

SEEING BEYOND THE UNKNOWN

the world around us.

When we understand that possessions are only representations of energy at work in our lives, we are able to shift our attention to the right and proper place. We can stop fearing loss of money or success because once we know how it is created, we can always create more. We can stop fearing loss of material objects because we realize that they are not the source of our joy or well-being, but only loing on our cakes. And when we understand the energy of love, we need not hold anyone too close for fear of losing them, for we know that this emotion does not diminish when it is given or shared, but rather expands beyond boundaries of time and space.

By focusing our light on our fears, they are reveiled as mere shadows that disappear in the presence of mind and spirit. We can choose instead to direct our thoughts and creative power toward things of true value- love, abundance, peace, passion, and joy. These are energies that are always available to us when we place ourselves confidently in the uni-

versal flow of abundance.



The Tie Guy

Shared a booth at the Winter Faire with Kathleen. We were selling t-shirts, roadsigns, watercolors, bo-flashlights, carved wooden dolphins and recycled neckties from the Freebox.

The neckties were stenciled with words and images to renew their appeal. The recyclers call it "up-cycling".

Very few people wear neckties anymore, especially in Bolinas. Ties are abandoned in the Freebox, where I collect them and try to make art out of them. My aim is to transform symbols of corporate bondage into banners of artistic freedom.

It's not easy because ties are generally ugly.

They're not meant to be pretty. Business is not pretty. The corporate business world is about functionality, hard work and servility. The necktie is the perfect symbol of bondage to corporate culture.

This year for fun, I stenciled "BONDAGE" on some ties. My hope was to coattail on the "50 Shades of Grey" trend - neckties hitched to the bedpost if you know what I mean. But the bondage ties didn't sell.

To commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Summer of Love I stenciled "LOVE" on a bunch of ties. Kathleen took some of the ties and embellished them with gorgeous, psychedelic color, and the LOVE ties became beautiful talismans of the Summer of Love.

Kathleen designed a label that pictured alternative fashion statements for neckties: corporate, hippy, artistic and casual,

A different, necktie fashion statement came my way. Months ago someone found a skirt made from neckties in the Freebox. They gave the skirt to me and challenged me to wear it at the Freebox Follies. But I thought, why not wear the tie skirt while selling ties at the Winter Faire?

The skirt of ties was heavy like a kilt. It made me feel like a wild Scottish warrior wearing a skirt of corporate scalps. At the same time the kilt flounced and swayed as I sashayed around the plaza - good balance of yin and yang.

Yes. I'm the tie guy wearing a tie kilt, and my aim is to transform corporate bondage into joyful, artistic freedom.


