A COMMUNITY OF THANKS TO ILKA HARTMANN

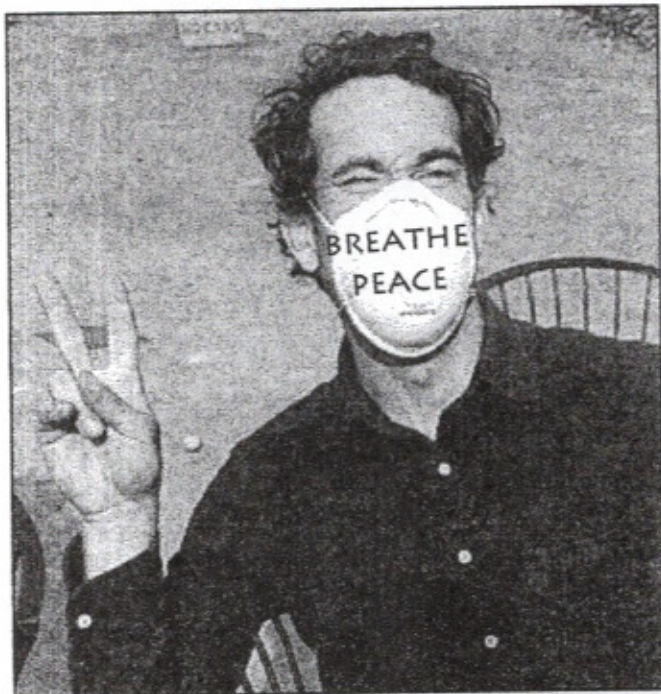

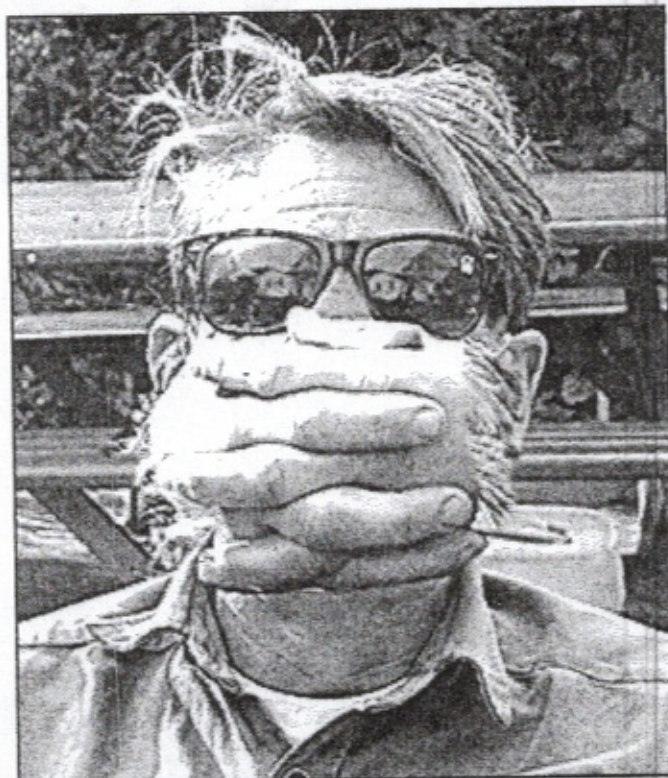

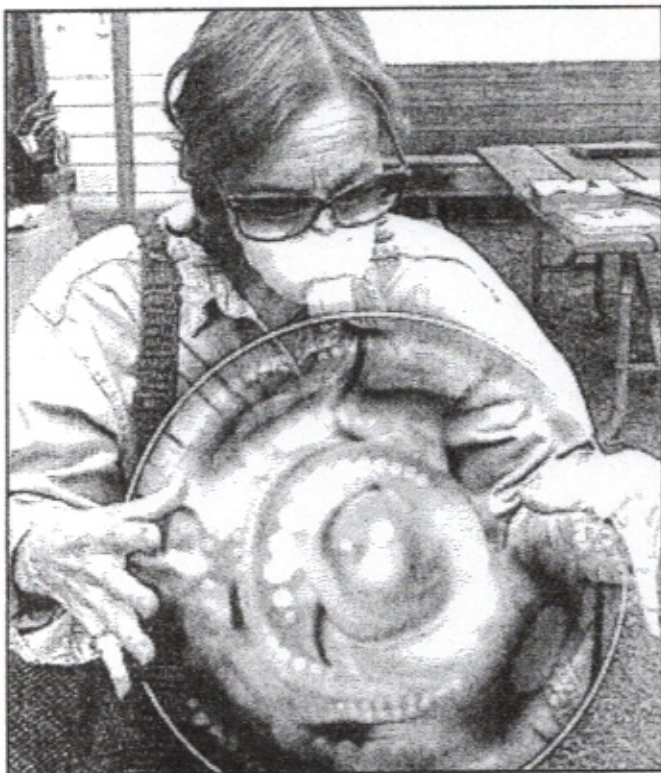
