Farallon National Wildlife Refuge, California

To Whom It May Concern:

On behalf of the Bolinas Community Public Utility District ("BCPUD"), I am writing this letter to express the opposition of many people in our community to the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service's proposed aerial broadcasting of rodenticides on the South Farallon Islands to eradicate the non-native house mice. Bolinas is a small, unincorporated community in West Marin and is located approximately 26 miles east of the Farallon Islands - many of our community members eat seafood harvested nearby the Farallons and feel a strong connection to these islands. At the most recent monthly meeting of the BCPUD Board of Directors on November 20, 2013, community members appealed to the Board to submit this letter to express their concerns.

We understand that the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service seeks to address a very challenging problem: specifically, the presence of large densities of house mice populations on the South Farallon Islands which are causing ecological damage and threatening the population of Ashy Storm-Petrels (because the mice have attracted Burrowing Owls to the islands and these owls feed on small Storm-Petrels when the populations of mice decline in the winter months). However, the broad-scale application of rodenticides to eradicate the house mice may only make a bad problem worse. Rodenticides such as Brodifacoum-25D and Diphacinone-50 are extremely toxic to all birds, mammals and aquatic life - not just house mice - as such, there is a high potential that the aerial broadcast of these rodenticides could harm the numerous non-target species that inhabit the islands and surrounding waters. Indeed, it is our understanding that recent past aerial rodenticide eradication projects have resulted in precisely such unintended consequences (e.g., Rat Island).

In light of the serious potential for harm posed by the use of these toxic products, we urge the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service *not* to proceed with the aerial broadcast of rodenticides on the South Farallon Islands, but rather to employ a responsible, non-toxic and environmentally sustainable approach to mice eradication. Thank you very much for your consideration of our comments.

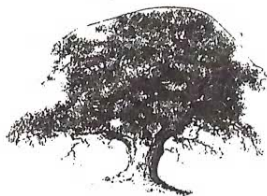

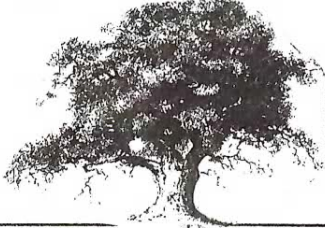
