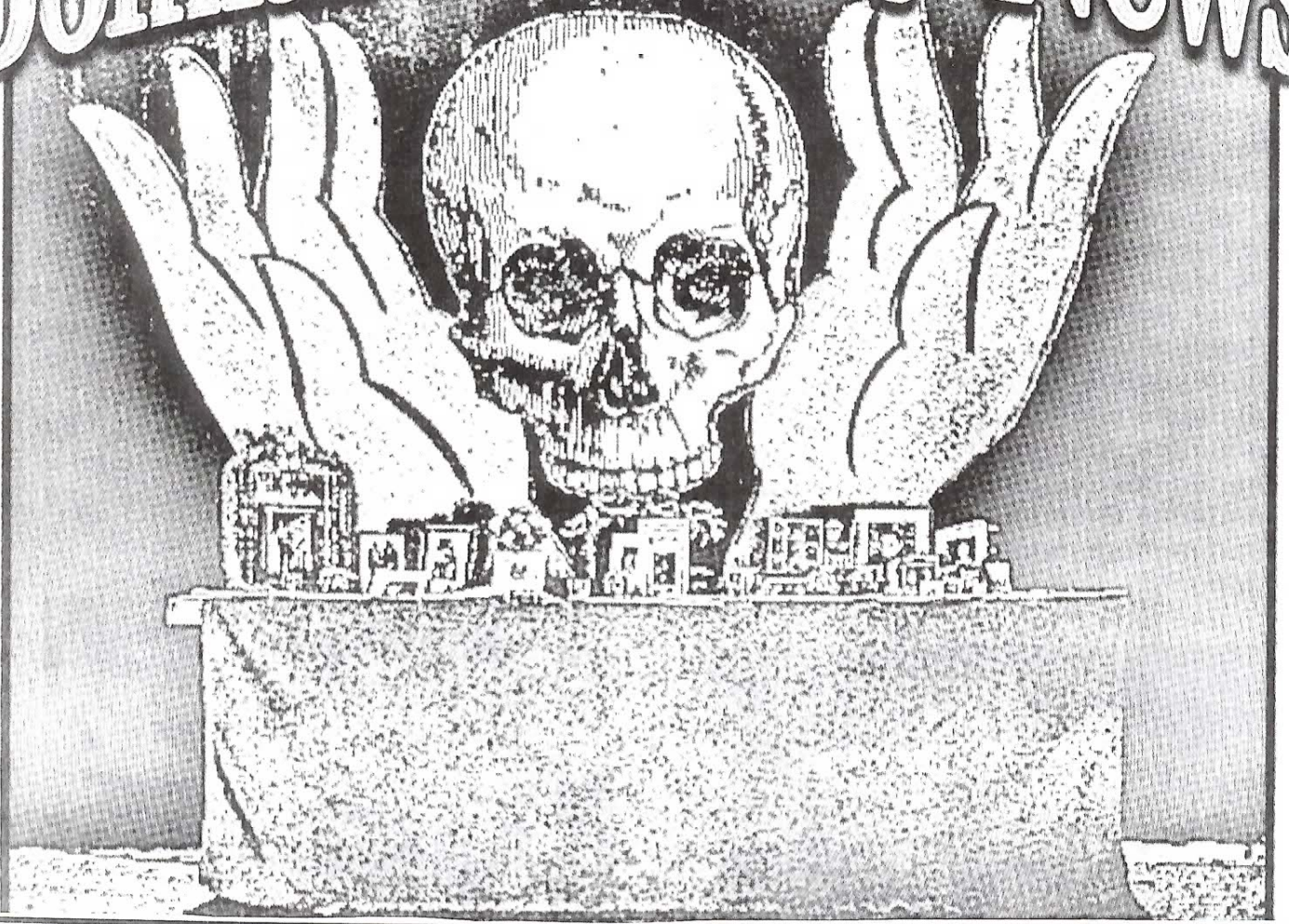

Dia de los Muertos

Thursday afternoon, Halloween, I was scheduled to build the altar for Dia de los Muertos on the stage at the Community Center. Halloween is the gringo holiday that's celebrated on October 31st with costumes and trick or treat. Dia de los Muertos takes place on November 1st and 2nd, and is observed throughout Mexico and Guatemala.

Actually November 1st is called Dia de los Angelitos (Little Angels) and it honors children who died and people taken suddenly in tragic accidents. Families spend the night of November 1st in the graveyard honoring the dead.

I woke up Thursday morning with an image of the altar I wanted to build. I pictured the big skull (which I had painted previously) flanked by two uplifted hands, as if someone was beseeching God. I'm not sure how the image arrived in my mind, but I knew that the skull and hands was a big, dramatic statement that would read well up on the stage of the Community Center.

It was relatively easy to construct the skull and hands. On Halloween I kept the stage curtain closed and the next day I had lots of help dressing the set.

Magi helped set up tables and arrange the marigolds and candles. Annabel had arranged to have one of her workers purchase the flowers at the Farmer's Market.

Jennie brought a collection of Hearsays. Each edition featured a local notable who had passed. June brought delicious homemade soup, made from a big squash donated by Annabel.

Amelia arrived in elaborate costume and make-up looking like Lady Death. Jessica brought the voodoo spirit of New Orleans.

Martine brought her drum and we sang songs and told ghost stories.

I told my story of being assailed by a ghost one morning at the Gibson House. I was dozing and enjoying a peaceful Sunday morning when suddenly a dark presence

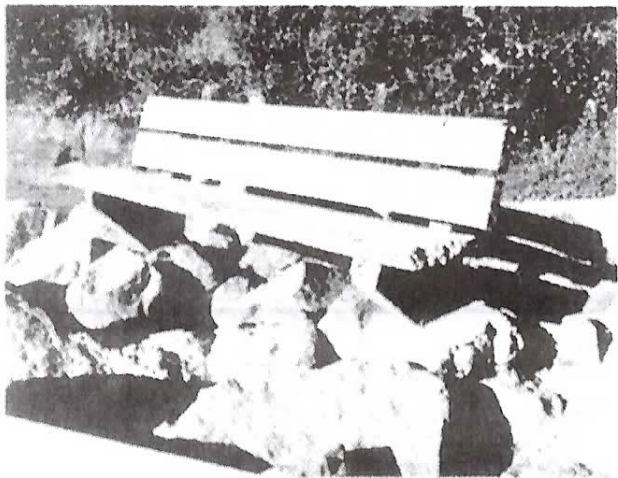
OLD BENCH. NEW BENCH

The wonderful old bench that sat on the promontory at the end of Wharf Road for over forty years has been replaced. The beautiful new, all-cement bench has been anchored securely in the exact, spot where the old bench was. The new bench has also been lowered so that one's feet rest comfortably on the rocks below, instead of dangling loose in the air as they did before! All the arduous work to accomplish this difficult operation was done under the orchestration of Ed Pohlman and some of the hearty Briones Lions' Club members (All aforementioned in the 4th of October's Hearsay!). Many of the high rocks of riprap, leading to the bench, have been hammered down creating easier access to the bench. (Annie Crotts told me that sand once covered all those rocks until washed away by erosion!)

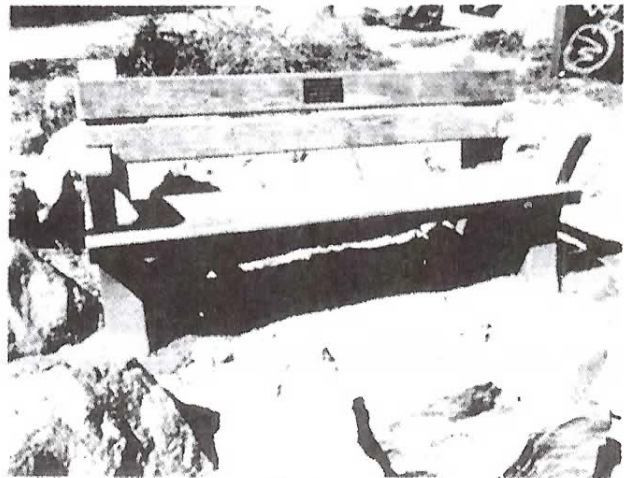
The bench was placed there as a memorial to Rita, Charley Ehmann's wife, who passed away last year and "wanted her ashes to be scattered in the lagoon". Rita and Charley were married in Saint Aidan's Episcopal Church and both their children were baptized there. Liz Grace (Ehmann) told me.

The bench has long been a Sacred place for quiet Meditation, for observing the in-out flow of the tides, for enjoying the sea-life of birds and seals, or watching the tug-o-war between Stinson and Bolinas on the fourth of July.

Most gracious thanks to Charley Ehmann for the new bench and all those who worked so hard to bring the project to fruition! It could not be more perfect!

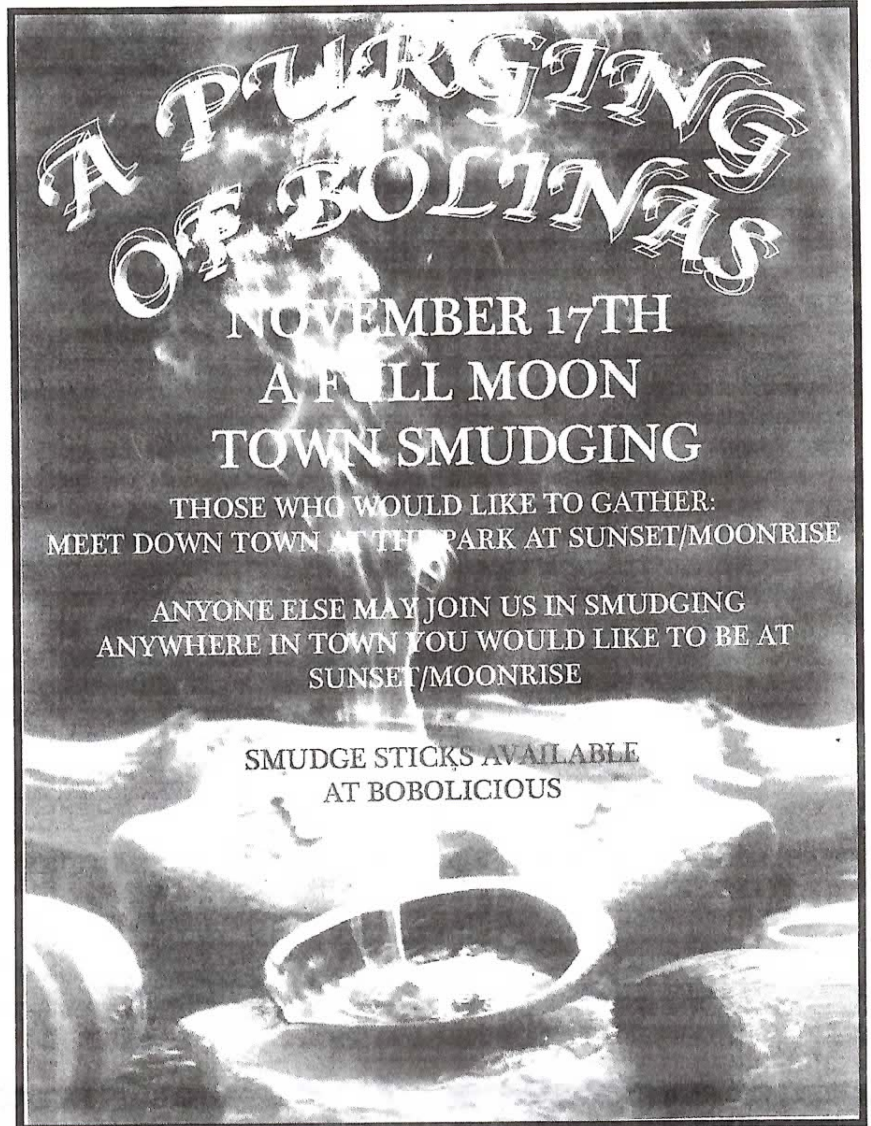
TIM WEED BAND, CD RELEASE CELEBRATION

jumped on top of me. I suspected immediately that it was a phantom figure. It held me down and I struggled to break free but the ghost was stronger than I was.

Desperate for a solution I decided to humor the ghost. Instead of continuing to struggle I began to pantomime dancing with the ghost. I sang "Cha Cha Cha" as I moved my arms in rhythm. The ghost caught on immediately and we started to dance together instead of struggle.

After doing the Cha Cha with the ghost for quite a while, I fell back exhausted. The shadowy form bent down and whispered in my ear "nice rhythm" and then released me. I woke up in time to see the dark form dematerialize. It reminded me of pixels dissolving in a digital image.

What is a ghost anyway? Some say ghosts are disembodied souls lost between here and the hereafter. Jessica mentioned emotional resonances.

My lesson was to learn to dance with the dead.

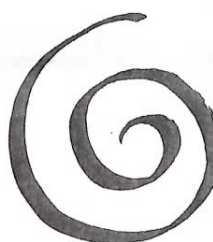

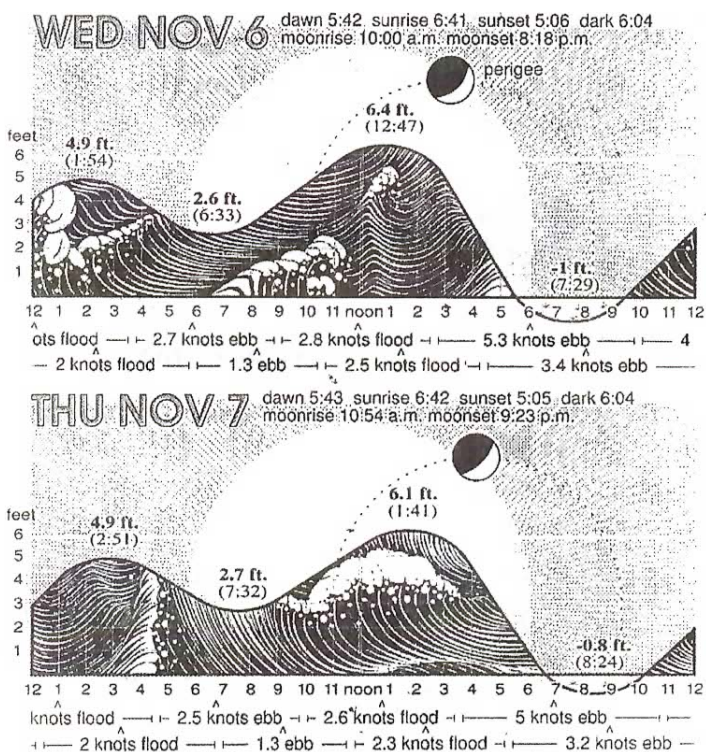
Halloween - Friday Hearsay Editor Jeffrey was well costumed as a bamboo plant

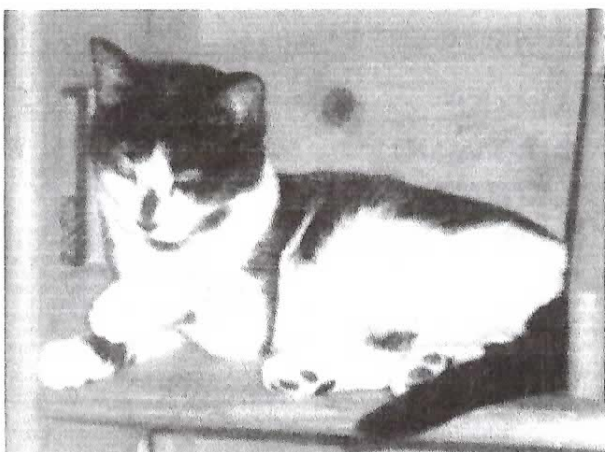
