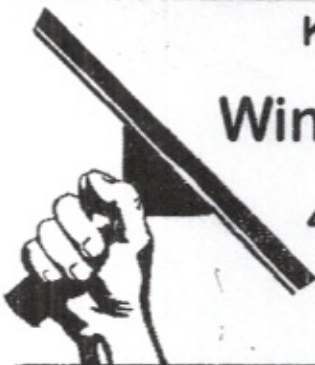

That flash was the living spirit of cannabis and I realized that the Cannabis Club is about the spiritual healing power of the plant.



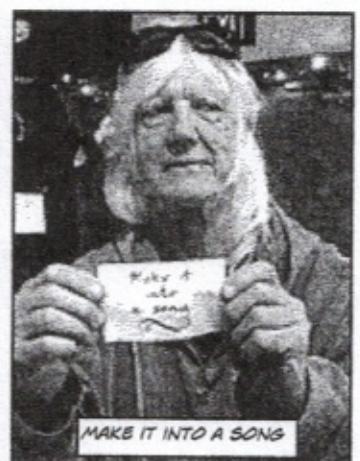

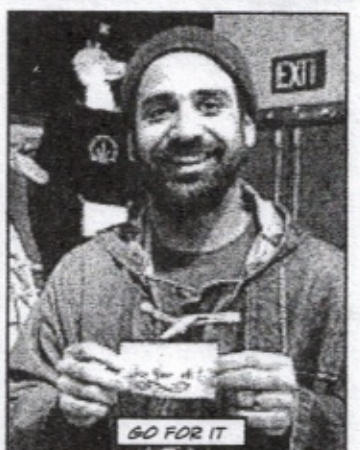

I unrolled the fortune and looked at it.

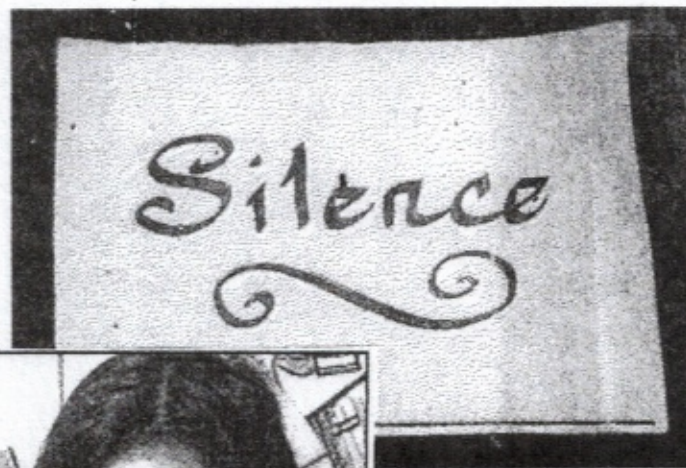
"Silence" is what it read.

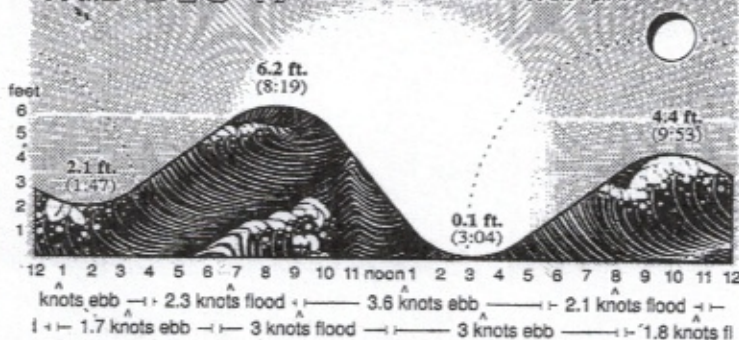

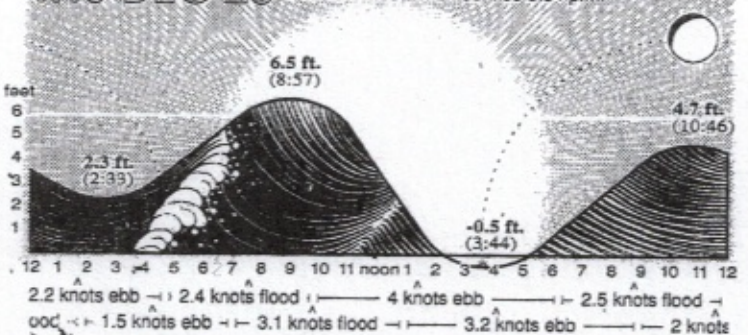
