The Bench

Saturday was chilly and clear as we gathered to dedicate the Peter Warshall Memorial Bench on the sewer pond land. Someone remarked that it was time to find another name for the sewer pond land.

It was fitting however that a bench dedicated to Peter Warshall was on the sewer pond land, since he was instrumental in its creation.

The site for the bench is well chosen. Two footpaths commingle right beyond the bench and the bench is well away from the spray fields.

Chuck Oakander sculpted the bench from a cypress trunk that was felled in a windstorm in Dogtown. Chuck is an avid surfer and he included a peeling waveform in the back rest of the bench. Perhaps you've seen Chuck do a headstand on his surfboard while riding a wave. He did a similar headstand on the bench.

To christen the bench Chuck used a big propane torch to heat a branding iron that was made in the shape of a turtle. He then branded the end of the bench. The turtle was Peter's totem animal.

We gathered in a circle and observed a moment of silence for "Watershed" Warshall. Then we headed down to the Community Center for remembrances and stories about his life.

The GrandMother Drum, a seven foot diameter, kettle shaped drum was born at 4:00 am on June 5, 2001, after thirteen years of prayer, ceremony and physical labor by the Alaskan community.

The vision of the GrandMother Drum was received from indigenous Grandmothers as the first international, multicultural, interactive "world drum" dedicated to promoting Unity, Peace and Life, healing the separation between all Earth's children. According to many traditional prophecies, "when the grandmothers begin to speak, the earth will heal."

According to these Grandmothers, we are in conflict outside because we are in conflict inside. Healing, they say, must happen within ourselves first. World peace can happen only through inner peace, becoming that which we are seeking outside ourselves. The GrandMother Drum is a living, beating symbol from the hearts of the grandmothers that we are all one people, that Mother Earth is our one country, that love is stronger than fear and that peace and freedom are the birthrights of all humanity.

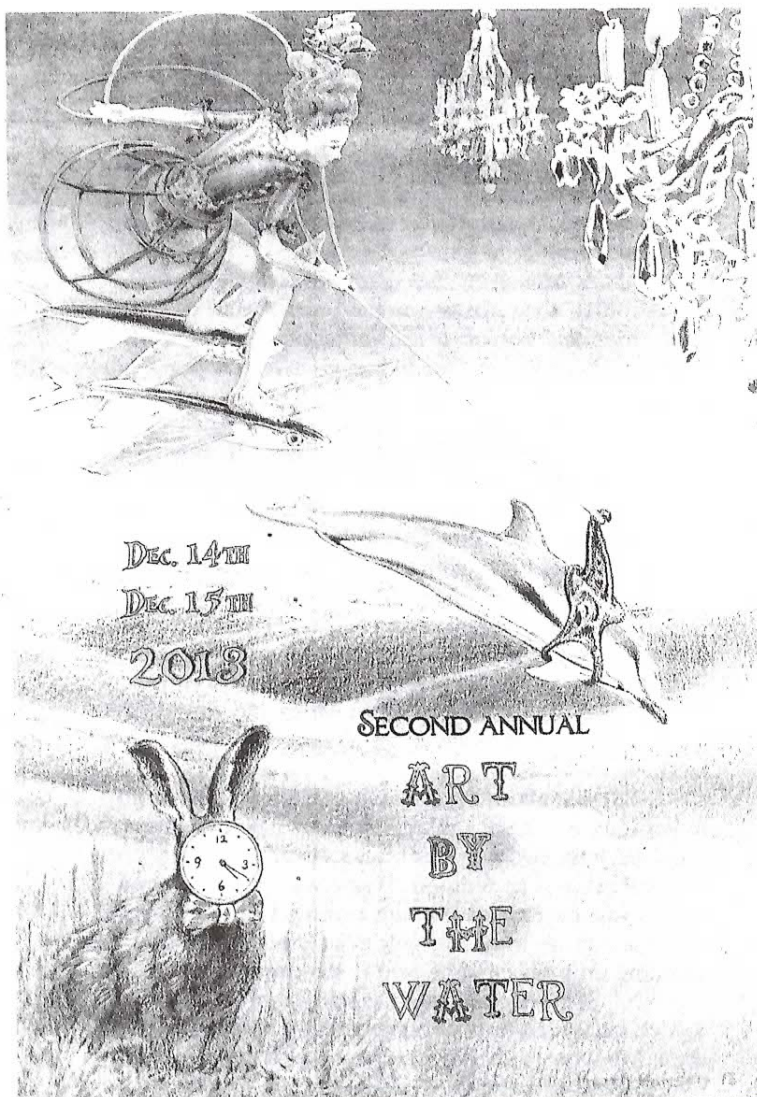

The Man Made To Film Mandela

Touched by leader since childhood

Nearly 50 years ago, when Bolinas filmmaker Jo Menell was a kid on a bike, he met Africa's most famous man, Nelson Mandela, under circumstances that left an indelible mark.

Now Menell, 59, has made what many consider the definitive documentary on the South African president, "Mandela: Son of Africa, Father of a Nation," which premieres Saturday at the San Francisco International Film Festival.

The film, nominated for an Academy Award, offers a rare glimpse of Mandela through archival footage and on-camera interviews. "Mandela" was co-directed by noted South African filmmaker Angus Gibson and produced by director Jonathan Demme ("Philadelphia," "Silence of the Lambs"). Island Records founder Chris Blackwell financed the film.

"I'll never forget seeing Nelson Mandela for the first time," said Menell in his small backyard office on the Bolinas mesa, where he has lived for the last 18 years.

Menell was born in South Africa and would go home to visit while on break from boarding school in England.

"I was about the only white kid who gravitated toward black culture, and on Saturdays near my parents' home (in Johannesburg) the blacks would hold these big political rallies," he recalled. "There were speakers, music -- it was the only excitement around. I would ride my bike there to see what was going on. One day this guy was standing on a table and he said to the crowd:

"It is very important to stress that we don't want to kick the whites out of his country. We don't want to kill them. We want to share with them. I wish they would attend one of our meetings to hear what we have to say."

SINGLED OUT FROM CROWD

"Then," said the filmmaker, the son of a mining industrialist, "the guy looked straight at me, the only white around. I was just sitting on my bike, and he said, 'Like that young man there. He should go to his mother and his father and tell them to come and listen to what we have to say.'

"I turned scarlet, and remember feeling completely self-conscious and somehow blessed at the same time."

That guy, of course, was Mandela, the bookish yet determined political fighter.

Years later Menell was again touched by Mandela. In 1962, the filmmaker was just starting his career as a documentarian for the British Broadcasting Corp. and read in the London Observer that Mandela had been sentenced to prison for political crimes.

"I felt somehow I knew him personally, and I think then and there I resolved, somewhere deep in my psyche, to find out everything I could about him."

Menell's interest was kept alive through a distinguished career as a BBC director-producer, and even during several years when he quit to sail around the world in

his 46-foot gaff-rigged ketch, Fiona.

"My parents had a farm near Cape Town, and from there you could see Robben Island where Mandela was a prisoner. I used to gaze out there for hours just thinking about him, like a legend."

BANNED FROM SOUTH AFRICA

Menell was not a popular man in South Africa during apartheid. He was banned from the country for 20 years for making a blistering documentary about conditions that kept blacks down.

"The government wouldn't even let me attend my father's funeral," Menell said.

When Mandela was freed after 27 years, Menell said he was watching the morning news on "my little black and white TV in the kitchen" of his Bolinas home.

"I frantically sat there adjusting the rabbit ears, and suddenly there was a fantastic shot of him, a frail but amazingly composed man with his arm upraised. I never thought I'd live to see that, and tears rolled down my face." Menell knew then he would take the advice he got years ago as a kid on a bike and tell the world about Nelson Mandela.

'MANDELA'

"Mandela: Son of Africa, Father of a Nation" will screen at 7 p.m. Saturday at the Kabuki Theatre, with the filmmaker on hand, and at 1 p.m. Wednesday at the Kabuki. It will also play at 11:30 a.m. May 10 and 11 at the Roxie Cinema.
