The Weekender

Atticus Finch was my favorite hero in youth. He exuded eloquence, empathy and integrity as a lawyer and because of his character I read *To Kill A Mockingbird* repeatedly. Then I grew up and became aware of the real deal - Tony Serra. This weekend, in a rare and special moment I got the privilege to meet him and see him fervently share his thoughts about life and justice at a reception in his honor at 11 Wharf Road.

It happened on Saturday evening and it was a lovely hodgepodge gathering of community people. A row of drummers at the garden entrance started the evenings revolutionary vibe. Ilka Hartman's photographs of political activists covered the walls; visual reminders to keep our fight for freedom, fairness, free speech and justice alive. Delicious soups, cookies and wines flowed freely. People gathered in two's and three's, eating, sharing stories, and cheer together. There was an air of anticipation as people filled the space and gradually congregated around Tony who chilled on a bench seat with friends. He was wild, wonderful and robust looking with his long white hair, missing teeth, expression of amusement, white knit beret, crazy colorful sweater, and SF Giants/ Grateful Dead shirt, at nearly 80 years old so much life energy appeared to be surging in and around him.

I was turned on to Tony about 15 years ago when my boyfriend wistfully yearned, "I want Tony Serra's help". At the time he was in a lot of trouble, his state marijuana case had morphed into a Federal case with a mandatory minimum of 5-10 years in prison. With my encouragement (nagging, really) he called up Tony's law offices in San Francisco and voila! the firm happily took on his case at a small fraction of the price his first lawyer was charging. A year and a half later the case closed on a mere misdemeanor charge. Tony's good work (life's karma) spared my mate from the cruel senselessness of a mandatory minimum, and from life in a steel cage in Federal prison. The ultimate silver lining to this little story is he went onto to receive an ivy league education that allowed him to become environmental warrior - a scientist specializing in botany, disease ecology and environmental management.

Before Tony spoke he was introduced by Tom Hagan, the reception's host, and by Tony's best friend who shared some pretty funny and heartfelt stories about Tony 'the tripper' and Tony 'the trial lawyer'. Then Tony spoke. Tony's oratory skills are mesmerizing. He spoke to us about his anger and delight in receiving a reception - he called it pre-mortom and made it very clear to us that he still has a lot of living and fighting in him. He spoke fondly of Bolinas, of the LSD experiences he had with his friends here, of the great woman and mother of his five children who were raised here, and of the community that inspired him with their radical expressions of freedom, life and love. He waxed on about the justice system (which more or less sounded like an injustice system) and the changes he's been witnessing as an 'insider'.

Tony Serra gave us food for thought, causes to consider, issues to rise up against: the secretive and totalitarian power of grand juries; the grotesque, unchecked, and excessive power of the executive branch; the terrifying breadth of our ever increasing informant society united in force with a cryptic justice system. He reminded us that our local police forces are fasly becoming militarized and that a police state could become a real state in the near future. And he told us not to forget that our justice system is designed to protect those with wealth and power, affording freedom to those who can afford to pay a dedicated defense team.


At the end of the evening my date said to me, "That was awesome! It was like a freestyle poetry jam". I totally agreed. Tony ended his parlance in a self depreciative tale that compared the expressions of semantic warriors - those of the free flying poets to those of the desperately damaged and striving lawyers - he humbly placed himself in the latter grouping. Yet all we heard from Tony that night was hard driving, fast and furious, deeply empathic, life reflective, thought provoking, deliciously disorderly, mind blowing, anger and love inducing verse.



But the revealing of Self always comes in unexpected ways. That's why an open mind is necessary. What's also required is belief — or maybe what's best is the suspension of disbelief.

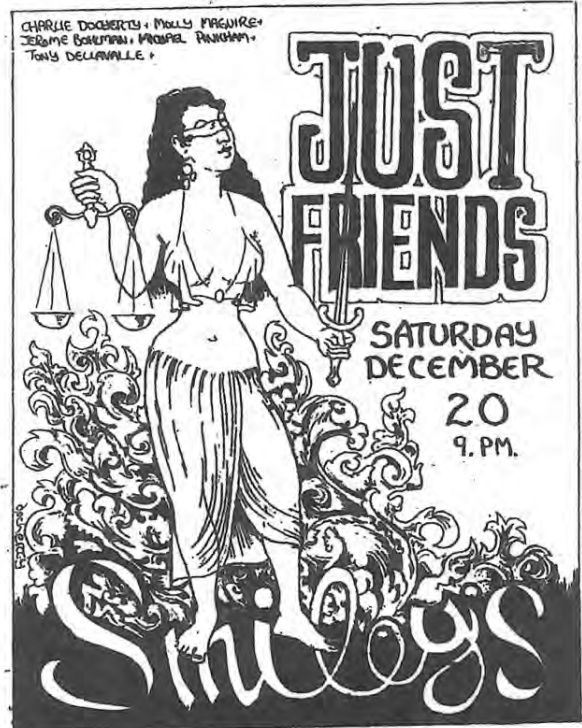
The ritual of spinning the Wheel is a way to access the intelligence of the Universe in the Here Now.

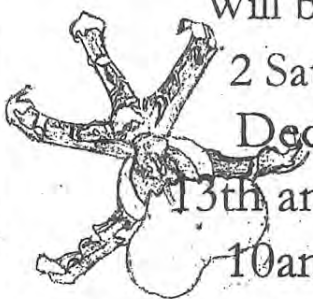

Interview with Amelia re: Cranial-Sacral work

Amelia Nefatti has been doing cranial-sacral work for some time. I wondered what was involved in cranial-sacral work so I asked Amelia to answer a few questions about her work.
-StuArt

First off, what is Cranial-Sacral work?

In the late 1800's, at the American School of Osteopathy, Dr. William G. Sutherland had an epiphany that the temporal bones (the bones that meet the upper cranial bones above the ears) were shaped like the gills of a fish and would indicate a secondary respiration. He theorized that the cerebral spinal fluid, which flows from the center of the brain down to the sacrum (tail bone) and back, was the breath that those bones were "breathing". He spent his life learning how to feel the patterns and waves of this secondary breath with his hands. He seems to have known that this breath of life is inherent in the totality of the being in the way the moon is inherent in the tides and like the ocean it has myriad types of waves. In over 100 years of listening to the qualities of that breath, and it's response to being listened to, Cranial Sacral developed into multiple schools, from the mechanical manipulation protocols of the Osteopathy to the mystical contemplation of the non manipulated system.

I have studied this work for 20 years, in mechanical, visionary, and biodynamic models. The Cranial Sacral I am practicing now, Biodynamic Cranial Touch, came out of that body of study; it is a non judgmental form of listening that acts as a sort of reset to the biological system. As for the golden seal of science, the breath itself has been verified by science but the work continues to be somewhat mystical because it is observed by hands that are also connected to a human ocean of fluid that is connected to another fluid ocean of the space that surrounds everything. How can hands do that? A thousand mystical quotes would be necessary to even begin to say, but I will offer just one:

If the eye were not sunlike it could never see the sun.

How is it performed?

As I perform it, Biodynamic Cranial Touch, I listen to the present state of the holistic system with an unconditional presence and the system self corrects based on the cellular memory of the original blueprint for the life that was formed at conception. The client is listening to the "self" with me, and when they experience the original impulse every thing that is not that impulse can unravel. They are healing themselves with their presence in response to the presence that I am making myself a space for. Usually the client and I have a short talking session to bring current themes into a more palpable presence, then a clothed table session in which I "listen" to the body. I may follow that with off body work, where I look for tensions in the energy body that may deflect their own energetic conversations with the universal breath of life. After that the client decides, consciously or unconsciously, what to keep available and what to put aside. Session last from 45 minutes to an hour and a half, which is the amount of time I ask the client to make available for the session.

What are benefits and what conditions can be helped with the work.

Every condition can be helped by this work, it is almost like a coupled meditation on the organism we label as "self". Historically it has been applied physical trauma and dysfunction; TMD, impact injuries, birth trauma, headaches, sciatica, back aches, joint dysfunction and any number

of physical function problems, But, in my experience, it brings access to healing for anything that can be healed. It also enhances the effectiveness of other methods of healing the client is engaged with even other forms of Cranial Sacral.

How does one make an appointment for the work?

Call me up on 650-814-9947, I have an ad in the Local Zone in the Hearsay as well. I don't keep hours, I'm available when I'm available. My rates are \$65 per session, but I am willing to negotiate lower rates for clients in financial hardship.

Anything you want to add:

This is not a work of "fixing", but a work of bringing individual healing potential present. It is very sacred and extremely intimate only to the level of willingness and readiness and no more, For that reason it does not make mistakes. I could talk about it forever and it would never be said. But speaking to you alchemist to alchemist, Stuart, we are holding space for anything and everything to relax into it's inherent perfected state. When we do the things we do within that space; we are no longer just the actions of an ego, we are a blessing.

One day he came to class wearing a blue denim shirt with beautiful embroidery all over the front. I asked him, "Did Annie do the decorations on your shirt ? "Yes", he said. I then made a comment, "The two of you are very close aren't you?", "Yes", he said, "We speak the same language", intimating that they had a great understanding, rapport, and affection for one another. It appeared to be the kind of idyllic relationship most girls dream of having with their Father.


I was impressed !

I remember when Annie used to run an ad in the Hearsay News saying: "I need a JOB, give me WORK. I can teach Tennis lessons". I admired her bold frankness in admitting her situation ! Don't think she has to worry NOW since she has seven novels and eight non-fiction books that have been published since 1980 !. She was also awarded a Guggenheim Fellowship in 1985 plus she was inducted into the California Hall of Fame in 2010 ! Our dear Annie has made it "Big Time" !

Annie and her Father used to own a cabin somewhere up on the Mesa. When Kenneth died, Annie wrote her first Novel, "Hard Laughter" which was biographical about Bolinas characters and the death of her Father. It was a great first book and I am sure it was a cathartic experience for her, during her ensuing grief over his death.

I always liked seeing her bright, alert, face around town with her amazing crown of curls, who knew that those incredible curls and the head beneath it held such a great WIT and WRITER ?!!!

Tony Serra exemplifies the true Bolinas spirit - an outlaw who serves a higher truth.


Bob Dylan put it nicely:

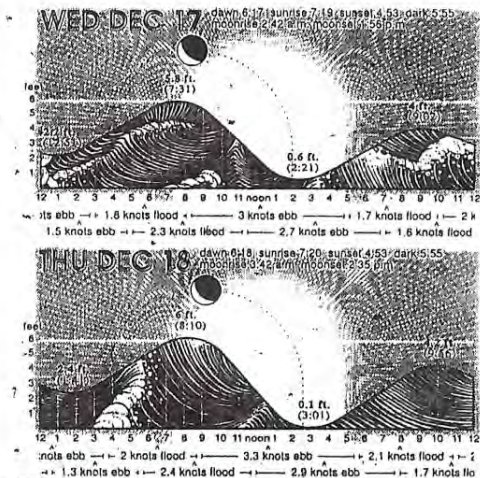
